

INVESTIGATION:

On 4-20-99, at about 1445 hours, I contacted Frank Petersen, who advised me that he was inside Columbine High School when the incident occurred. He stated that another teacher by the name of Theresa Miller called him out of his classroom and into the hallway. She told him to go to the office in order to get help. He stated at this time he heard one to two rapid fire shots, at which time he responded to the office, telling them that there was a problem in the school. He stated he contacted the Assistant Principal, Karen Studenka, and told her what was occurring. He then proceeded out of the high school and directed students to Clement Park. He stated that all he heard was shots being fired and he did not see any injuries and did not see any of the suspects.

Petersen identified his classroom as Science Room #2. He was in the process of giving a test. Theresa Miller closed his back door when the incident started, then went to his front door. She signaled him to come over to the door. This occurred a little after 1115 hrs.

Miller advised him there was shooting in the building. He initially thought it was a senior prank, simply because of the time of year.

Petersen shut his classroom door behind him. He left the class. He went to the stairs going down to the cafeteria. At first, he didn't hear anything. There were kids coming up the stairs quickly, but not at an alarming rate.

Petersen heard a barrage of fire. He then heard pop, pop, pop. Kids hit the deck, then there was a second barrage of gunfire. Petersen saw another teacher Rich Long. He was crouched over. Long yelled for Petersen to go and get help. There was possibly someone on the floor next to him. This Investigator asked Petersen if it was Dave Sanders? He indicated it is unknown to him if it was Sanders or not.

Petersen turned and went east down the hall. He was yelling and herding kids down the hall. He crossed the hallway and the fire alarm went off. People started coming out of the math area.

Petersen went down the TRC hallway to the main hall. There was heavy shooting going on down at the other end. This would be the set of doors heavily shot up. Petersen made his way to the main office. Petersen related all the windows around the office area and front doors were intact..

When he went inside, no body was in the office. He subsequently found that there were a couple of students and the vice principal, who he identified as Karen Studenka, in the office. Studenka and Petersen took the students out of the office. At this point, Petersen related he was unable to get back to his classroom. He related it is unknown to him if anybody went to his class.

INVESTIGATION:

I contacted Frank Petersen, a student at Columbine High School by phone. Frank Petersen told me that he was in his Biology class when Teresa Miller told him of the shooting. He ran to the south main hall, where he saw Mr. Long. Mr. Long told him to "Get help." Petersen then went to the main office and talked to a woman named Karen. He heard glass breaking and decided to leave the school via the east exit on the Art hallway. He went over to Clement Park.

Petersen stated that his class had been meeting in Science Room #2. He later found out that his class stayed in that classroom and were joined by students from Science Room #3. His teacher was Doug Johnson. Petersen stated he did not see any suspects.

These students described the events of 4-20-99 as follows:

The class was having a test when Mr. Petersen ran out of the room. Gunshots were heard coming from outside the classroom and the fire alarm activated. Some students thought it was a senior prank. The students began to evacuate the classroom, but were told when they got into the hallway to return to the classroom. Some students stated that Mrs. Miller was the teacher who told them to return to the classroom.

The students went back into the classroom. They huddled together on the floor by the door that joined Mr. Petersen's classroom with Mr. Johnson's classroom. Mr. Johnson came into their class and locked their doors. Mr. Johnson had the students turn the tables in a way which would provide a barricade. The students remained in their classroom until such time as they were rescued by the SWAT team. The SWAT team then led them out of the school, via the stairway and through the cafeteria area.

During the incident, the connecting door between the classrooms was opened. Some of the students in Mr. Petersen's class were

I spoke with student Kirsten Broman, DOB 09/14/83, RS# 4555, who advised me that while she was in Mr. Johnson's class during the incident, she saw two suspects in the science hallway shooting guns at the door of another science room. She did not see the faces of the suspects. She did not see their weapons. She did not see them leave so she could not tell me a direction of travel. She did not know if the suspects were male or female. She described one of the suspects as being blond.

Teacher Mr. Petersen, was interviewed in connection with RS#4552. His interview is on report #99-7625-GG.

This investigator met with Melissa and her parents at her house.

Melissa stated she has not talked to anyone about the CHS incident. Melissa stated she spent 4th. hour in the school library and when the 5th. hour bell rang at 11:10 A.M., she left the library and went to her biology class in the science section.

Melissa stated Ms. Williams teaches the class and they were due to have a test but one of the students was allowed to show the class some skills prior to the test.

After a short period of time, about 5 minutes according to Melissa, they heard people running down the hallways. One of the biology students went to the hall and looked out. He returned very quickly and appeared very pale. The according to Melissa, Mr. Richard Long ran into the classroom and yelled for everyone to get down under tables and stay there. He then left.

Ms. Williams told everyone to get into the green house after they heard a shot. Once in the green house Melissa stated "it was like constant shooting." Then about a half hour of silence and then more

shooting. Melissa stated the shooting sounded like it would last a half hour at a time as well.

Melissa went on to say they thought it was over and then heard a bunch of gunshots and then someone say; "I want to die today." Melissa stated the person saying that had a mocking type laugh and would yell and then more gunshots.

Melissa stated she felt two bombs go off. She stated the green house shook and she thought it was at the school store since it was directly under them.

Melissa stated bells were ringing around 2:30 P.M., and the fire alarm went off and then a bell constantly ringing which means "all clear". Then Melissa stated they heard some more shooting and then some single type shots that were a little quieter. She stated she looked at a watch and it was 2:30 P.M.

Melissa went on to say they hear yelling and that's when SWAT came and helped them out of the building.

Melissa was asked if she could tell where the shots were coming from? She stated the shooting was up and down the hallway and it sounded like the lockers were being shot at due to the noise.

Melissa stated she could hear people talking outside the door but couldn't make out what was being said.

Melissa stated she left her Eddie Bauer dark blue backpack with a leather base in the class room. She stated it has papers with her name on it as well as a TI 86 calculator in a black case. She stated her wallet (black) with pictures is in the backpack as well as a 20 dollar bill. She stated her day planner has her name in it as well.

Melissa stated she doesn't know any TCM members personally, but has seen them in the hallway dressed funny.

Melissa stated she was in the library while a class was being conducted and she sat in the stuffed chair near the South side of the library.

Melissa didn't have any thing else to add except she did not see any of the shooter and didn't recognize them until their picture was in the newspaper.

This concluded the interview.

ACTION TAKEN:

On May 3, 1999 Agent Linda R. HOLLOWAY of CBI was given a last sheet, control number 2465 requesting that an interview be done with Columbine Student Carrie PREZIOSI. It was believed that Carrie was in the cafeteria around 7 a.m. on April 20, 1999.

I contacted Carrie PREZIOSI by telephone and obtained directions to her residence in Littleton. She was at home and available for an interview.

At 0940 hours (9:40 a.m.) I interviewed Carrie at her home. Her older brother was present upon my arrival and left shortly after we began the interview.

