Your affiant is of lawful age and a sworn peace officer of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, Golden, Colorado, in the County of Jefferson.

Your affiant states that the following facts are true and based upon his/her personal knowledge, as a result of his/her conversations with the person(s) named herein and reviewing their written reports.

On April 20, 1999, at about 11:15 a.m., Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Dispatch received a call stating that there was a bomb in the area of Ken Caryl and Chatfield, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado. At the same time Dispatch received another call reporting that there was a girl "down" in the parking lot at Columbine High School. Deputy Paul Magor was dispatched at 11:16 a.m. to the bomb, and Deputies Scott Taborsky and Eric Miller were dispatched to Columbine High School, 6201 South Pierce Street, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado. Upon their arrival, Deputies Taborsky and Miller observed numerous students who were yelling and screaming as they ran out of the school. Deputies Taborsky and Miller also heard what they believed to be gunshots coming from inside the school. Deputies Taborsky and Miller were told by numerous students that people had been shot inside the school.

Jefferson County Sheriff's Investigator Gary Muse interviewed Brooks Brown, a student of Columbine High School, who stated that prior to the shooting beginning he was in the corridor of Columbine High School and recognized Eric Harris wearing a black duster, black jeans, carrying a duffel bag which had an odd shape to it. Eric Harris told Brooks Brown, "I like you, get out of here." Brooks Brown believed something bad was going to happen, so he exited the school and went to the parking lot. Brown recognized Dylan Klebold's car, an older black 4-door Mercedes Benz, with a "NIN" sticker on the back, parked next to his own car. Brooks Brown recognized Eric Harris' car, a black Honda Civic 4-door, with a "Ramstein" sticker on the back window, parked on the other side of his own car. Brooks Brown stated that Harris and Klebold are best friends and believed them to be together.

Jefferson County Sheriff's Investigator Ralph Gallegos interviewed Alaj Andra Marsh, a student of Columbine High School. Alaj Marsh stated that she had been in class in Columbine High School, when she heard shooting. Alaj Marsh went to the corridor where she saw Dylan Klebold and a male known to her as "Reb." Alaj Marsh stated that both "Reb" and Dylan Klebold were wearing black pants and full length black dusters. Alaj Marsh saw that Dylan Klebold was carrying a rifle type weapon at waist height and was firing down the hall.

Littleton Police Detective Russell Hoffman interviewed Tyler Jackman, a student at Columbine High School. Jackman stated that he was in the parking lot of Columbine High School with a friend, Wade Alan Frank, at lunch time, about 11:30 a.m.. Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School, wearing a full length black coat. Dylan Klebold walked down the stairs where an unknown male was lying face down at the bottom of the stairs. Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold shout into the back of the unknown male with a sawed off shotgun. Dylan Klebold then began walking toward a grassy area, at which point he took a white pipe bomb, lit it, and threw it into the senior parking lot, where it exploded. Dylan Klebold then walked back up the stairs where he met another male and the two walked inside the school. Tyler Jackman stated he could not identify the second male, as he only saw him briefly.

Investigator Kate Battan interviewed Wade Alan Frank, a student of Columbine High School, who stated that about 11:30 a.m.

lunch time, he was in the parking lot of Columbine High School with Tyler Jackman, when he heard gunshots inside the school. Wade Frank saw a male wearing a long black trench coat at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School. Wade Frank mentioned to Jackman that he thought it was [REDACTED] Jackman told Frank it was Dylan Klebold. The male in the trench coat was also wearing a black hat, possibly a baseball hat backwards or a ski mask. Wade Frank saw the male walk down the stairs, approach a male lying face down at the bottom of the stairs, and shoot a sawed off shotgun into his back. Wade Frank saw the male throw a white PVC pipe bomb, which exploded. Wade Frank saw the male walk to the top of the stairs, where there was a second male dressed the same.

Investigator Art Peterson interviewed Columbine High School student John Savage. Savage stated that during the shooting he was hiding under a table in the library. He recognized Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, both wearing black. Dylan Klebold pointed a black handgun under the table at Savage. Savage said, "What are you doing?" Dylan responded, "We're out killing people." Klebold told Savage to identify himself and Savage responded, "It's John." Savage then asked, "Are you going to kill me?" Klebold responded, "No, run, just get out of here."

