INVESTIGATION

ON THIS DATE I TELEPHONICALLY INTERVIEWED JULIA COLE, A STUDENT AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL. COLE REPORTED THAT SHE HAD NOT BEEN INTERVIEWED BY POLICE PRIOR TO THIS DATE, REGARDING THE CHS SHOOTING. COLE WAS AT SCHOOL IN MR. ANDRES CLASS AT THE TIME OF THE SHOOTING INCIDENT. SHE REPORTED THAT SHE WAS IN CHOIR CLASS, THEN WENT OUT TO GET A DRINK, SHE SAW MR. LONG, HE SAID, AS HE WAS RUNNING UP THE STAIRS, "SOMEBODY IS DOWNSTAIRS WITH A GUN." SHE WENT BACK INTO CHOIR CLASS, THEN BEGAN TO HEAR EXPLOSIONS. SHE AND HER FRIEND, SALLY MELBA RAN INTO THE AUDITORIUM, SHE SAW OTHER STUDENTS IN HALLS STAMPEDEING OUT OF SCHOOL TOO. COLE EXITED THE BUILDING THROUGH THE MAIN DOORS (NORTH OF AND BY TEACHERS LOT. SHE REPORTED THAT SHE SAW NONE OF THE INCIDENT, ONLY HEARD IT (NOISES WERE LOUD) SHE REPORTED SEEING BROKEN GLASS IN WINDOWS AS SHE RAN OUT OF THE SCHOOL. SHE RAN OVER TO CLEMENT PARK, SHE GATHERED WITH FRIENDS THEN RAN TO ELLICKA JENKINS HOUSE (BEHIND SCHOOL) AND WATCHED T.V. COLE DID NOT KNOW HARRIS OR KLEBAND, BUT HAD SEEN ON CAMPUS. SHE TOLD ME THAT ONCE "DYLAN" LAUGHED AT HER, BUT SHE DID NOT KNOW WHY.

We were in there for 2 1/2 hrs. 59 people in the same office. The police came in and we had used a phone to let the police know where we were. The police led us out.

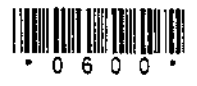

AT 1428 HRS I CONTACTED (W) COLTON BY PHONE FOR AN INTERVIEW. (W) COLTON SAID SHE WAS IN THE CHOIR CLASS ROOM WHEN SOMEONE (UNKNOWN) RAN IN AND SAID SOMEONE WITH A GUN IS DOWN STAIRS. ALMOST INSTANTLY SHE HEARD GUN FIRE AND OR BOMBS GOING OFF. SHE DUCKED UNDER A TABLE WITH CHAIRS AROUND IT. SHE WAS NEAR THE FRONT CLASS DOOR. SHE COULD SEE AND HEAR PEOPLE IN THE HALL RUNNING AND SCREAMING PAST THE DOOR. AS THE MASS OF PANICED PEOPLE MOVED FURTHER DOWN THE HALL (W) COLTON COULD HEAR THE GUN FIRE GETTING LOUDER AS THE GUNMEN WERE APPROXIMATELY CLOSER TO THE CHOIR ROOM DOOR. SO (W) COLTON GOT UP TO RUN TO THE CHOIR ROOM OFFICE. AS SHE GOT UP TO RUN SHE COULD SEE FLASHES OF LIGHT IN THE HALLWAY WHICH SHE THOUGHT WAS THE MUZZUS BLAST AS THE FLASHES COINCIDED WITH THE BANG NOISES IN THE HALLWAY.

ONCE INSIDE THE OFFICE THE DOOR WAS BARRICADED AND EVERYONE LAY ON THE FLOOR UNTIL ABOUT 1630 HRS (3 HRS LATER) WHEN THE DENVER SWAT TEAM RESCUED THEM. (W) COLTON SAID SHE KNEW (S) HARRIS FROM A CLASS BUT NEVER HEARD OF (S) KLARSON.

Conant said that he had no prior knowledge of the shooting and did not know who the Trench Coat Mafia was. Conant did not know Harris or Klebold.



**INVESTIGATION:**

On 06-16-99, I contacted Matt Cornwell by phone. I asked him to relay to me his observations of the events which occurred on 4-20-99 at Columbine High School. This supplement is connected to control #DN3647

Cornwell stated that he was in the choir room of Columbine High School on 4-20-99 when two students ran into the room saying that someone had a gun. He did not know the names of those students. This teacher was Mr. Andres, Sr. Mr. Andres stated that the students should sit down and that everything would be okay. Just after that, numerous students were seen running down the south hallway and a big explosion was heard. Half of the students in the choir room left the choir room and half of them stayed.