Carrie PREZIOSI related that her mother took her to school as usual. Her mother is a teacher at another school. She got to school at 6:55 a.m. and went to the commons area (cafeteria) There she met up with friends Jeremy ORBAN(sp), Steve BRODEN, Brandi WISEMAN, and Chris (unknown last name). A diagram of the cafeteria was shown to Carrie at this time and she was fairly certain that they sat at Table Y.

The group remained at Table Y until 7:35 a.m. when she went to Language class. She returned back to the cafeteria during second hour at about 8:25 a.m. and sat at either Table II or V. She sat with Aaron BROWN, Keil ASHTEN, Evan McLAUGHERTY (sp), Justin HENDERSON and Justin BAER during this break. She did not notice any suspicious duffel bags or remember anyone in the area where the duffel bags were placed. She was shown photographs of the duffel bags and did not recognize them.

She was in the science room, Biology class with teacher Mr. JOHNSON, taking a test when a teacher came into the room and told the students to get down. There were 25 to 30 students in the class at that time. They got up against a wall and waited.

Two or three children who had been in the cafeteria ran into their room and joined the group. She could hear loud bangs and people screaming. The explosions were so forceful that she could feel them through the floor.

She then noticed that Mr. SANDERS came into the room. He had been shot and was bleeding from the mouth and had also suffered a chest wound. He fell onto the floor. Two students, Erin HANCEY and Kevin STARKEY helped Mr. SANDERS. They attempted to stop the bleeding and a sign was placed in the window that she thought related that there was a wounded victim in that room.

An adjacent room of children joined them. There were about 60 kids in total in the classroom. A teacher left and locked some of the doors. Mr. FRIESEN and Mr. JOHNSON were the teachers in the classroom with the kids. Something was thrown threw the glass portion of a window to the room where they were that caught fire. It was quickly extinguished by a fire extinguisher. She assumed it was one of the gunmen that threw the device.

She was in the room with the other student and Mr. SANDERS from 11:15 a.m. until 3:15 p.m. when the SWAT team entered the room. They watched the television to learn what was going on on the outside and they had telephone contact with people on the outside.

The shooting had stopped for about two hours before the rescue. The fire alarms were going off. Mr. SANDERS was still alive and showing students the photographs of his family and telling students to tell his wife and daughters that he loved them. Mr. SANDERS did not feel like he was going to live. He was choking up blood. When the SWAT team removed the children, they were told to leave Mr. SANDERS.

She left the school by going through the cafeteria, passing next to the serving area and out a door. The cafeteria had several inches of water on the floor from the sprinkler system. There were two dead bodies of students outside the building that she passed. One was at the top of the stairs and one at the bottom.

Carrie did remember that after the announcements that are shown in each room with a television that there is a "thought for the day" or "phrase for the day.". She recalled that the message for that day was something to the effect of "YOU DON'T WANT TO BE

HERE TODAY. 4/20/99.

When Carrie was asked about knowledge of the Trench Coat Mafia she related that a girl by the name of Shantel DOWNS or Shantel BERRY (sp) hangs around a heavy set male that she believes belongs to the TCM. This male is further described as have short straight thin brown hair and a small mustache.

She further stated that members of the TCM usually still in the corner of the cafeteria near the table WW. She also gave the name of Krista WEINER who may know the heavy set male who hangs around with the TCM. She believes that Krista WEINER is in Boulder getting an abortion. The only other information she had on the TCM was that she believed that they hung around a red house on Engles Street a couple of blocks from her residence.

Carrie left her black backpack in the Science Room. It is brand "Out brook". She was wearing a green shirt, a kacki colored skirt and sandals on that day. When asked about the Internet, she related that she does use the E-Mail occasionally and has used a "chat line" twice to talk with her grandparents.

The interview ended at 10:20 a.m.

INVESTIGATION:

On 08-09-99 at approximately 1600 hours, I responded to 18 White Pine Drive to contact and interview witness Elizabeth Louise Ratay, who is a student at Columbine High School. The reason for this interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School. Also present during this interview was Elizabeth's mother, Nancy Ratay.

Elizabeth Ratay told me on 04-20-99, she drove her vehicle (a blue Subaru) to Columbine High School for her scheduled classes arriving at approximately 0715 hours. She said she parked her vehicle in the student parking area of Clement Park and walked into Columbine High School through the Band room door on the north side of the school. Elizabeth said her first hour class is Band that lasts from 0730 hours to 0820 hours, and is located on the upper level of Columbine High School. Elizabeth said after Band, she then went to her second hour class, which is Math and is located on the upper level of Columbine High School.

also. She said this class was from 0825 hours to 0920 hours, however, she said she was five minutes late arriving to her Math class on 04-20-99. Elizabeth said next she went to her third hour class which was German, and this class was from 0925 hours to 1015 hours. Elizabeth said this class is on the lower level of Columbine High School. She said when she walked to her German class, she had to go down the stairway from the upper level of the school to the lower level and said this stairway goes into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Elizabeth said when she got to the bottom of the stairway, she turned to her left to go to her classroom. Elizabeth said she walked along the east side of the cafeteria/commons area only briefly as she went to her German class. I showed Elizabeth the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. She said she did not see either item, nor did she see anybody carrying any other item or items of a similar description. Elizabeth said after German class, she went to her history class that was from 1020 hours to 1115 hours, and then went to her fifth hour Choir class that begins at 1115 hours. Elizabeth said when she arrived at her Choir class, she talked to Mr. Andres, who is the teacher of this class. After talking to Mr. Andres, she went to the Chemistry lab because she needed to make up a lab for Chemistry class. Elizabeth said the Chemistry lab is on the upper level of Columbine High School, and said she arrived at approximately 1115 hours to 1120 hours on 04-20-99. She said after getting to the Chemistry lab, she went to her locker (Locker #1360) which was located near the east side main doors/administrative offices of Columbine High School. Elizabeth said she then returned to the Chemistry lab from her locker. Elizabeth said she did not see anything out of the ordinary while going in between classes or when she went to her locker and then back to the Chemistry lab. Elizabeth said the teacher of the Chemistry lab was Ms. Miller, and Elizabeth said the other students inside the Chemistry lab with her were Sarah Ellison, Aaron Hancey, and John Bachelnor (exact spelling of John's last name was unknown by Elizabeth). Elizabeth said after Ms. Miller got the students started in the lab, Ms. Miller left to go do hall duty. Elizabeth said a short time later (unknown number of minutes later due to the fact that Elizabeth was unable to estimate that time) she heard people in the hallway outside of the lab running and screaming. Elizabeth said several students ran into the Chemistry lab including Mary Bareboon (unknown spelling of last name) according to Elizabeth, who said there was someone shooting inside of Columbine High School. Elizabeth said after Mary told her someone was shooting, Mary ran out of a lab door crying. Elizabeth said at this time the fire alarm inside of Columbine High School went off and Sarah Ellison ran out of the room. Elizabeth said Ms. Miller returned to the lab room and said that a teacher by the name of Dave Sanders had been shot, and wanted to know if anybody knew First Aid. The students then all moved to one side of the room, and when another teacher by the name of Mr. Friesen came into the lab room, he told the students to get down on the floor. Elizabeth