Investigator Mike Heylin of the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office stated that he had been contacted by Randy and Judy Brown, parents of Brooks Brown, in early 1998. The Browns told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris, who attends Columbine High School with Brooks Brown, had been harassing and threatening Brooks Brown. Randy and Judy Brown told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris belonged to a "black trench coat gang" and had a web site reference murder and killing. They provided Investigator Heylin with possible web site addresses of [HTTP://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html](http://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html) or <http://members.aol.com/rebdoomer/index.html>.

Your affiant discovered a report made to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office on March 18, 1998, 98-5504, by Randy Brown. Randy Brown stated that Eric Harris was making death threats towards his son, Brooks Brown. Randy Brown provided ten pages of material copied from Eric Harris' web page to Deputy Mark Miller. One of the printouts reads, "Wie gehts. Well all you people out there can just kiss my ass and die. From now on, i dont give a fuck what almost any of you mutha fuckas have to say unless i respect you which is highly unlikely, but for those of you who happen to know me and know that i respect you may peact be with you and dont be in my line of fire. for the rest of you, you all better fucking hide in your houses because im comin fo EVERYONE soon, and i WILL be armed to the fuckin teeth and I WILL shoot to kill and i WILL fucking KILL EVERYTHING No I am not crazy, crazy is just a word, to me it has no meaning, everyone is different, but most of you fuckheads out there in socceity, going to your everyday fucking jobs and doing your everyday routine shitty things, i say fuck you and die. if you go a problem with my thoughts, come tell me and ill kill you, because.....god damnnit, DEAD PEOPLE DONT ARGUE!" Another page has an entry which states, "I will rig up explosives all over a town and detonate each one of them at will after I mow dow a whole fucking area full of you snotty ass rich mother fucking high strung godlike attitude having worthless pieces of shi whores. i dont care if I live or die in the shootout, all I want to do is kill and injure as many of you pricks as I can, especially few people Like brooks brown." Randy Brown told Deputy Miller that Eric Harris is also known as "Reb." Randy Brown state that Harris also has an acquaintance by the name of Dylan Klebold, who is also known as "Vodka."

Investigator Ralph Gallegos interviewed Christopher Morris, who stated that he used to be part of TCM, Trench Coat Mafia. Morris told Investigator Gallegos he believed the people inside Columbine High School doing the shooting were Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, and [REDACTED]. Christopher Morris stated that Eric Harris also goes by "Reb." Two weeks ago Eric Harris ha

been picked on by "Jocks" at Columbine High School. Following this incident, while at Dylan Klebold's house, Harris told Christopher Morris, "Wouldn't it be nice to kill jocks." Detective Nick Rogers of Denver Police Department responded to [redacted] South Reed Street, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado, with the Denver and Sheridan Police Departments SWAT Teams at about 2:00 p.m.. Upon arrival they discovered Eric Harris' parents and sister inside the house. Wayne and Catherine Harris gave permission to search the house for additional occupants. Detective Rogers observed in Eric Harris' downstairs bedroom a plastic bag containing shotgun shells and military style binoculars. No other occupants were found in the house. As the SWAT Teams were exiting the residence, they smelled a strong odor of gas in the garage. With Wayne and Catherine Harris' permission, they searched the garage and saw nothing unusual, but discovered a storage unit which was shut.

Arapahoe County Sheriff's Detective Faith Stevens interviewed Columbine High School teacher Peggy Dodd. Dodd stated that she was in the library of Columbine High School when a student, Brian Anderson, entered the library and fell against the counter. Peggy Dodd stated that Brian Anderson had blood on his face and chest. Brian Anderson stated, "Eric Harris shot me." Peggy Dodd stated she looked outside and saw Dylan Klebold standing on a grassy knoll above the parking lot. Peggy Dodd stated that Klebold was carrying a long rifle type gun, shooting into the parking lot in a sweeping motion.