Cornwell stated that most of the girls in the class "froze." He tried to get them to leave, but they wouldn't move. He then began putting the girls into Mr. Andres, Sr.'s office, which is connected to the choir room. Cornwell then looked out the choir room door into the south hallway. Cornwell stated that this door is located near the stairway which comes up from the commons area.

Cornwell looked into the south hallway and towards the west. There he saw a male teacher, who had blood on him, running. He could not describe the teacher to me. He stated the teacher had either come from the stairway or from the hall which runs in front of the library. Cornwell could not tell me where that teacher went. Cornwell stated that after he saw the teacher who had blood on him, he saw the barrel of a gun, which appeared to be coming from either the stairway or from the hallway which

runs in front of the library. He did not see who was holding the gun. He did not know the type of gun, but stated that the gun was long.

He then saw three teachers hiding behind pillars. I asked him for the names of those teachers. He stated Ms. Miller, Mr. Will, and Mr. Friesen. He stated the teachers yelled to him to get down. He then quickly pulled his head back into the choir room and shut the door. He joined the other students in Mr. Andres' Office. Cornwell stated he heard gunshots and explosions for about an hour. He never saw a suspect, he never heard any voices that he could associate with suspects. He remained in Mr. Andres' office for several hours until the SWAT team came to rescue them.

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**INVESTIGATION:**

On this date I telephonically interviewed Kendra Curry. Curry had not been interviewed prior to this date. Curry was at school and in Mr. Andres choir class when the shooting took place. She told me that while she was in class a student by the name, Brandon Reisbeck came running into the room and told Mr. Andres that someone had a gun and was shooting downstairs. She and other students did not react at first because they thought it was a senior prank. Within seconds she began to hear shots fired. She hid on the floor for a short while until Mr. Andres said to get out. Then Curry heard Ms. Miller yelling at students. She didn't hear what Miller was saying, but she sensed it was something serious.

She then went into the choir room office and hid with 60 other students. She told me that she knew there were 60 because the students counted. One of the students said, while in the office, "It's a good thing Ms. Miller told us somebody was shooting or somebody had a gun."

While she and the 59 other students were in the room, they made calls to their parents and to the police. Curry said that several attempts were made to call 911 with negative contact.

The Denver Police Department SWAT team rescued them after being in the room for several hours. The police escorted her and her classmates out of the school. They exited through the West Side of the Commons and then ran down the cement stairs. She said that she saw two bodies laying on the ground near the stairs, one who she identified as Rachel Scott. She was not



sure who the other person was. She was then taxied over to Clement Park via police vehicle and then bussed to Leawood Elementary. Curry did not see any of the shooting, she only heard it. She reported to not knowing either of the suspects and denied to having prior knowledge of the shooting.

On 081399 I interviewed Bobby Lee Dartt via telephone. The police prior to the date had not interviewed Dartt. Dartt was in school on the 20<sup>th</sup> of April and in Mr. Andes choir classroom, when the shooting incident began. Dartt reported that after class had been in session for about ten minutes a student ran into the class and told the teachers that somebody had a gun downstairs. He also could see students running of the school from the door window. He reported to hearing loud noises. Dartt ran out of the auditorium and then out of the front doors and headed to Clement Park. He then went to Laura Houses house and watched television. His mom at Laura's house picked him up. Dartt reported that he saw no shooting or shooters and did not see anything unusual on the 20<sup>th</sup>. He did not remember being in the cafeteria on that day.

ABOUT 1100 HRS I SPOKE TO (W) DUBOIS ON THE PHONE TO CONDUCT AN INTERVIEW. (W) DUBOIS SAID SHE WAS IN THE CHOIR CLASS ROOM WHEN SOMEONE (ANOTHER STUDENT) RAN INTO THE ROOM AND SAID THERE'S A GUY DOWNSTAIRS SHOOTING PEOPLE THEN (W) DUBOIS HEARD REPETITIVE GUN FIRE SHE SAID TO HER THE GUNSHOT PATTERN WAS CONSISTANT AS A HEART BEAT. EVERY SO OFTEN THE BUILDING SHOOK POSSIBLY DUE TO BOMBS EXPLODING. EVERYONE GOT DOWN ON THE FLOOR UNTIL THE SHOTS BRIEFLY STOPPED THEN THEY RAN INTO THE CHOIR OFFICE. ONCE IN THE OFFICE THE DOOR WAS BARRICADED WITH DESKS & FILE CABINETS. SOMEONE TRIED TO CALL 911 ON A CELL PHONE BUT COULD NOT GET THROUGH DUE TO JAMMED LINES. (W) DUBOIS SAID SHE KEPT LOOKING AT HER WATCH AND SAID THE SHOOTING STARTED ABOUT 1135 HRS AND THE LAST SHOTS SHE HEARD WERE ABOUT 1205 HRS. ABOUT 1515 HRS THE SWAT TEAM ARRIVED AND LEAD THEM OUT OF THE SCHOOL BY GOING THROUGH & OUT OF AN AUDITORIUM DOOR THEN THROUGH THE COMMONS AND OUT OF THE SCHOOL. (W) DUBOIS NEVER SAW OR HEARD THE SHOOTERS. SHE KNEW BOTH OF THEM IN MIDDLE SCHOOL AND THE LAST TIME SHE EVER SAW THEM WAS 1<sup>ST</sup> SEMESTER OF HER JR YEAR WHICH WOULD HAVE BEEN IN 1998. SHE ALSO SAID SHE NEVER SAW OR HEARD ANYONE MAKING FUN OF THE SUSPECTS.