said then another teacher by the name of Mr. Johnson came into the room and then the doors between the classroom and the hallways were locked, however, Elizabeth did not know who locked them. Elizabeth said after the doors were locked, the lights were all turned off in the room between the lab stations and everybody hid inside. Elizabeth said the hiding students talked to each other quietly to try to take their minds off of what was taking place at Columbine High School. Elizabeth said while she was hiding, she heard numerous gunshots or explosive devices being detonated. Elizabeth told me that she has never shot a firearm, nor has she been present when a firearm has been shot, so therefore, she is not sure if these were gunshots or explosive devices being detonated. She also said after hearing these shots or explosions, it was quiet for a while and then she heard a shot or explosion every once in a while until approximately 1400 hours on 04-20-99 when they stopped. Elizabeth said when she heard these shots or explosions, they sounded like they were coming from the area of the main hallway, possibly outside of her location. Elizabeth said she remained hiding with the other people until they were rescued by SWAT at approximately 1500 hours on 04-20-99.

I asked Elizabeth Ratay what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and particularly what she knew about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Elizabeth said that prior to the shooting on 04-20-99, she did not know any of the Trench Coat Mafia students by name, and told me she did not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students or associates. Elizabeth said she did recall seeing a male student at Columbine High School wearing a trench coat, and said she now believes that this student was Robert Perry. Elizabeth said she could not provide any further information in reference to Robert Perry. Elizabeth said when she was a freshman at Columbine High School (1996-1997 school year) Robyn Anderson was a sophomore at Columbine High School and was in her Dance class. Elizabeth said the only thing she could remember about Robyn Anderson was the fact that Robyn Anderson had told her that her friends were older than she was.

Elizabeth Ratay said she did not see anybody with a firearm or explosive device at any time on 04-20-99. She said also that she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors of anybody manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, buying or selling firearms. Elizabeth also told me she has heard other students say that they believed there were more than two suspects involved in the shooting, however, Elizabeth said has not heard any specific names mentioned, nor is there any evidence that would support these beliefs.

I asked Elizabeth Ratay and her mother, Nancy Ratay how they and the rest of their family have been doing since the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Elizabeth and Nancy said that they are doing okay. I gave each of them one of my business cards and asked them to contact me in the future should either one of them, or their other family members want to speak with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate in the future.

INVESTIGATION:

On June 23, 1999, I spoke to David Rioch, the father of John Rioch. David Rioch said that his son John had left shortly after graduation, to Army boot camp. He said that John Rioch would not be home for two months. David Rioch said that John Rioch had spoken to him about his involvement in the CHS shooting.

I asked David Rioch to tell me what his son had told me. He said that John Rioch had been one of the students who had remained in the Tech. Lab. with Mr. Manuello. He said that John told him he had heard explosions while hiding and had never seen who it was that was doing the shooting. He said that John Rioch told him he had attempted to run out when the rest of the class did but Mr. Manuello had told them to stay.

David Rioch said that John told him he did not really remember all of what happened at the start of the incident, because it had happened so fast. David Rioch said that John told him that he remembered hearing a T.V. being turned on in an other room and everyone got scared because they thought it was the people who had been shooting. He said that John told him they had been escorted out of the school by the SWAT Team. David Rioch said that he did not remember anything else that his son had told him.

On May 18, 1999 this investigator conducted a telephone interview with Dustin Rissmiller in reference to the above case. Mr. Rissmiller is a sophomore at Columbine High School. Mr. Rissmiller made the following statements.

Mr. Rissmiller stated on April 20, 1999 during fifth hour he was in Mr. Johnson's science room number three taking a test. Mr. Rissmiller stated he heard a big boom. The class stood up to see what it was when they heard another boom. They heard gunshots.

Shortly after hearing the gunshots Mr. Sanders stumbled into the room and fell to the floor. Mr. Johnson told all of the students to get up against the wall. Mr. Johnson locked the door. Mr. Johnson went over to Mr. Petersen's room which is right next to our room to help the students put up tables to use as barricades.

Mr. Rissmiller stated somebody from Mr. Petersen's room yelled the gunmen were coming down the hall. The gunmen threw a molotov cocktail down by the storage room. Ms. Miller another teacher was able to put the fire out with a fire extinguisher.

On May 24, 1999 this investigator conducted a telephone interview with Michael Rotole, who is a sophomore at Columbine High School. Mr. Rotole made the following statements.

Mr. Rotole stated on April 20, 1999 during fifth hour he was in Mr. Doug Johnson's science class taking a test. They were in science room number three.

Mr. Rotole stated a teacher identified as Ms. Wyatt came to the door of the classroom to talk to Mr. Johnson. After talking to Ms. Wyatt, Mr. Johnson came running back into the classroom and yelled for the class to get against the wall. Mr. Rotole stated he heard gunshots.

Mr. Rotole stated Mr. Sanders stumbled into the classroom and fell on the floor. Mr. Rotole stated he and other students took their shirts off to help stop the bleeding on Mr. Sanders.

Mr. Rotole was asked if he saw the gunmen. Mr. Rotole stated he was positioned by a window in the science room door and he saw

the gunmen as they ran by the science room. He stated he thought they threw a bomb down by the science storage room. Ms. Miller, another teacher, had put out the fire with a fire extinguisher.

When asked to give a description. Mr. Rotole stated both of the gunmen were wearing black. That was all he could see.

Mr. Rotole was asked if he noticed anything else on April 20, 1999 that might have been unusual. Mr. Rotole stated it was a regular day for him.

Mr. Rotole stated he had a back pack he left in the science room. The back pack contained school books and a calculator. There were no other valuables in the back pack.

INVESTIGATION

On 04-21-99, between the hours of 0004 and 0035, Deputy Steve Luciano and myself conducted an interview with Jessica Rusch at her residence located 5888 West Fair Drive, Littleton, Colorado, in reference to the Columbine High School incident. JCSO had obtained information from Jessica's boyfriend, Patrick McDuffee, dob/05-30-81, that she identified one of the gunmen at the Columbine High School as being an individual known as [REDACTED]

Jessica Rusch provided us with the following information concerning the incident at Columbine High School and what she observed the day of 04-20-99. Jessica stated she was in the Science room for 5th period, and that the Science room is located on the second level of Columbine High School. 5th period starts at 11:15 a.m., and ends at 12:05 p.m.. Jessica stated shortly after class had started, she heard a loud explosion in the school, and initially thought it was some type of a Senior prank. Shortly after the loud explosion, she heard a series of gunfire, accompanied by a lot of screaming and yelling from other students from thin the school. After determining that there was a problem at the school, the students locked the Science room door from the

inside. Jessica stated she was huddled with her friend, Jennifer Smail, and at one point they observed an individual at the door to the Science room, and this party was carrying a large weapon.