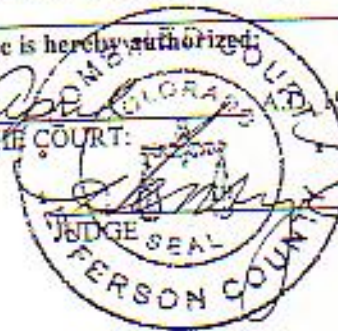

Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School, wearing a full length black coat. Dylan Klebold walked down the stairs where an unknown male was lying face down at the bottom of the stairs. Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold shoot into the back of the unknown male with a sawed off shotgun. Dylan Klebold then began walking toward a grassy area, at which point he took a white pipe bomb, lit it, and threw it into the senior parking lot, where it exploded. Dylan Klebold then walked back up the stairs where he met another male and the two walked inside the school. Tyler Jackman stated he could not identify the second male, as he only saw him briefly.

Investigator Kate Battan interviewed Wade Alan Frank, a student of Columbine High School, who stated that about 11:30 a.m.

lunch time, he was in the parking lot of Columbine High School with Tyler Jackman, when he heard gunshots inside the school. Wade Frank saw a male wearing a long black trench coat at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School. Wade Frank mentioned to Jackman that he thought it was [redacted] Jackman told Frank it was Dylan Klebold. The male in the trench coat was also wearing a black hat, possibly a baseball hat backwards or a ski mask. Wade Frank saw the male walk down the stairs, approach a male lying face down at the bottom of the stairs, and shoot a sawed off shotgun into his back. Wade Frank saw the male throw a white PVC pipe bomb, which exploded. Wade Frank saw the male walk to the top of the stairs, where there was a second male dressed the same.

Investigator Art Peterson interviewed Columbine High School student John Savage. Savage stated that during the shooting he was hiding under a table in the library. He recognized Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, both wearing black. Dylan Klebold pointed a black handgun under the table at Savage. Savage said, "What are you doing?" Dylan responded, "We're out killing people." Klebold told Savage to identify himself and Savage responded, "It's John." Savage then asked, "Are you going to kill me?" Klebold responded, "No, run, just get out of here."

Investigator Mike Heylin of the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office stated that he had been contacted by Randy and Judy Brown, parents of Brooks Brown, in early 1998. The Brown's told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris, who attends Columbine High School with Brooks Brown, had been harassing and threatening Brooks Brown. Randy and Judy Brown told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris belonged to a "black trench coat gang" and had a web site reference murder and killing. They provided Investigator Heylin with possible web site addresses of [HTTP://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html](http://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html) or <http://members.aol.com/rebdoomer/index.html>.

Your affiant discovered a report made to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office on March 18, 1998, 98-5504, by Randy Brown. Randy Brown stated that Eric Harris was making death threats towards his son, Brooks Brown. Randy Brown provided ten pages of material copied from Eric Harris' web page to Deputy Mark Miller. One of the printouts reads, "Wie gehts. Well all you people out there can just kiss my ass and die. From now on, i dont give a fuck what almost any of you mutha fuckas have to say unless i respect you which is highly unlikely. but for those of you who happen to know me and know that i respect you may peace be with you and dont be in my line of fire. for the rest of you, you all better fucking hide in your houses because im comin fo EVERYONE soon, and i WILL be armed to the fuckin teeth and I WILL shoot to kill and i WILL fucking KILL EVERYTHING No I am not crazy, crazy is just a word, to me it has no meaning, everyone is different, but most of you fuckheads out there i soceity, going to your everyday fucking jobs and doing your everyday routine shitty things, i say fuck you and die. if you ge a problem with my thoughts, come tell me and ill kill you, because.....god damnnit, DEAD PEOPLE DONT ARGUE!" Another page has an entry which states, "I will rig up explosives all over a town and detonate each one of them at will after I mow dow a whole fucking area full of you snotty ass rich mother fucking high strung godlike attitude having worthless pieces of sh whores. i dont care if I live or die in the shootout, all I want to do is kill and injure as many of you pricks as I can, especially few people Like brooks brown." Randy Brown told Deputy Miller that Eric Harris is also known as "Reb." Randy Brown state that Harris also has an acquaintance by the name of Dylan Klebold, who is also known as "Vodka."