Tammy said that Anthony did not see the shooters, he just heard shots being fired. Anthony knew Eric Harris; he had been in Junior high school classes with him. He did not know Dylan Klebold.

Tammy told me that her son did not have prior knowledge of this incident.

This investigator met with Adam for a follow-up interview.

Adam was asked to start with his 4th. hour and go forward from there.

Adam stated his 4th., hour is spent in the Library because it is an off hour and he usually sits in the stuffed chairs in the SE corner of the library. He stated he did this routine on 4-20-99 as well.

When the 11:10 A.M., bell rang, Adam stated he walked to his 5th., hour class which is in the choir room next to the auditorium. Once in this class, Mr. Andres (senior) took class roll. Adam stated after roll he left the classroom to get a drink of water in the Math/Science hallway. Then he went back to class and joined the 1st., tenors.

A short time later Brandon Reisbeck came back into the classroom and yelled; "Someone's down there shooting." Mr. Andres immediately told everyone to shut-up according to Adam.

Adam stated the classroom door closest to the stairway opened, and he heard three shotgun blasts that sounded like it came from the

cafeteria area. Adam stated one of the blasts may have been an explosion but two were for sure a shotgun.

At this time Adam stated students began exiting the classroom going left to the hallway behind the stage and into the auditorium. Adam thinks half the class left that way.

Adam stated he went to the door near the stairway and looked out to see Ms. Theresa Miller yelling to people to get back, stay down.

Adam stated he then saw Mr. Sanders come up the stairs, bleeding. Adam stated Ms. Miller and Mr. Sanders were closest to the science hall. Adam stated he was about 3' from the stairs and he saw the barrel of a shotgun. He thinks it was a single barrel.

Adam continued by saying at this time the gun fired at Mr. Sanders. Mr. Sanders stepped in front of Ms. Miller just before the shot.

Adam stated he looked at Mr. Sanders and something impacted him. Ms. Miller told Adam to get back in at this time.

Adam stated he told everyone to get into the choir room office.

Adam yelled at Jake Crow and Matt (Scott) Cornwell to grab people, because they weren't moving. Adam stated it was like a "sandbag" line and they pushed students into the room. After everyone was in the office, Adam stated they looked out into the choir room to make sure no one was left in the room.

At this time Adam stated the choir room was empty so they barricaded the office door with a large filing cabinet. They then turned off the lights and held the cabinet against the door.

Adam continued by saying the first hour was rough and they had to calm the other kids down. Adam stated everyone was in this office for about three to three and a half hours. Then SWAT came and they un-barricaded the door and exited the school. Adam stated they all

saw the bodies on the outside of the school when they exited with SWAT.

Adam remembered that while in the office they talked to a police officer on the phone and he gave them his pager phone number to call whenever they needed to talk to him. Adam stated they wrote the phone number on the office wall with a pen. He couldn't remember the officer's name or the pager phone number at this time.

Adam was asked if he could describe the person holding the shotgun? Adam stated he could only see camouflage pants and high black boots.

Adam stated he left his backpack in the choir room. He described it as dirty blue containing papers with his name on it. He also stated he left a travel bag "New West", brand in the choir robe area. This bag contained Adam's black shoes, size 13-14 and his dress pants and shirt. He stated the travel bag is blue.

This is all Adam had to say at this time. He then left for a senior picnic.

- Todd heard 7 "heavy" shots.
- The lights in the office were off.
- Todd was able to feel and hear the shots in the school.

This was a cursory interview with Todd right after he was rescued.