I asked Jessica to give me the details about the subject she observed near the Science room who was carrying the weapon. She stated the individual was about 6'00" tall, skinny, and she described his manner of dress being in all black, telling me that the party had a black baseball cap on that was on backwards. She said he had a black face mask, black jeans, and a black trench coat. Jessica said under the baseball cap, she could see the individual's hair, and described it as being brown in color, curly, and about collar length. She stated she did not know the age of the individual. I asked Jessica if she could identify that person and tell me the individual's name. She told me she could not, but she had a conversation with her boyfriend, Patrick McDuffee, after the incident. She described the individual that she saw at the Science room door, and they came to the conclusion that it was [REDACTED] because McDuffee knew he was associated with the gang known as the Trench Coat Mafia.

I asked Jessica if she could tell me how many times she has either seen or spoken with [REDACTED]. She said she has seen him around school probably three or four times, and that it would have been last year. I again asked Jessica how she came to the conclusion that the individual she saw at the Science room door was [REDACTED]. She stated her boyfriend, McDuffee, is associates with members of the Trench Coat Mafia. I asked her how close of an association her boyfriend has with this group. She stated she doesn't know, but he knew or knows quite a few of the members of the group. She then reiterated that after she described the gunman she observed in Columbine High School, that it was Patrick McDuffee that said it sounded like [REDACTED] from the description that she gave.

Jessica stated the individual she observed in all black, who was carrying the long gun, was unable to get into the Science room, and walked away from the door. Jessica stated after the party with the gun disappeared from the window, that a teacher known as Mr. Sanders entered into the classroom from an adjoining classroom, and that he had been shot in the back area. Jessica stated students then rendered aid to Mr. Sanders. Jessica told me that they remained locked in the Science room anywhere from three to four hours before they were removed by SWAT Teams.

After Jessica provided her initial statement, I then asked her to try and give me a description of the long gun that she saw the suspect carrying. She stated she could not tell me what the gun, as far as the brand or caliber was, she just knew it was a long gun. Jessica did say that her friend, Jennifer Small, told her it was a sawed off shotgun.

Jessica was asked if she knew of any other individuals who belong to the Trench Coat Mafia other than the suspects that were initially at the school. She stated the only other person she knows involved in this group is a Joe Stair, and she relayed the information that after she was taken from Columbine High School, that she remembers seeing Stair north of the school near Clement Park at the soccer fields, and that Stair was talking with a law enforcement officer. She described Stair as being in a Columbine Rebels gym shirt and blue jeans, and she described his long blondish hair. Jessica said she saw him as she was being taken to Leawood Elementary. I again asked Jessica if she knew what her boyfriend, McDuffee's, relationship was with the Trench Coat Mafia. Again, she told me he knows several members of the group, but she did not know the relationship, and as far as she knows he is not a member of the group.

At the conclusion of our interview with Jessica, I provided her with a business card and asked that she contact me if she has any additional information to provide.


In this telephonic interview SABEY said her team bowled against the HARRIS / KLEBOLD / DYKEMAN and MORRIS team on April 20th, first hour. She provided a list of her classmates on her team as Christy HELD, Mike PAAVILAINEN, and Ed OLSEN. She specifically recalls DYKEMAN as well as MORRIS bowling that morning, and that HARRIS and KLEBOLD were absent. She recalled thinking MORRIS' flannel shirt and white t-shirt as not being typical for him as he generally wears black. She said she knew each of these students on sight, but did not know them well enough to ascertain whether MORRIS and DYKEMAN were behaving unusually that day. She added that HARRIS and KLEBOLD were very animated bowlers as they would "shot-put" the ball, and would roundhouse/softball pitch the ball. The two would also make a "Heil Hitler" type salute after bowling a strike.

SABEY added that she did not see KLEBOLD or HARRIS at all the day of the shooting. She said nobody questioned MORRIS or DYKEMAN why KLEBOLD and HARRIS were absent. She thought MORRIS might have shown as absent due to possibly arriving after the teacher took attendance, but she could not specifically recall him arriving late.

SABEY described having been in Mr. MANUELLO's Physic's class, which started at 11:15am working on a class project painting tiles to be displayed on the walls. She described sitting by the door that leads to the hallway by the stairs to the commons/cafeteria area. At about 11:20am to 11:25am she said she heard a "stampede" of students running by the door to their class, yelling and screaming. She opened the door and asked the students what was happening, to which they replied, "someone's being shot!" Immediately after this she heard a "loud bang" come from downstairs, to her right, possibly in the cafeteria. She said she presumed it to be a gunshot due to the students telling her someone was being shot.

All of the students in SABEY's class then went into the adjacent storage area where she heard another "loud bang." From her vantagepoint she could not ascertain the direction from which the noise came. The fire alarm then sounded and Mr. MANUELLO directed them to move into an adjoining room, which was that of Mr. CRAM's.

SABEY said Mr. CRAM then went into the hallway and they heard a couple of additional "bangs." Mr. CRAM then told them to go back into the classroom, as two other teachers were in the hallway by the choir room, at the top of the stairs, above the cafeteria. SABEY said she thought one of these two teachers was Mr. FRIESEN (sp?).

SABEY said they then went back into the storage room where another teacher in the "Tech Lab" told them to run from the building. About half of the students in the room ran from the classroom, turning right heading towards the office area. There she saw the broken glass of the interior windows that had been shattered onto the floor. She then ran left towards the Home Economics and Woodshop area. There she heard another "boom" come from the area of the Library. She and some of the other unidentified students ran out the exit door near the counseling area. They then ran by the baseball fields then into the Public Library where they waited until the incident was over.

This investigator interviewed Dorian with his dad present. Dorian stated he is a sophomore at CHS.

Dorian stated he was in 5th. hour Science class with Ms. Williams. Dorian stated they heard noises from outside the classroom in the hallway. At this time Jason Baer went to the door and looked out into the hallway and returned immediately and told everyone what was happening.

Dorian stated Ms. Williams then told everyone to get into the storage room within this science room. Once inside this room more gunshots and explosions could be heard.

Dorian stated the first hour in the storage room they heard a lot of shots and then a pause and about another half hours worth of shooting. Dorian stated he heard someone in the hall state: "I wanna die today." and a short time later the person was yelling: "Hey [REDACTED] where are you?" Dorian stated this was followed by more shots and explosions.

Dorian continued by saying that after an hour they looked out a big window at the rear of the storage room and they could see officers

who he thought were police snipers on a roof. Dorian stated Jason saw an armored vehicle pull up outside with officers getting out of it.

Dorian went on to say about a half an hour later SWAT officer knocked on their hallway door. Dorian stated his group yelled that they were inside. The officers opened the door and led everyone to stairs and out a door near the kitchen. The officers told everyone to hold their hands on their heads.

Dorian stated he never saw the shooters in the school and doesn't know either of the suspects identified as the shooters.