Investigator Ralph Gallegos interviewed Christopher Morris, who stated that he used to be part of TCM, Trench Coat Mafi. Morris told Investigator Gallegos he believed the people inside Columbine High School doing the shooting were Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, and [redacted]. Christopher Morris stated that Eric Harris also goes by "Reb." Two weeks ago Eric Harris b:

been picked on by "Jocks" at Columbine High School. Following this incident, while at Dylan Klebold's house, Harris told Christopher Morris, "Wouldn't it be nice to kill jocks." Christopher Morris said while this conversation was taking place, they were reading books about Nazi's and discussed cutting the power to the school and placing PVC bombs with screws inside at the doors of the school.

Detective Nick Rogers of Denver Police Department responded to [redacted] South Reed Street, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado, with the Denver and Sheridan Police Departments SWAT Teams at about 2:00 p.m.. Upon arrival they discovered Eric Harris' parents and sister inside the house. Wayne and Catherine Harris gave permission to search the house for additional occupants. Detective Rogers observed in Eric Harris' downstairs bedroom a plastic bag containing shotgun shells and military style binoculars. No other occupants were found in the house. As the SWAT Teams were exiting the residence, they smelled a strong odor of gas in the garage. With Wayne and Catherine Harris' permission, they searched the garage and saw nothing unusual, but discovered a storage unit which was shut.

Arapahoe County Sheriff's Detective Faith Stevens interviewed Columbine High School teacher Peggy Dodd. Dodd stated that she was in the library of Columbine High School when a student, Brian Anderson, entered the library and fell against the counter. Peggy Dodd stated that Brian Anderson had blood on his face and chest. Brian Anderson stated, "Eric Harris shot me." Peggy Dodd stated she looked outside and saw Dylan Klebold standing on a grassy knoll above the parking lot. Peggy Dodd stated that Klebold was carrying a long rifle type gun, shooting into the parking lot in a sweeping motion.

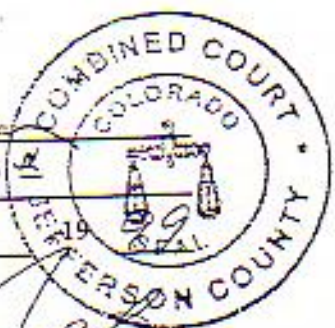

INVESTIGATION:

On 04-20-99, at about 1145 hours, I received a page from Investigator Doug Moore. I returned the call and was told by him that there had been a shooting at Columbine High School and that I was needed back in the Sheriff's office. Upon arrival, I was told that the situation was ongoing and that there were a number of investigators either on scene or headed to that scene and that I needed to remain within the Investigation Division. I was later instructed by Captain Dan Harris to prepare search warrants for the residences of both Eric Harris at [redacted] South Reed Street, and for Dylan Klebold, at [redacted] Cougar Road. I prepared both warrants from information obtained from Investigator Kate Battan, which were then read and revised by Assistant District Attorneys Judy Archuleta and Laura Dunbar.

- At about 1740 hours, I presented those warrants to Judge Nieto, who approved and sealed them. See attached. Upon approval of those warrants, I returned to the Investigation Division where I was told by Sgt. John Hicks to report to the command post of the scene at Columbine High School, along with Investigator Craig Schoshke and to provide those warrants to Sgt. Pat Woodin.

Upon arrival at the command post, I gave both warrants to Sgt. Pat Woodin. She and Investigator Kate Battan told me that they had arranged for me to go to the residence at [redacted] South Reed Street, to assist with the warrant at that residence. Investigator Battan told me that the residence had been swept by one of the bomb squads and that the house was clear of any explosive devices, but that some had been removed from the residence. They also stated that Investigator Schoshke should come with me. We then met with Sgt. Dan McCasky of Lakewood Police Department, who stated that the Littleton Police Department lab would accompany us to that location and that they had the items necessary for the search and the collection of evidence.

At about 1910 hours, the personnel who were to be involved in the search at the Harris residence arrived at that residence. Upon arrival, I noted that Deputy Dale Scott had the scene secured and that no other law enforcement personnel were on scene at the time. Deputy Scott kept a log of the times personnel entered and exited the scene. See his report.

