REMARKS:

On April 20, 1999, crime scene personnel from various law enforcement agencies were assigned to assist with the processing of a crime scene at Columbine High School, located in Jefferson County, Colorado.

Upon arrival at the Command Post located on Pierce Street by Clement Park, crime scene personnel were informed that the bomb squads of various agencies were in the process of clearing the school and the parking lot of explosive devices. At approximately 11:30 p.m., all crime scene personnel were instructed that processing of the scene would not start until the bomb squads had completed their activities; therefore, all crime scene personnel would report back to the command post on Wednesday, April 21, 1999 at 8:00 a.m.

ACTION TAKEN:

At 11:45 a.m. on April 21, 1999, a briefing was held with Chris Andrist of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. The plans for processing the scene and team assignments were made. Team Five was assigned the processing of the front foyer, lobby, hallway, and rear foyer of the school. The team consisted of Ken Van Cleave - CBI Pueblo, Vaughn Ballard - CBI Denver, Tom Netwal - CBI Denver, Barbara Ray – CBI Pueblo and Jose Aceves, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. Duties assignments were:

- Ken Van Cleave, Team leader, sketching the scene and recording measurements
- Vaughn Ballard, photography
- ◆ Tom Netwal, measurements
- Barbara Ray, general notes and photography log
- Jose Aceves, collect, seal, label and submit evidence

All evidence was to be submitted to a central receiving area for the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

At 2:15 p.m., Team Five was taken on a cursory walk-through of the scene. Processing of the assigned area began at 2:30 p.m. During the cursory walk-through, several bottles of water and an opened box of military rations were noted in the lobby of the building. Team Five was advised that these items had been used by the SWAT team and did not require processing per Chris Andrist.

Items of potential evidence located on the floor were

marked by use of a placard near each item. Processing began in the front fover of the building. Overall photographs and close-up photographs were taken. The east entrance to the school had two sets of double doors opening to the outside of the school. Another set of double doors was located connecting the fover to the lobby of the school. A stain on the floor in front of the north interior door tested negative for the presence of blood. Items of evidence and bullet holes in the doors and ceiling were photographed and sketched. Team Five assigned the bullet holes numbers. The number designation contained BH (bullet hole), a sequential number and a 5 in parenthesis (indicating team number). Evidence collected from this area included live rounds, blood and projectiles. The bullet hole in the center of the front glass passed through the glass from the outside of the building. The remaining bullet holes were from bullets that had traveled from the west to the east.

Team Five proceeded to the lobby area and continued to process the scene by taking overall and close-up photographs, recording measurements and collecting items of evidence. Three stains tested positive for the presence of blood. These stains were located by evidence placard number 1812 (an area near the artificial plant), evidence placard number 1816 (an area near the hanging trophy case) and evidence placard number 1820 (an area in the doorway marked "Social Studies/English"). One area located by evidence placard 1817 tested negative for the presence of blood. The stains located by evidence placard numbers 1812 and 1816 were transfer stains, while the stain located by evidence placard number 1820 was more concentrated. The stain located by evidence placard number 1816 had an impression in the bloodstain similar to the bottom of a shoe. Evidence collected from this area included live rounds of ammunition and blood. The following overall observations were made:

- ♦ BH-4 (5), BH-5 (5) and BH-6 (5) were located on the south interior door to the lobby. None of these penetrated through the door.
- ◆ BH-7 (5) was a large hole and did not penetrate though the support
- ♦ BH-8 (5) and BH-9 (5) did not penetrate the door.
- ♦ BH-10 (5) contained a projectile
- ♦ BH-11 (5) and BH-13 (5) were impact sites

- ♦ BH-12 (5) penetrated the west side of the door panel
- ◆ BH-15 (5), BH-16 (5) and BH-17 (5) were in the center support on the interior foyer doors
- BH-18 (5) was in the glass on the interior of the foyer doors
- ♦ BH-19 (5), BH-20 (5) and BH-21 (5) were in ceiling tiles near the carpeted hallway

In addition, bullet or projectile holes not specifically noted in this report were documented through photography and sketching.