On 08-12-99, at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to 5900 West Plymouth Drive to contact and interview witness Joanna Christine Gates, who is a student at Columbine High School. This interview was in reference to the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Joanna Gates said on 04-20-99, she rode to Columbine High School with a friend of hers by the name of Beth Klepper (303-979-2637). She said that Beth Klepper drove a small blue vehicle to school. Joanna Gates said they arrived at Columbine High School on 04-20-99 at about 0720 hours and she said Beth parked her vehicle in the senior parking lot, just south of the school. Joanna Gates did not know what parking space number this was, however, she said Beth parked in a place that is close to the school. Joanna Gates said she entered Columbine High School through the door, located across from the "Rebel Corner" and

said this door leads into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Joanna Gates said she did not observe anything out of the ordinary in the parking lot or inside of the school between the time of her arrival and her fifth hour class. Joanna Gates said she did not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the cafeteria area or commons area when she arrived and entered the school. She said she walked from the door across from the "Rebel Corner," to the bottom of the stairway, then went up the stairway to the upper level of the school. I showed Joanna Gates the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered inside the Columbine High School cafeteria. She said she did not see either of these items or any items of a similar description. Joanna Gates said when she got to the top of the stairway, she turned to her left, to go to her first hour class that started at 0730 hours on 04-20-99. Joanna could not remember what her first class was. She said her second hour class was Language Arts. Her third hour class was Math and said her fourth hour class was World History. Joanna said after her fourth hour World History class, she went to her fifth hour Choir class and arrived at approximately 1114 hours. Joanna said when the Choir class began, the students were warming up and singing, and said the teacher, Mr. Andres, was talking. She said all of a sudden she saw people running in the hallways outside of her classroom. Joanna said she thought all of this activity was part of a senior prank. Joanna said that she then heard an explosion, and said she thought it came from a Science room across the hall from her classroom. She said the hallways became more crowded with running people and then a student by the name of Brandon Reisbeck came running into the Choir classroom and (she believed he had gone downstairs to use a restroom) told Mr. Andres that someone was shooting people downstairs. Joanna said Mr. Andres did not know what to do, so he told everyone in the classroom to stay put inside of this classroom. Joanna said she also heard another explosion that was not as loud as the other explosion she had heard earlier. Joanna said she heard approximately thirty or forty gunshots that began in the cafeteria and as they progressed, it sounded like to Joanna they were being shot closer and closer to the Choir room she was inside of. Joanna said some female students ran into her classroom and said about twenty to thirty students including her, then ran out of the Choir room and into the auditorium where Mr. Andres told them to duck down. She said she then ran out of a side door of the auditorium and into a hallway, then exited the school by running out of the main doors on the east side of the school by the administrative offices. She said she then ran through the teacher's parking lot and into Clement Park. Joanna said she got a ride from a student by the name of Kevin Koeniger from Clement Park, as did several other students.

have seen one of the suspects when she was in the Choir room, however she then told me that she did not believe that she had seen any of them. Joanna said while she was in the Choir room, she remembered that when she looked out of the room, she saw a white male in black clothing. I asked if her if this male was wearing a trench coat and she did not know. She was asked if she had seen this subject with an explosive device or firearm, and she said no. Joanna said she did not know why she believed this male subject may have possibly been a suspect in the shootings.

Joanna Gates said she attended the 1999 Columbine High School prom, and also attended the after prom party that was held at Columbine High School, however, she said she did not see Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris at either location. When I asked Joanna if she had heard any information about other suspects whom may have been involved in the shooting, she told me that a female student by the name of Lacy Smith had told she had seen [REDACTED] shooting people at Columbine High School. Joanna told me that she was not in the Columbine High School cafeteria on 04-20-99 at all except when she first arrived on 04-20-99 and entered the school across from the "Rebel Corner" and then went directly up the stairway and into her classes.

I asked Joanna Gates what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students, and in particular, what she knew about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Joanna said she did not know the name of Dylan Klebold prior to the shooting on 04-20-99, but she knew of Eric Harris by name only. She said she only knew of the Trench Coat Mafia as a select group of students who wore trench coats. She could not provide any further information about the Trench Coat Mafia or their associates

Joanna Gates said she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors of anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, selling or buying firearms.

I asked Joanna Gates if she had seen the 'Thought of the Day' on the Rebel News Network (RNN) on 04-20-99. Joanna said she had seen it, and remembered it to be something to the effect of "You wished you weren't here today." Joanna also said on 04-17-99, the Thought of the Day read something to the effect of "It's coming" and someone had put a line through the 04-17 and put 04-20 next to it.

On 08-09-99, at approximately 1200 hours, I responded to 7689 West Frost Drive to contact and interview witness Pamela Elaine Glazner, who is a graduated student of Columbine High School. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. During this interview, Pamela's mother, Jan Glazner, was also present.