Dorian was asked how many people were in the room with him and he stated around 29 plus the teacher. He stated several students that were not in the science class came into the room to hide.

Dorian was asked about the sounds of shooting and he stated some of the shooting sounded like it was a long way off, like in the main hallway and then it returned and was very close. Dorian stated he thinks he heard 5 bombs explode.

Dorian was asked how he knew different times of things happening. He stated the class starts at 11:15 A.M. and it was about 10 minutes later the shooting started. He related that he keeps time in minutes and from the time he heard shots until rescued by the SWAT team 100 minutes had passed. He also knows it was 1:00 P.M. when the SWAT team opened the door. Then he just subtracted the 100 minutes to find the time the incident started.

Dorian stated he left his backpack, Black with his initials DSM written on the outside. His day planner is inside with his name in it. A CD player, Sony and a two way radio, Sony Gray which belongs to a friend was inside.

Dorian stated Elisa Encinias told him it was Trench Coat people because she had come upstairs from the lunch room to hide.

The interview was concluded at this time.

On 083099, I telephonically interviewed Ronald Sauter, the father of Columbine High School student, Jalene Sauter. Eight attempts were made to contact Jalene, all with negative results.

Ronald told me that Jalene was at school on April 20, 1999 and in Mr. Cram's science class when the shooting incident began. He said that his daughter was made aware of the shooting by a teacher. Per Ronald's report, Jalene was able to exit the school quickly and without harm. He said she was one of the first students to exit the school. Jalene called her dad, Ronald from a friend's house. Ronald then picked his daughter up from her friend's house, which is located directly across the street from the school. He took Jalene and her friend to his home. Ronald said it was about 1145 hours. Ronald said that he got there at the same time all of the emergency equipment was arriving.

Ronald said that Jalene was not able to see any of the shooting, but she did hear shooting. *DISPOSITION: CASE OPEN*

On May 4, 1999 this investigator conducted an interview with Elizabeth Schneider in reference to the above case. Ms. Schneider works part time as a secretary, a teacher's aid in science, and in counseling at Columbine High School. Ms. Schneider made the following statements.

Ms. Schneider stated she did not see anything on the school marquees or school TV that it was going to be a bad day or anything like that on April 20, 1999.

On April 20, 1999 she was working in the science room office. A teacher identified as Caprice Wyatt came through the office and stated some people had guns and were shooting.

Approximately five minutes later Ms. Schneider heard shooting and large booms, that sounded like shotguns blasts. Ms. Schneider stated they hid in a corner of the science room.

Mr. Rich Long (teacher) came into the room and he had blood on his arm. She thought Mr. Long had been shot. Mr. Long told Ms. Schneider it was Dave Sander's blood.

Ms. Schneider stated they kept hearing gunshots. Then the gunmen came down towards the science room although Ms. Schneider did not see the gunmen you could hear them talking to one another. The gunmen shot at the science room door. One of the gunmen said "This

Fucking Door" They shot at it a second time and you could hear the glass break.

Ms. Schneider stated the gunmen threw what she thought was a bomb in the room that caused a fire. Teresa Miller (teacher) said it was a molotov cocktail. They heard the gunmen say "That ought to do it". Teresa Miller was able to put the fire out with a fire extinguisher.

During the time they spent in the science rooms the students turned the tables upside down to make barricades. She helped a visual impaired student during the ordeal. They were able to turn on the television to see what was happening. They saw the police arrest the three other suspects, who were later let go.

The Police Swat Team rescued all of the people who were hiding in the science rooms. She saw and heard Police Swat Team members assist Dave Sanders. She heard the Swat Team officers call for medical assistance for Dave Sanders. The time of the rescue was approximately 3:30 P.M.

Ms. Schneider stated she does not know either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold.

Ms. Schneider stated the shooting was going on past the noon hour. At least until 12:30 P.M. to 12:45 P.M.

Ms. Schneider stated the students have told her there are more involved than Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold.

I gave Ms. Schneider business cards to have those students contact me with any additional information.

On June 17, 1999, I interviewed Christopher Schwab, by telephone. Schwab said that on April 20, 1999, he had been inside of Mr. Manuello's's 5th hour Physics class, when the shooting started.

Schwab said that he had gone to school that day as usual. He said that he had been in his 5th hour class working on tiles when he saw students running down the hall screaming. He said that one of his female classmates looked out into the hall and asked a student who was running, what was going on. Schwab said that the student yelled that they should all get out of the school because there was someone inside the school shooting. Schwab said that Mr. Manuello's told the students to run into the storage room adjacent to the Tech. Lab. And to go out the Tech. Lab's doors.

Schwab said that they were told to go out the other doors of their classroom, so they ran to those doors. He said that they opened the doors to run out of them and heard two gun shots. He said that Mr. Manuello's then told them to run into the Tech. Lab And to get down and hide. Schwab said that all of the students in his classroom and Mr. Cram's Chemistry class, all managed to run out of the Tech. Lab., with the exception of Mr. Manuello's and 14 students including himself.

Schwab said that he and the 13 other students and Mr. Manuello's stayed hiding inside of the Tech. Lab Until they were rescued by the SWAT team. Schwab said that he was scared and does not remember much of what happened inside the classroom.

Schwab said that he did not hear much of anything after hiding in the Tech. Lab.. He said that he was hiding in the corner of the room and was in the back of the majority of the other students. He said that someone in the classroom with him, said that they had seen a light go off and a T.V. turn on in an adjacent room. Schwab said that he did not witness that.

I asked Schwab about what time the shooting started. He said that he had been in class for about 10 min. When he first heard the shooting. I asked Schwab what time he was finally escorted out of the school. He said that he did not remember times very well, but thought that he had been rescued around 3:30 p m.. Schwab said that they were sent out the doors located on the east side of the school, just south of the main doors to the school. He said that he ran across the street and was frisked by the SWAT Team a second time and sent to a bus which was waiting in the neighborhood east of the school. He said that they were then driven to Leawood elementary school. Schwab said that he did not remember anything else and did not know who the shooters were as he had not seen who was shooting in the halls of the school on that day. Schwab said that he did not know anything about the TCM or its members. The interview with Schwab was then Terminated.

INVESTIGATION:

On June 15, 1999, I spoke to Ryan Selchert by telephone, in reference to the Columbine High School shooting.

Selchert said that he was in Mr. Cram's 5th hour Chemistry class and heard people running and screaming so he looked out the window on the door and saw students running. Selchert said that Mr. Manuelo, a teacher from the classroom right next to his classroom came running into Mr. Cram's class and told the students to run. Selchert said that he heard a girl yell that there was someone in the school shooting. Selchert said that he heard loud booms or loud gun shots at that time.

Selchert said that he started to run out of the classroom but was stopped by Mr. Manuelo who told him and several other students that it was no longer safe to run out of the classroom into the hallways. Selchert said that he and 14 other people including Mr. Manuelo hid inside of a Physics classroom until they were rescued several hours later by a SWAT Team.