- At about 1920 hours, personnel to be involved with the search of the residence entered the garage where a double overhea

garage was propped open with a 2 x 4, prior to our arrival. These personnel included Littleton Police Department Lab Technicians Bruce Adams and Jessica Barrett, Lakewood Police Department personnel, Sgt. Dan McCasky, Investigators Alex Jameson, San Connally, Greg Slater, Dave Mowery, Mitch Harper, and Mike Greenwell, as well as Jefferson County Sheriff's Department Investigators Craig Schoshke and myself. After a short briefing reference the content of the warrant and the situation, Littleton Lab personnel entered the residence, accompanied by Investigator Craig Schoshke, to take still photos of the residence prior to us searching the residence. While they were doing so, Investigator Jameson of the Lakewood Police Department stated that he had spoken with a neighbor who stated they had heard both Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold discussing breaking glass and the use of an aluminum bat and had then heard glass breaking. Detective Jameson stated that the neighbor told him this had occurred on 04-19-99. Lakewood Investigators then looked on the east side of the Harris' residence and discovered some broken glass. When the Littleton lab personnel were finished with their photography, the rest of the search personnel entered the scene. Numerous items were collected. See attached evidence sheets. During the course of the search, Jefferson County Sheriff's Investigator Don Estep accompanied by FBI Special Agent Mark Holtslaw and Attorney General Special Investigator Gary Clyman, all assigned to the FBI domestic terrorism task force, arrived at the scene. Investigator Estep asked me specifically about any playing cards which had been discovered. I then showed Investigator Estep the playing cards which had been discovered in Eric Harris' room. Investigators Estep and Clyman and Special Agent Holtslaw then left the scene and returned later to assist with the remainder of the search. Lakewood Police Investigators provided me a list of the numbers on the caller ID unit in the family room of the Harris' residence.

At about 0045 hours, on 04-21-99, all search personnel exited the scene and the residence was secured by myself and Investigator Schoshke. At that time, Deputy Scott took down the crime scene tape and also left the residence. All evidence items recovered from the search of the residence were secured in the department car driven by Investigator Schoshke and myself. Investigator Schoshke and I then took those items and secured them in the evidence vault at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. The items listed as evidence item #271, were taken and secured by Littleton Police Lab personnel.






Upon their arrival, Deputies Taborsky and Miller observed numerous students who were yelling and screaming as they ran out of the school. Deputies Taborsky and Miller also heard what they believed to be gunshots coming from inside the school. Deputies Taborsky and Miller were told by numerous students that people had been shot inside the school.

Jefferson County Sheriff's Investigator Gary Muse interviewed Brooks Brown, a student of Columbine High School, who stated that prior to the shooting beginning he was in the corridor of Columbine High School and recognized Eric Harris wearing a black duster, black jeans, carrying a duffel bag which had an odd shape to it. Eric Harris told Brooks Brown, "I like you, get out of here." Brooks Brown believed something bad was going to happen, so he exited the school and went to the parking lot. Brown recognized Dylan Klebold's car, an older black 4-door Mercedes Benz, with a "NIN" sticker on the back, parked next to his own car. Brooks Brown recognized Eric Harris' car, a black Honda Civic 4-door, with a "Ramstein" sticker on the back window, parked on the other side of his own car. Brooks Brown stated that Harris and Klebold are best friends and believed them to be together.

Jefferson County Sheriff's Investigator Ralph Gallegos interviewed Alaj Andra Marsh, a student of Columbine High School. Alaj Marsh stated that she had been in class in Columbine High School, when she heard shooting. Alaj Marsh went to the corridor where she saw Dylan Klebold and a male known to her as "Reb." Alaj Marsh stated that both "Reb" and Dylan Klebold were wearing black pants and full length black dusters. Alaj Marsh saw that Dylan Klebold was carrying a rifle type weapon at waist height and was firing down the hall.

Littleton Police Detective Russell Hoffman interviewed Tyler Jackman, a student at Columbine High School. Jackman stated that he was in the parking lot of Columbine High School with a friend, Wade Alan Frank, at lunch time, about 11:30 a.m.. Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School, wearing a full length black coat. Dylan Klebold walked down the stairs where an unknown male was lying face down at the bottom of the stairs. Tyler Jackman saw Dylan Klebold shoot into the back of the unknown male with a sawed off shotgun. Dylan Klebold then began walking toward a grassy area, at which point he took a white pipe bomb, lit it, and threw it into the senior parking lot, where it exploded. Dylan Klebold then walked back up the stairs where he met another male and the two walked inside the school. Tyler Jackman stated he could not identify the second male, as he only saw him briefly.