Pamela Glazner said that on 04-20-99, she drove her vehicle (a black Honda Civic) to Columbine High School, arriving at approximately 0645 hours. She said she parked her vehicle in Columbine High School parking space #69, which is located in the Seniors' Parking Lot. Pamela said she then entered Columbine High School through the doors on the lower level that are across from the "Rebel Corner" that leads into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Pamela said she then walked from this door that she had entered and went along the east side of the cafeteria/commons area. Pamela said she then

went up the stairway to the upper level of the school, and then into her Bells class in the Choir room. I showed Pamela photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the cafeteria area of Columbine High School. Pamela said she did not recall seeing either item in the cafeteria nor did she recall seeing either one of these items or similar items being carried by anybody at Columbine High School prior to the shooting. Pamela said she did not recall seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the cafeteria/commons area or anywhere else inside or outside of Columbine High School on 04-20-99. She said when she was walking to her Bells class, she turned to her left at the top of the stairway, which would take her in the opposite direction of the library. Pamela said the Bells class she went to lasted from 0645 hours to 0725 hours. This class is considered a "0" classroom hour and is in addition to her other classes. Pamela said when she got out of this class, she went to her scheduled first hour class, which was Trigonometry, located on the upper level of the school in the south east corner. She said this class lasted from 0730 hours to 0820 hours. Pamela said after Trigonometry, she went to her second hour class which was AP English class on the upper level of the school and was from 0825 hours to 0920. Pamela said the second hour class lasted five minutes longer than the other classes because the Rebel News Network (RNN) is broadcasted during this second hour. However, Pamela said she did not see the "Thought of the Day" for 04-20-99 on the Rebel News Network because the TV was not on. After second hour class, Pamela said she went to her third hour Psychology class that is also located on the upper level of the school and she said this class lasted from 0925 hours to 1015 hours. Next Pamela said she went to her Newspaper class from 1020 hours to 1110 hours, and also was on the upper level of Columbine High School. Pamela said after this Newspaper class, she went to her Choir class on the upper level of the school. The teacher, according to Pamela, is Mr. Andres, Sr. Pamela said when she got to the Choir class, she was in the classroom talking about concerts and said two students by the names of Andy Anderson and Brandon Reisbeck exited the classroom into the hallway, which they are allowed to do at the beginning of this class. Pamela said Anderson and Reisbeck were gone for approximately two minutes and then came running back into the classroom and were scared. When Anderson and Reisbeck re-entered the classroom, they said there were gunmen shooting inside of Columbine High School. At this point, Pamela said she heard two gunshots that sounded like to her were coming from downstairs in the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Pamela said she got up and ran out of the classroom through the east side doors and into the hallway outside of the Choir room. Pamela said when she got out of Choir room and into the hallway, she turned to her left and ran into the auditorium. Pamela said she then ran out of the auditorium, ran down the hallway eastbound, and then exited Columbine High School by running out of the school's main doors on the east side of the school by the administrative offices. Pamela said as she was running toward the main doors to exit

Columbine High School, either a door window, or another window suddenly shattered in front of her. Pamela said she did not hear a gunshot at that time, but she believes a bullet shattered the glass. Pamela said she did not remember if the shattered glass was in a door or was one of the other windows. She said after exiting Columbine High School, she ran into to the Teacher's Parking Lot (on the east side of Columbine High School) and said then somebody told her to keep running farther away from Columbine High School and she ran into Clement Park. Pamela said when she stopped running in Clement Park, somebody else told her to keep running, so she ran into the students' parking lot inside of Clement Park. Pamela said next she went to the library, located at West Bowles Avenue and Long Drive. She said she was unable to get in contact with her parents, so she called her boyfriend's (Brad Jackson) mother, Liz Jackson, who took her to the residence at 5355 Yellowstone Street in Bow Mar.

I asked Pamela Glazner what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and particularly Dyla Klebold and Eric Harris. Pamela said she had Dylan Klebold in a French class in the seventh grade when they both attended Ken Caryl Middle School together. Pamela said she did not remember anything about Dylan Klebold and had not seen him since the seventh grade. Pamela said in her junior year at Columbine High School (1997-1998 school year) she had Eric Harris in her History class. Pamela said she remembered Eric Harris was nice to her. She also said that time Eric Harris would wear white t-shirts and she did not remember seeing him wear a trench coat at that time. She had no other information and had no dealings with Eric Harris since this History class.