I asked Selchert at about what time he had heard the first booms or gunshots. He said that he heard the first booms around 11:30 a.m.. Selchert said that he then looked out the window on the classroom door and saw people running down the hallway. He said that the teachers then told them to run out of the classroom. He said that the fire alarm had gone off and it was difficult to hear.

I asked Selchert who had been in the classroom hiding with him. He said that Mr. Manuelo, Sara Arbogast, Bill Vandermere, Mark Maroney, Andrew Largabore, Kim Lorenz and several others were hiding with him. Selchert said that they tried calling -1-1 but they could not get through so they called the Littleton Fire Department and stayed on hold with them for a very long

time. He said that the dispatcher would come on the line every few min. And ask them if they were still alright and ask for any updates. Selchert said that while hiding in the classroom they heard about (4) four more explosions or loud gunshots. He said that while they were hiding a T.V. in the Tech. Lab. next to the room they were in, went on and a light went off. Selchert said that they remained quite and did not look to see who it was that had turned on the T.V. or turned off the light.

I asked Selchert about how long they had been hiding before the T.V. came on and the light went off. He said that he had been hiding for around 45 min. when that took place. Selchert said that the fire alarm was going off and sounding for around two hours. He said that the bell then began to sound and it continued to sound for a very long time. He said he thought the bell was still sounding when they were rescued by the SWAT team around 3:30 or 3:45 p.m..

Selchert said that they heard the SWAT Team walking around and talking in the hallway and the students knocked on the wall. He said that the SWAT Team told them to identify themselves to the SWAT Team and were then escorted out the doors located on the east side of the school just south of the main entrance to the school. He said that they were told to run across the street and were lined up along the fence adjacent to Pierce Street. He said that from there they were sent through a hole in the fence and loaded on to a bus which was parked in the neighborhood east of the school, and driven to Leawood Elementary School.

Selchert said that while hiding in the room he could hear people walking around in the hall but he did not know who it was and was to frightened to look. Selchert said that the teacher and other students who were hiding in a science room had called to their room and told them that a teacher had been shot. Selchert said that was the first time they knew that someone had been shot.

I asked Selchert if he had ever heard of the TCM before or if he knew the shooters. Selchert said that on Monday the 19th of April, just after (2) second hour he and two of his friends who he identified as, Mike Vendenia and Nick Romanision, saw Eric Harris sitting outside the doors located the west end of the main hallway. Selchert said that they asked Eric Harris what he was doing and he responded, "I'm

Mr. Smith stated he did not hear any announcements or saw anything unusual on the day of the shooting.

Mr. Smith stated he knew Dylan Klebold from a Team Sports class, but he did not know Klebold on a personal basis.

Mr. Smith stated the only Trench Coat Mafia member he knows is Joe Stair.

On April 20, 1999 at 11:25 A. M. he was in his science class. He heard alot of people running and screaming. He heard explosions. He and his other classmates went to the door to see what was happening. An unidentified teacher told us to get back in the classroom and lock the door. They went back in the classroom. They flipped tables over and hid behind them. He heard approximately five more explosions.

Mr. Smith stated he did not see any of the gunmen or what was causing the explosions. They were eventually rescued by Police Swat Team Members.

Jennifer Smull was interviewed on 04-28-99 by Inv Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, at approx. 3:15pm at her residence. Ms. Smull stated that she had been interviewed a few days before by Pat Vandercamp (sp?).

I asked Ms. Smull to go over the events that day. Ms. Smull said that she had seen Eric Harris at the "smoker's pit" between 11:05 and 11:10am on 04-20-99. She wasn't sure about what he was wearing but thought he had on a trench coat. Ms. Smull said she made a remark about having a bad day to the students at the pit and that Eric said something like, 'Not only are you having a bad day, it's Hitler's birthday'. Smull said she remembered the remark because Harris usually didn't speak with her. She said that she thought some of the other students at the smoker's pit might have been Taran Flemming, Brooks Brown, and Rachel Scott.

Ms. Smull said that between 11:10am and 11:15am she saw a person, who she thought was [REDACTED] some one who hung out with Dylan, near the main doors and it appeared that he had just come in. (She later identified this person as [REDACTED]). She said that he was wearing a black trench coat, black shirt, black and white camouflage pants (he normally tucks his pants into his boots, but she didn't remember if they were tucked in or not), and he was carrying a black colored duffel bag with one or two yellow stripes, or maybe just some yellow color on it, and the bag appeared to be heavy by the way it was being carried upon his shoulder. Ms. Smull said that [REDACTED] is about 2 to 3 inches shorter than Dylan.

Ms. Smull said that she went to Science Class with Mr. Peterson and that at 11:25am, she heard a loud boom and several shots and then the fire alarm went off. Ms. Smull said that Mrs. Miller, a teacher, came in and told the students to lock the door. Ms. Smull said that there were two adjoining classrooms, and that in the next room was Mr. Sanders and at some time she looked into the hallway and saw the trail of blood into the adjoining classroom where Mr. Sanders went after he was shot. Ms. Smull said that the teachers, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Freisen, Mrs. Miller, and another teacher were in the class room with Mr. Sanders and that the students had gathered in the adjoining class room. Ms. Smull said that at some time, Mr. Johnson came in and told them to flip the tables on their sides, to sort of build a barricade that they could hide behind.

Ms. Smull said that she peeked out between the tables and also looked out the window of the classroom doors. She said that between 11:45am and noon, she looked into the hallway and saw Dylan in the hallway, and another white male, she said that had he looked past the other person he would have seen her easily. Ms. Smull was asked to describe Dylan and she said he was wearing a black T shirt with writing on it, (she didn't know what it said) and a black hat on backwards with writing on it and that he had long curly hair.

She said that the person with Dylan appeared to be older, had short blonde hair, like a buzz cut, and was wearing a white T shirt, tight fit with no pocket, and was carrying a tan-colored sawed off shotgun. She said that they tried to break down the door where Mr. Sanders was and when they couldn't break the door down, they threw a bomb and ran down the hall. Ms. Smull said another student, John Bandamar (sp?) was also periodically looking out the window in the other door to the room. Other students in the science room were Michelle Berryman and Kyle Gummere.

Ms. Smull said that around 1:30pm she went to get a blanket for Mr. Sanders and also the remote control for the television, so they could watch tv and try to figure out what was going on in the school. She said that around 1:35pm the bell rang three times like it usually did, then she heard a loud boom, the fire alarm stopped ringing and the bell continued to ring.

Ms Smull said that around 2:55 to 3:00pm, a SWAT guy came in to get them out. She and the other 40 kids in the room with her as well as the teachers in the next room all left the building as the SWAT guy directed.

I read Ms. Smull the photo lineup admonition and showed her a photo array and asked her if she recognized anyone. Ms. Smull immediately identified photograph number one as Dylan, the person she saw outside of the science room between 11:45 and noon on 04-20-99.