Team Five proceeded to the carpeted section of the hallway. Overall photographs, close-up photographs, measurements were taken and items of evidence were collected. At 6:40 p.m., Linda Holloway of CBI Denver and Steve Johnson of the Littleton Police Department joined the team and helped to make measurements. At 7:05 p.m., Joan Schroer joined the team and helped to make measurements. The hallway west of the foyer entrance was carpeted. This hall was divided into six sections, starting with section one at the east end where the carpet began. Subsequent sections began at each arch or doorway as one proceeded west. Bullet holes numbered BH-22 (5) through BH-33 (5) were documented in the first and second sections of carpeted hallway. At 8:15 p.m., Team Five suspended processing of the hallway. All items of evidence collected on this date and all film and photograph logs were given to Jefferson County Deputy Aceves.

On April 22, 1999, Team Five met at Columbine High School to continue with processing the hallway. Team members consisted of Barbara Ray (team leader), Ken Van Cleave, Vaughn Ballard, Tom Netwal, Joan Schroer and Steve Johnson. Joe Clayton – CBI Denver and Tom Acierno – Jefferson County Sheriff's Office joined Team Five. Team assignments were as follows:

Evidence placards #1835 and #1847 were documented by photography with no evidence associated with these numbers. Placard #1847 was a hole in the carpet. No bullet was revealed under the carpeting. Evidence placard #1846 consisted of nineteen cartridge cases near the access door to the mechanical area on the north side of the theater. These were collected as one item of evidence. Several pieces of tape were collected from the doorframe and from behind the doorway between the second and third sections of carpeting. This exhibit was marked as #1887-2. Evidence placard #1889 was a projectile collected from BH-35 (5). Evidence placard #1890 was a projectile collected from BH-64 (5). Evidence placard #1891 was a projectile collected from BH-67 (5). When a direction of travel could be determined, the bullet holes in the third through sixth carpeted sections of hallway and from the rear fover were all in a direction from west to east.

The rear foyer was divided into six areas. Bomb fragments were indicated by markers with red tape and bullet fragments were indicated by markers with blue tape. Bomb fragments from each area were collected in one envelope. Bullet fragments from each area were collected in one envelope. Numbers were assigned to items of evidence that were collected. Three stains in the rear foyer tested negative for the presence of blood. The mat in the rear foyer was rolled up. It was unrolled and found to be clean and free of debris. Numerous bullet holes in the interior fover rear doors were documented, photographed and measured. The processing was suspended at 4:45 p.m. All items of evidence collected on this date and all film and photograph logs were given to Jefferson County Deputy Acierno. A brief meeting with all teams was conducted.

On April 23, 1999, Team Five met at Columbine High School to continue with processing the hallway. Team members consisted of Barbara Ray (team leader), Ken Van Cleave, Vaughn Ballard, Tom Netwal, Joan Schroer, Joe Clayton, and Tom Acierno. Team assignments were as follows:

Processing resumed with the rear foyer of the school. Numerous bullet holes were photographed and measured on the inside of the back doors. These holes were assigned numbers BH-67 (5) through BH-125 (5). Several areas on the overhang in the rear foyer tested negative for the presence of blood. One number [BH-126 (5)] was given to all the fragments embedded in the southeast wall of the foyer. The south wall was photographed in several portions with markers BH-128-1 (5) to BH-128-4 (5). The north wall of the foyer was photographed in several portions with markers BH-129 (5) to BH-129-4 (5). Marker BH-129-1 (5) was not used.

The bullet holes in the ceiling were documented by designating an east and south coordinate to the ceiling tiles as they related to the section of carpet over which the holes in the tiles were located. Attempts were made to recover all bullets from the ceiling tiles, lockers and walls. Recovered projectiles were numbered and taken into evidence. Processing was suspended at 4:45 p.m. and a brief meeting with the other forensic teams was conducted. All items of evidence collected on this date and all film and photograph logs were given to Jefferson County Deputy Acierno.