I asked Pamela Glazner what information she could provide about any of the other Trench Coat Mafia students. She said that during the first semester of 1999 at Columbine High School, she had Robert Perry in her AP English class. She said that Robert Perry would always wear black jeans, black t-shirts and a black trench coat. She said the trench coat was not made out of leather, and told me "it was not shiny." She said she did not see anybody picking on or harassing Robert Perry although the other students would not pay attention to him or associate with him. Pamela said during this first semester, Perry went to this class and then sometime during the semester, Perry did not return or attend the class any further.

Pamela Glazner said in her junior year at Columbine High School she had Robyn Anderson in a History class at Columbine High School. Pamela said she did not know anything about her, however, Pamela said during the prom for Columbine High School in 1999, just prior to the shooting, she saw Robyn Anderson at the prom with Dylan Klebold. Pamela said she attended the after prom party that was at Columbine High School, but said she did not see Robyn Anderson, Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris that she could recall. Pamela's mother, Jan Glazner said that she, along with several other parents worked the after prom party just prior to the shooting at Columbine High School. Jan Glazner advised that she did not know Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris or any of the Trench Coat Mafia students and therefore did not know if they were at this party or not.

I asked Pamela Glazner if she knew Isaiah Shoels. She said she did not know him, however, she had seen him in the hallways of the school. Pamela said she never saw Isaiah Shoels be the victim of any racial harassment or racial intimidation. She said it appeared to her that Isaiah Shoels was well liked at Columbine High School. She said in good nature, other students would tease Isaiah Shoels because he was short in stature, however, she never heard any racial type of remarks made to him.

Pamela Glazner said on 04-20-99 when she ran out of Columbine High School, she left her navy blue "Eddie Bauer" backpack and its contents inside of the Choir room. She said she has since gotten her backpack and its contents back from the school

Pamela Glazner said she has not heard any information or rumors about anybody who may have been involved with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris in the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. She also told me she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors about anybody, who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, selling, or buying firearms.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** Pamela Glazner said a friend of hers by the name of Lindsey Connell (who will be a senior at Columbine High School during the 1999-2000 school year) told her she saw one of the gunmen in a trench coat in the south east area of Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Pamela said she did not know if Lindsey Connell had been interviewed yet by law enforcement.



On 5/20/99 I interviewed 17 year old CHS student Adam Hancey over the telephone. Adam stated that he was in Mr Andres Choir room on 4/20/99 at 11:15am for class. Around 11:20am he saw some students running in the hallway, apparently coming from the cafeteria. He did not hear any gunfire type noises, and was not aware of what was going on. A fellow student, Brandon Risebach was out in the hall getting a drink. Brandon came running into the choir room and said that someone had a gun. Immediately after this, Adam heard a shotgun noise in the south hallway, near the cafeteria steps. He did not see anyone shooting a gun. Adam was clear about the shotgun noise, as he has shot a shotgun with his father, who hunts.

Some students ran out of the class, but most stayed in the choir room. He and about 60 students ran into the choir room office and barricaded the door with a file cabinet and desk. The room was equipped with a phone. Several students called parents and gave their location, which was passed on to SWAT. Adam stated while they waited in this office, they heard muffled voices outside, but could not make out what they were saying. He believed it was 2 separate voices. The group remained hidden and would not look out. They had covered the window of the office door with shirts.

About 3 hours later SWAT identified themselves, and escorted the group out of the building through the auditorium, then out by the teacher's lounge in the cafeteria. Adam recalled seeing 2 bodies laying on the ground outside. Adam left his backpack in the choir room.

At no time did Adam see a gunman, nor did he see anyone carrying a large dark duffle bag in the school. He had no further information on the shootings. He did state that fellow student Adam Foss, also in the choir room office saw the barrel of a gun prior to getting into the office.

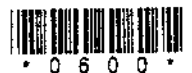

Reisbeck) came into the choir room and announced that there was "a kid downstairs with a gun". At that point Houck heard 3 gunshots coming from inside the school. One of the choir room doors opened and Houck heard an explosion or a very close gunshot. Houck went out the door of the choir room to the main hallway and saw Mr. Sanders on all fours bleeding in the hallway. Houck then ran into the auditorium and heard about 9 rapid gunshots possibly coming from the hallway or library. Houck left the auditorium and went into the main East/West hallway and ran to the front doors then ran outside. Upon arrival to the front doors Houck saw that the glass in the doors had already been broken out. Houck did not see or hear anything else.

Houck further told me that he knew Klebold from elementary school and had Harris in his German and Government -Economics classes but never really spoke with either.