I showed Ms. Smull another photo lineup and asked if she recognized anyone. She immediately identified the person in photograph number three as Eric, the person she had seen in the smoker's pit, between 11:05 and 11:10 am on 04-20-99.

I showed Ms. Smull another photo lineup and asked if she recognized anyone. She positively identified the person in photograph number six as an associate of the Trench Coat Mafia. She did not know their name. The person in photograph number six is Chris Morris.

I showed Ms. Smull another photo lineup and asked if she recognized anyone. Ms. Smull said that she believed the person in photograph number three may be the person that carried in the duffel bag. Ms. Smull said that she didn't know his name. The person in photograph number three is [REDACTED]

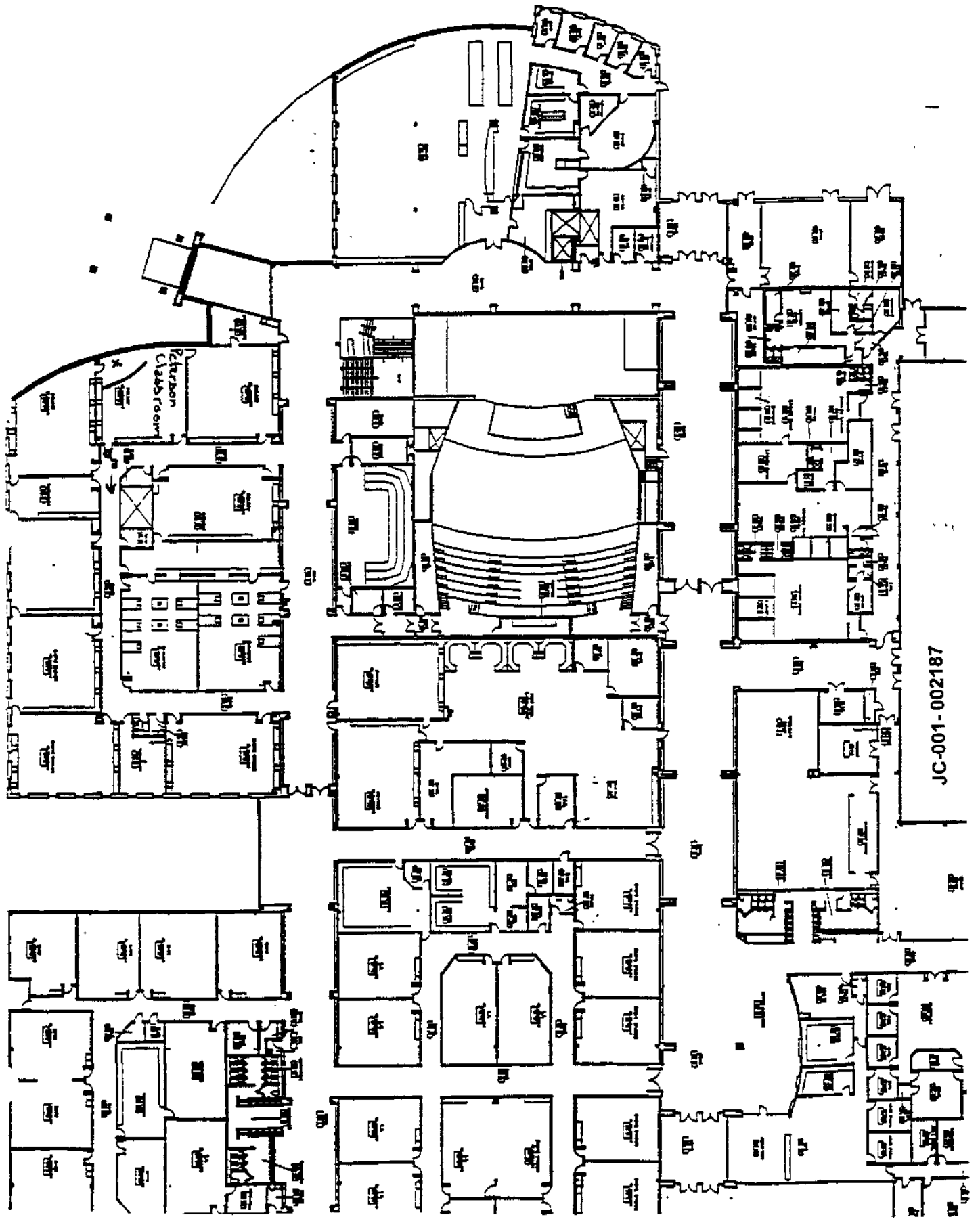
During the interview, Ms. Smull marked on a map of the school, the location of the science room that she had been in. She marked this room, "Peterson classroom". Ms. Smull drew a line to depict where the tables had been set on their sides and an X to mark where the students hid behind the tables. In the hallway, she marked a D for where Dylan was standing when she looked out the window of the door and an E for where the other person was standing with Dylan (this was at my direction, as Ms. Smull does not believe that the other person was Eric). Ms. Smull drew an arrow to indicate which way the suspects ran after they unsuccessfully tried to break down the adjoining class room door and then threw the bomb.

On 10-12-99, between the hours of 1640 and 1710, I had an opportunity to re-interview Jennifer Smull in reference to an interview she conducted with Investigator Jill Reuteler with Colorado State Patrol on 04-28-99, DN 1450

Jennifer and her mother, Nancy Smull, met me at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office South Substation where we conducted this interview. I provided Jennifer and her mother a copy of the report that Investigator Jill Reuteler had completed in reference to the interview she had conducted earlier with Jennifer. I had Jennifer review the report, at which time I asked additional questions in reference to some of the statements that were made in the report. My initial question was pertaining to Jennifer's observations where she states that she saw [REDACTED] at the high school between 1110 and 1115 hours on 04-20-99 and that [REDACTED] was near the main doors and appeared to be carrying a large duffle bag. Jennifer initially identifies this person as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] then recants and identifies [REDACTED]. Jennifer explained that she does not know [REDACTED] and told me that the individual she saw that day looked similar to [REDACTED] but she could not positively tell me who the subject was. I asked Jennifer if she was implicating [REDACTED] as being involved in this incident. She told me she has no knowledge of him being involved in this incident and she did not see him doing anything which would lead her to believe that he was involved in this incident.

I asked Jennifer about the statement that she made that between 11:45 a.m. and noon she observed two armed gunmen in the hallway, just outside her science class. Jennifer identifies Dylan Klebold as being one of the armed gunmen and describes him as wearing a black t-shirt with writing on it, had a black hat on, turned backwards with writing on it, and she saw his long, curly hair extend below the baseball cap. Jennifer stated that she was positive that individual was Dylan Klebold. In her statement, she then describes a second armed gunman, who is unknown to her.