On Monday, April 26, 1999, crime scene processing of Columbine High School continued. Following a briefing from approximately 8:00 a.m. until 8:50 a.m. at the school auditorium, Team Five continued to process its assigned areas. On this date Team Five consisted of CBI Agent Ken Van Cleave-acting as team leader, CBI Agent Joe Clayton, CBI Agent Vaughn Ballard, Detective Joan Schroer-Littleton PD, and Deputy Douglas Moore- Jefferson County SO, who took custody of all evidence collected.

Processing on this date included collecting evidence from the "Social Studies/English" hallway immediately south of the main hallway; collecting evidence from the custodians' office at the west end of the main hallway; collecting bullets and bullet fragments from the doors in the east and west ends of the main hallway; and collecting bullets from locker 1748 in the main hallway.

At approximately 9:00 a.m. processing of the "Social Studies/English" hallway began. After the overall area was photographed, the area was searched, and four (4) 9mm cartridges were found. Three cartridges were located just south of the doors into the main hallway and the fourth cartridge was found to the south at the intersection with the first east-west hallway. These items were given evidence numbers 1919-1922, and were photographed, measured and collected.

At approximately 10:45 a.m. collection of the bullets and fragments from the doors at the east end of the main hallway began. Members of the Littleton Fire Department under the supervision of Agent Van Cleave used their cutting equipment to help remove the items from the doors. Evidence items 1923-1926 were recovered.

The firefighters and other members of the team then moved to the west end of the main hallway to recover bullets and fragments from the doors. Bullets and fragments were recovered and given evidence numbers 1927 and 1932-1935.

Agent Van Cleave then examined the previously numbered bullet holes in the west wall and doors of the main hallway to determine the direction of travel of the projectiles. The following information was obtained:

At this time it was decided to examine and document the bullet holes on the outside of the west doors into the main hallway. This area had been examined previously

by the FBI; however, it was unclear if the bullet holes had been documented. These holes were assigned numbers, photographed, and measured by Team Five. It was also determined that the previously numbered BH-132 (5) on the inside of the west doors was the impact point for BH-178 (5) on the outside of the west doors.

During the examination of the doors and west wall additional items of evidence were recovered in the area previously processed by the FBI. These included numerous pieces of bomb debris and fragments from immediately outside the west doors, evidence item 1928, and three metal pieces from the area immediately west of the doors, evidence items 1929-1931.

Additional bullet holes were examined by Agent Van Cleave to attempt to determine direction of travel. The following information was obtained:

At approximately 2:45 p.m. processing of the custodians' office at the west end of the main hallway began. Examination revealed two bullets had been fired at the east wall of the room. The room was photographed and measured. Searching disclosed a fragment of bullet jacket on the floor near the desk. This item was given evidence number 1936, measured and collected. A bullet hole was found in the freezer door of the refrigerator on the east wall and was photographed and measured. Fragments of this bullet were recovered from inside the freezer and given evidence number 1937. A second bullet was removed from the east wall of the room. This bullet had passed through a table leg and was found behind the wallboard. After photographing and measuring this area, the bullet was removed from behind the wallboard and given evidence number 1938.

Agent Van Cleave and the other members of Team Five then responded to the main hallway to recover two (2) bullets from locker 1748. This locker had been examined and opened by bomb technicians to allow recovery of the evidence. One bullet was given

evidence number 1939 and was consistent with originating from the bullet which made the previously examined bullet hole BH-48 (5). The other bullet was given evidence number 1940 and was the bullet which made bullet hole BH-49 (5).

Team Five then discussed what processing they had done since beginning on Wednesday, April 21, 1999. It was concluded that no additional processing would be done in our assigned area and members of the team departed at approximately 4:00 p.m. All items of evidence collected on this date and all film and photograph logs were given to Jefferson County Deputy Moore.

Recorded measurements, crime scene sketches, photograph logs and evidence logs contain more details pertaining to the location and listing of all of the evidence.

Summary of evidence:

- thirty cartridge cases
- three shotgun shells
- two shotgun wads
- twenty-four bullets
- forty projectile fragments plus numerous fragments recovered from the rear entry way
- fourteen live rounds
- one pipe end cap
- one hundred forty-eight exit/entry holes resulting from projectiles

Evidence was collected and released to Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.