On April 29, 1999 at 1628 hours I interviewed Aaron Jensen at his home after I had just interviewed his brother, Jared. Mr. Dan Jensen was present. Aaron the told me the following:

- \* He is a senior at Columbine High.
- \* When asked about Eric Harris, he said he does not know Eric by name but has seen him around school. He has never talked with Eric. He did say that Eric seemed like a quite student.
- \* When asked about Dylan Klebold, he said he has never seen him in school. He did not know [REDACTED]

\* He did have [REDACTED] in a math class last year. He said that [REDACTED] was a smart student. He said [REDACTED] always wore a green beret and trench coat.

\* When asked if he knew the official name, "Trench Coat Mafia" for the students who wore them he replied, "Oh, yeah." He does not know the names of the other students who wear the trench coats.

\* He did not see Eric, Dylan, [REDACTED] or any other trench coat student in school the day of the shooting.

\* He saw no suspicious objects, backpacks, or duffle bags at school or in the cafeteria that day.

\* He was in his choir class for 5th hour that runs along the same time as the A-lunch hour. He said the class has 105 students in it. He said that a choir student named Brandon Riesbiek ran into the choir room from the bathroom area of the cafeteria and reported, "Someone in commons has a gun."


\* The choir teacher, the older Mr. Andres, told the class to calm down. He then heard two or three gunshots that sounded like they were coming from the commons. He then heard another gunshot. He and several others then ran out of the class and east down the hallway to the door for the top of the auditorium. He went through the back of the auditorium to the main hall and then out the school via the main doors.


\* He said it only took about a minute from the time the class was first alerted to the time he reached the main front doors. He said when he got to the doors, they already had bullet holes in them and glass was falling.

\* He did not hear any shots while in the auditorium but heard some shots behind him while running out the front doors.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 09-16-99, at approximately 1800 hours, I responded to 5310 South Broadway Circle, Building 6, Apartment 301, to contact and interview witness Veronica Marie Jones. Veronica is a graduated student from Columbine High School. The purpose for this interview was in reference to the shootings that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Veronica Jones advised me on 04-20-99, at approximately 0715 hours, she arrived at Columbine High School for her scheduled classes. Veronica said that she arrived in her vehicle, which is a gray Pontiac Grand AM, Colorado license HGN906. Veronica said that she parked this vehicle in the senior parking lot, space #29. Veronica said as she parked her vehicle, exited her vehicle, and walked towards the school, she did not see anything out of the ordinary or unusual. She said she does not recall seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students outside of Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Veronica said she entered Columbine High School through the door that is across from the "Rebel Corner," which is on the south side of the Cafeteria/commons area on the east side. Veronica said she proceeded to walk through the commons area and up the stairway from the lower level of the school to the upper level. Veronica said at the top of the stairs, she spent some time talking with her friends before going to her first hour class. Veronica could not remember which class she had during first hour, however, she said she did go to her first hour class that began at 0730 hours on 04-20-99. Veronica said after going to her first hour class, she went to her second and third hour classes, however, she said she did not go to her fourth hour class. Veronica said during fourth hour class time.

she went downstairs to the bottom level of the stairway and sat at a table, which she said is directly to the west of the "Rebel Corner" and south of the stairway. This table would also be at the far east side of the cafeteria in the commons area. Veronica told me that while she was in the area of the "Rebel Corner," she said she did not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students or their associates, nor did she see anything unusual or out of the ordinary. I showed Veronica the photographs of the duffle bag and a propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Veronica told me she did not see either one of these items on 04-20-99 in the cafeteria, nor did she see anyone carrying any items of a similar description. I showed Veronica the diagram of the Columbine High School cafeteria. Veronica showed me on this diagram where she had sat during fourth hour on 04-20-99, however, the table that she sat at was not included in the drawing, according to her. The location of the table Veronica sat at was drawn into the diagram for later reference. Veronica said after fourth class had ended, she walked to her Concert Choir Class on the upper level of the school. Veronica said she recalled that she was approximately one minute late to this class, and said when she got into the class the students and the teachers were talking. Veronica said after they were talking the students began to warmup, and she said suddenly two other students by the name of Brandon Reisbeck and a female student named Katie (unknown last name) came running into the choir classroom screaming that there was somebody in the school shooting people. Veronica said she could hear people screaming and running in the hallways outside of the choir classroom. She said that the doors from the interior of the classroom to the hallways were closed, however. Veronica said at about this same time, on 04-20-99, she heard approximately three shots that she said she believed were gunshots. I asked Veronica if she had ever shot a firearm or if she had ever been present while a firearm had been discharged, however, she said she had not. I asked Veronica to describe how these shots sounded to her, and she described them as sounding like "pops." Veronica said after hearing these three pops, she heard additional running and screaming in the hallway. Veronica said that the teacher in her choir class by the name of Mr. Andres told the students to calm down, and then told them all to run out of the choir classroom and into the auditorium, which she did. Veronica said approximately half of the choir class students ran into an office and hid next to the choir room, and the other half of the students ran from the Concert Choir room and into the auditorium when Mr. Andres told him to do so. Veronica told me that once in the auditorium, she remained inside for approximately 20 to 30 minutes, trying to hide. Veronica said while she was in the auditorium, she heard what she described as a "big boom" and now believed that this boom was caused by one of the suspects pipe bombs being detonated. Veronica said after the 20 to 30 minutes she ran with other students out of the auditorium and began to run down the main hallway, however, she said she heard two more shots and she therefore turned around and ran back down the hallway