Jennifer described the second gunman as being older, had short blond hair, like a buzz cut, was wearing a white t-shirt, tight fit with no pockets and was carrying a tan colored sawed off shotgun. Jennifer said that that description was accurate, at which time she provided me a composite drawing that she had done in reference to the suspect she saw at the high school and provided a complete description of the subject. Jennifer described the subject as having natural strawberry blond hair, it was buzz cut, stating that his face was well defined, high cheekbones, chiseled. The party had a wide forehead and muscular neck. He was about 5'11" to 6'0", oval face, smaller upper lip, narrow nose and small eyebrows. I took the two items as evidence and later placed them into the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Evidence Vault for safekeeping. I asked Jennifer if she could provide the identification of that second armed gunman. She told me that she did not recognize the individual and she did not believe the party was Eric Harris. I explained to Jennifer that throughout this investigation, that we relied not only on Forensic evidence that was recovered at the scene, but with the assistance of witness identification, that the two gunmen that were in Columbine High School have been identified as Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. I also told Jennifer that a videotape did exist which showed two armed gunmen down in the cafeteria at the school and I asked her if I could show her still photos of that videotape and have her determine if these were the two individuals that she saw at the high school on the incident date. Jennifer and her mom were shown still photos, #44, #47, #52 and #53. The still photos clearly depict Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris as being the two armed gunmen in the school. One of the photos has the time of 11:46 a.m. This is one minute after Jennifer claims she saw them in the upper level of the school. Eric Harris is shown in the photo wearing a white colored t-shirt. He has a short haircut, dark pants, and is carrying a sawed off shotgun. Jennifer looked at the photos and again I asked her are these the two individuals that she saw at the high school. Jennifer positively identified Dylan Klebold, but stated the other subject she saw was not Eric Harris. She told me that the party she saw was about 25 to 30 years old, had a thick muscular neck and muscular build and that Eric Harris was too scrawny to be the same party she observed. I again reiterated with Jennifer that the still photos are of Eric Harris and it is the same description that she is giving us.

Jennifer again told me that she could not positively identify the second gunman as being Eric Harris and believed that the second gunman she saw was somebody other than Eric Harris. Nancy asked me how the news media had gotten copies of the cafeteria video which was released on national news on 10-12-99. I told Nancy that I did not know how or why the video was released. Nancy stated, "You have custody of the tapes, and you don't know how they were released?" I told her I did not have that information and I wasn't privy to it. Nancy told me that it was hard for her to sit here and believe what I was telling her about the case when she has concerns if the Sheriff's Office is giving her truthful information. It was apparent to this investigator that Nancy and Jennifer were questioning the credibility of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

At the completion of this interview, Nancy and Jennifer then expressed their concerns, telling me that they believe their home telephone has been tapped and someone is monitoring their calls. I asked Nancy why she believes this. She told me there is a constant beeping when you're on the telephone talking and she was told several years ago that the beeping is indicative that someone has tapped your phone line. I asked Nancy who she believed had tapped her phone line. She told me her scenario is that associates who are sympathetic to Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold's might be responsible because these parties know that her daughter has information on the identity of the two gunmen.

Jennifer also explained that since the incident date, they have received several hang up calls at their residence, telling me that Caller ID identifies the calls as being out of the area. I asked Nancy and Jennifer if any of the calls were threatening in nature or if they were coming at inconvenient hours of the day. They told me that they were nothing more than hang up calls and they have received anywhere from as many as three per day. They were instructed that if they have a legitimate concern about the phone calls and somebody making harassing phone calls, that they could contact the Sheriff's Office and speak with a uniformed deputy who could ultimately initiate some type of a harassment report. I also explained to them that the phone service has means of trapping those annoying phone calls and that information could be provided to law enforcement if a criminal report has been generated. I also told Nancy that changing their home phone number might be an option they might consider. 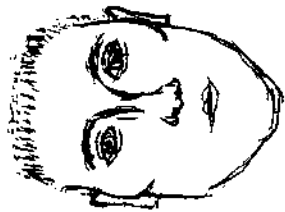



INVESTIGATION:

On June 15, 1999, I spoke to Anne Sorenson by telephone in reference to the Columbine High School shooting. Sorenson said that she was in Mr. Cram's 5th hour Chemistry class when the shooting started. She said she had been in class for about 10-15 min. When she heard loud blasts and hugh bangs coming from some where inside of the school.

Sorenson said that at first she thought that Mr. Frisian, another Chemistry teacher had blown something up in his classroom. She said that she was told by Mr. Cram to sit down and wait. Sorenson said that about 3 min. Later Mr. Manuelo came running into her classroom and told the kids to run out of the school. She said that a girl came into the classroom and said that there were two people with guns shooting up the school. Sorenson said that she does not know who the girl was and ran out of the classroom with the other students.

Sorenson said that she ran through the storage room through the Tech. Lab. And out into the main hallway. Sorenson said that when she got into the main hallway she looked to her right and saw that the window on the front doors of the school had been shot out. Sorenson said that she ran down the hall towards the weight room and past the counselors offices and into the smokers pit. She said that because of the fence that goes around that part of the school they students were unable to get out. Sorenson said that two boys pushed the picnic tables against the fence and the students climbed onto the tables and over the fence. Sorenson said that after climbing over the fence the students just stood around on the basketball courts for a few moments until another student came running up and told them that there were people with guns shooting at the students. Sorenson said that she ran through Clement Park and then went with Jaieen Sauter to Andrea Bannisters house which is close to the high school.

I asked Sorenson if she heard any announcements the morning of the shooting. She said that she heard announcements during second hour class but does not recall what they were. Sorenson said that she remembers hearing the fire alarm going off shortly after hearing the first blasts and hugh booms.

I asked Sorenson what her class schedule on that day was. She said that her class was as follows;



I asked Sorenson if she had heard of the TCM. She said that she had heard of them before but they kept mostly to themselves. Sorenson said that Harris and Klebold were both in her bowling class but both were absent on the day of the shooting.

I asked Sorenson where she sat in the classroom and she said that she sat in the front of the class at the desk located to the right of Mr. Cram's desk, with Corrie Whitfield. Sorenson said that she did not think she had any additional information she could provide to me that was relevant to the shooting or the shooters. I asked Sorenson if she ever saw who it was that was doing the shooting and she indicated that she never saw who it was that did the shooting. The interview was then terminated.

On 05-05-99 I called the telephone number listed above and left a message I was attempting to contact [REDACTED]. At approximately 12:05 on 05-06-99, I was paged by subject STARKEY. STARKEY told me that Harris and Klebold referred to him [REDACTED]. STARKEY advised that a girl he once dated, Devon Adams, had been going out with a TCM associate by the name of Zach Heckler. Heckler had given him the nickname. Harris and Klebold just picked up on the nickname and began using it.

STARKEY has had a number of altercations with Heckler, but not with Harris or Klebold. At one time STARKEY'S cousin, Devin Kathol, went to Heckler and told Heckler to leave STARKEY alone. A short time after the warning from Kathol to Heckler the front picture window of STARKEY'S home was shot out. STARKEY believes that Heckler is responsible for the shooting of the window.

STARKEY is currently a sophomore at Columbine HS.