Investigator Kate Battan interviewed Wade Alan Frank, a student of Columbine High School, who stated that about 11:30 a.m.

lunch time, he was in the parking lot of Columbine High School with Tyler Jackman, when he heard gunshots inside the school. Wade Frank saw a male wearing a long black trench coat at the top of the stairs at the entrance to Columbine High School. Wade Frank mentioned to Jackman that he thought it was [redacted]. Jackman told Frank it was Dylan Klebold. The male in the trench coat was also wearing a black hat, possibly a baseball hat backwards or a ski mask. Wade Frank saw the male walk down the stairs, approach a male lying face down at the bottom of the stairs, and shoot a sawed off shotgun into his back. Wade Frank saw the male throw a white PVC pipe bomb, which exploded. Wade Frank saw the male walk to the top of the stairs, where there was a second male dressed the same.

Investigator Art Peterson interviewed Columbine High School student John Savage. Savage stated that during the shooting he was hiding under a table in the library. He recognized Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, both wearing black. Dylan Klebold pointed a black handgun under the table at Savage. Savage said, "What are you doing?" Dylan responded, "We're out killing people." Klebold told Savage to identify himself and Savage responded, "It's John." Savage then asked, "Are you going to kill me?" Klebold responded, "No, run, just get out of here."

Investigator Mike Heylin of the Jefferson County District Attorney's Office stated that he had been contacted by Randy and Judy Brown, parents of Brooks Brown, in early 1998. The Browns told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris, who attends Columbine High School with Brooks Brown, had been harassing and threatening Brooks Brown. Randy and Judy Brown told Investigator Heylin that Eric Harris belonged to a "black trench coat gang" and had a web site reference murder and killing. They provided Investigator Heylin with possible web site addresses of [HTTP://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html](http://members.aol.com/rebdomine/index.html) or <http://members.aol.com/rebdoomer/index.html>.

our affiant discovered a report made to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office on March 18, 1998, 98-5504, by Randy Brown. Randy Brown stated that Eric Harris was making death threats towards his son, Brooks Brown. Randy Brown provided ten pages of material copied from Eric Harris' web page to Deputy Mark Miller. One of the printouts reads, "Wie gehts. Well all you people out there can just kiss my ass and die. From now on, I dont give a fuck what almost any of you mutha fuckas have to say, unless I respect you which is highly unlikely. but for those of you who happen to know me and know that I respect you may peace be with you and dont be in my line of fire. for the rest of you, you all better fucking hide in your houses because im comin for EVERYONE soon, and I WILL be armed to the fuckin teeth and I WILL shoot to kill and I WILL fucking KILL EVERYTHING! Another page has an entry which states, "I will rig up explosives all over a town and detonate each one of them a will after I mow down a whole fucking area full of you snotty ass rich mother fucking high strung godlike attitude having worthless pieces of shit whores. I dont care if I live or die in the shootout, all I want to do is kill and injure as many of you prick as I can, especially a few people Like brooks brown." Randy Brown told Deputy Miller that Eric Harris is also known as "Reb." Randy Brown stated that Harris also has an acquaintance by the name of Dylan Klebold, who is also known as "Vodka."

Investigator Ralph Gallegos interviewed Christopher Morris, who stated that he used to be part of TCM, Trench Coat Mafia. Morris told investigator Gallegos he believed the people inside Columbine High School doing the shooting were Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, and [redacted]. Christopher Morris stated that Eric Harris also goes by "Reb." Two weeks ago Eric Harris ha

been picked on by "Jocks" at Columbine High School. Following this incident, while at Dylan Klebold's house, Harris told Christopher Morris, "Wouldn't it be nice to kill jocks." Christopher Morris said while this conversation was taking place, they were reading books about Nazi's and discussed cutting the power to the school and placing PVC bombs with screws inside at the doors of the school.

Detective Nick Rogers of Denver Police Department responded to [redacted] South Reed Street, County of Jefferson, State of Colorado, with the Denver and Sheridan Police Departments SWAT Teams at about 2:00 p.m.. Upon arrival they discovered Eric Harris' parents and sister inside the house. Wayne and Catherine Harris gave permission to search the house for additional occupants. Detective Rogers observed in Eric Harris' downstairs bedroom a plastic bag containing shotgun shells and military style binoculars. No other occupants were found in the house. As the SWAT Teams were exiting the residence, they smelled a strong odor of gas in the garage. With Wayne and Catherine Harris' permission, they searched the garage and saw nothing unusual, but discovered a storage unit which was shut.

Arapahoe County Sheriff's Detective Faith Stevens interviewed Columbine High School teacher Peggy Dodd. Dodd stated that she was in the library of Columbine High School when a student, Brian Anderson, entered the library and fell against the counter. Peggy Dodd stated that Brian Anderson had blood on his face and chest. Brian Anderson stated, "Eric Harris shot me." Peggy Dodd stated she looked outside and saw Dylan Klebold standing on a grassy knoll above the parking lot. Peggy Dodd stated that Klebold was carrying a long rifle type gun, shooting into the parking lot in a sweeping motion.

On April 20, 1999, Investigator Cheryl Zimmerman of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office executed a search warrant at 8276 South Reed Street. A video camera was recovered from the family room of the residence and entered into evidence as item 200.

On April 24, 1999, Investigator Cheryl Zimmerman removed an 8mm tape from item 200, the video camera. Investigator Zimmerman viewed that tape and found it to be both Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold video recording their planning for the incident which occurred on April 20, 1999, at Columbine High School. During the tape, Dylan Klebold is filming Eric Harris' bedroom at 8276 South Reed Street. This room is known to Investigator Zimmerman from the search warrant. The room is a lower level room with a large window well outside the west window. Klebold films the west window in Harris' room and refers to it as a "bunker." This comment is made moments after video taping both pipe bombs, a black rifle which Harris refers to as a carbine, and a shotgun, which Harris refers to as "Ariene."



INVESTIGATION:

On 04-24-99, while viewing evidence item #200, an 8mm video, later re-packaged as item #333, I noted that Eric Harris referred to clips for one of his guns being purchased at Green Mountain Guns. I contacted Sergeant Ken Ester at the Command Post for this incident, and provided him this information to be followed up on.

In that video, Harris and Dylan Klebold also refer to a "bunker" outside of Harris' room, as well as a receipt from Green Mountain Guns being hidden in his room. As a result, I prepared a new search warrant for Harris' house at [redacted] South Reed Street. I contacted Judge Henry Nieto by telephone and faxed him this warrant, which he signed and sealed, and faxed it back to me. See attached. I provided Detective Rick Reker with the search warrant and the information, and requested that he carry out this search warrant. (See his report for additional details.)

then viewed evidence item #265, another 8mm videotape. Harris and Klebold began discussing possible secondary objectives to place bombs. Klebold then discusses a trail by Wadsworth, "by your old house." According to the in-house computer, Harris previously lived at 7844 South Teller Court. In the videotape, they discuss they should "rig something up with a trip bomb between two trees, so when someone goes down the path, it will go off." After hearing this information, I then contacted Detective Reker and asked him to also check that area. (See his report for details.)

Also mentioned is "The Blackjack Crew," and specifically Jason, Chris, Angel, Phil, and Bob. Klebold also mentions Brandon Larson in a threatening manner. They both discuss Klebold's double barrel shotgun and a Mr. Stevens in reference to the gun and that Mr. Stevens knew that Klebold was the one who was in fact buying the gun. Also mentioned in the video are "Morris and "Nate." In the video, evidence item #265, Harris and Klebold mention "Thanks to Mark John Doe and Phil John Doe," i reference to purchasing the guns. Again, they mentioned Green Mountain Guns, and again mentioned Mr. Stevens. Klebold and Harris discuss "Chris Pizza's house," and discuss in the same context that the "napalm better not freeze at that certain person's house." They also discuss someone by the name "Yoshi," again in a threatening manner. All of this information was provided to Sergeant Ken Ester at the Command Post.