and into the auditorium. She said that after going back into the auditorium she laid down on the floor. Veronica said a short time later one of the Columbine High School janitors entered the auditorium and told everybody to stay down. Veronica said when she got up off of the floor she ran out of the auditorium and then said she exited Columbine High School by going out of the doors on the lower level of the school, which are the doors from the Spanish room. Veronica said she then ran across the student parking lot, southbound on South Pierce Street to West Polk, where she went into the residence on the northwest corner of South Pierce and West Polk. This residence is also a seminary house.

I asked Veronica Jones what information she could provide to me about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students, and in particular what information she could provide to me in reference to Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Veronica said that she did not know anything about Eric Harris, but said that she had Dylan Klebold in one of her classes during the first semester. Veronica said this class was a Composition College Bound class that she was in with Dylan. She also said that Robyn Anderson was a student in this same class. Veronica described Dylan Klebold as being nice to her and said that she did remember that Dylan Klebold wore a trench coat made of an unknown type fabric that hung down to approximately the mid calf length. She said that this coat was black in color. Veronica said that as far as Robyn Anderson goes, she could only say that Robyn did not wear a trench coat, but wore baggy clothing. Veronica said that she did not get along with Robyn Anderson, and said they fought, verbally, all the time. Veronica said that she knew who Tad Boles was because he was in her Concert Choir class, however, she said she cannot remember if Tad Boles was in the choir class on 04-20-99 or not. She said another student that she knew who she believed was an associate of the Trench Coat Mafia students was a student by the name of Patrick McDuffy. Veronica said she knew nothing about Patrick Duffy, other than to tell me that she did not remember him wearing a trench coat.

I asked Veronica Jones if she had heard anything about any other suspects who may have been involved with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris during the shooting on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School. Veronica said she believed there had to be a third person involved, and said she has heard from friends that a student was involved with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris who was wearing a white T-shirt. Veronica said, however, she had not heard the name of this student. I asked Veronica if she has heard any rumors about anyone else who may be possibly manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, selling, or buying firearms. Veronica told me she has not heard of any rumors of this type.

I asked Veronica Jones if she knew what the Rebel News Network (RNN) is, and if she knew what the "thought of the day" was that had broadcasted over the Rebel News Network on 04-20-99. Veronica said she did know what the "thought of the day" was even though she watched it during second hour on 04-20-99. She said she did not recall what this "thought of the day" was. Veronica said she did not recall the "thought of the day" being anything unusual or strange, as compared to what is broadcasted on other school days.

When I arrived at Veronica Jones' residence on 09-16-99, she handed me a report that Dyan Klebold had written for school and this report is dated 11-03-98, during L.A., period 6. Veronica said she had just found this report as she was moving into the apartment and said she forgot she had it. Veronica gave me this report, and I later submitted it into the JCSO Evidence Vault. Veronica said the reason she had this report was because different students had to exchange reports to be corrected. It should be noted that the name of the report that Dyan Klebold had submitted on 11-03-98 was titled "The Mind and Motives of Charles Manson."

Veronica Jones advised me that during the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, she did not at any time see any of the suspects/gunman, nor did she see anyone with an explosive device.

I asked Veronica Jones if she had seen the jocks or any other persons harass or try to intimidate the Trench Coat Mafia students. Veronica told me that the jocks were picking on people on a regular basis and would line up across the hall, one next to the other, forcing students to have to go all the way around down another hallway to get around them. Veronica said that one of the graduated "jocks" by the name of Rocky Hoffsnyder was "mean to everybody," although Veronica said that Rocky was nice to her. Veronica said that she knew Isaiah Shoels and said in fact she went to Isaiah's funeral. I asked Veronica if she had seen anyone racially intimidate or harass Isaiah Shoels because of his race. She said no, that everybody liked Isaiah Shoels and they would tease him because he was short in stature, but that they all liked him. She said she did not see any racial harassment or intimidation towards Isaiah.

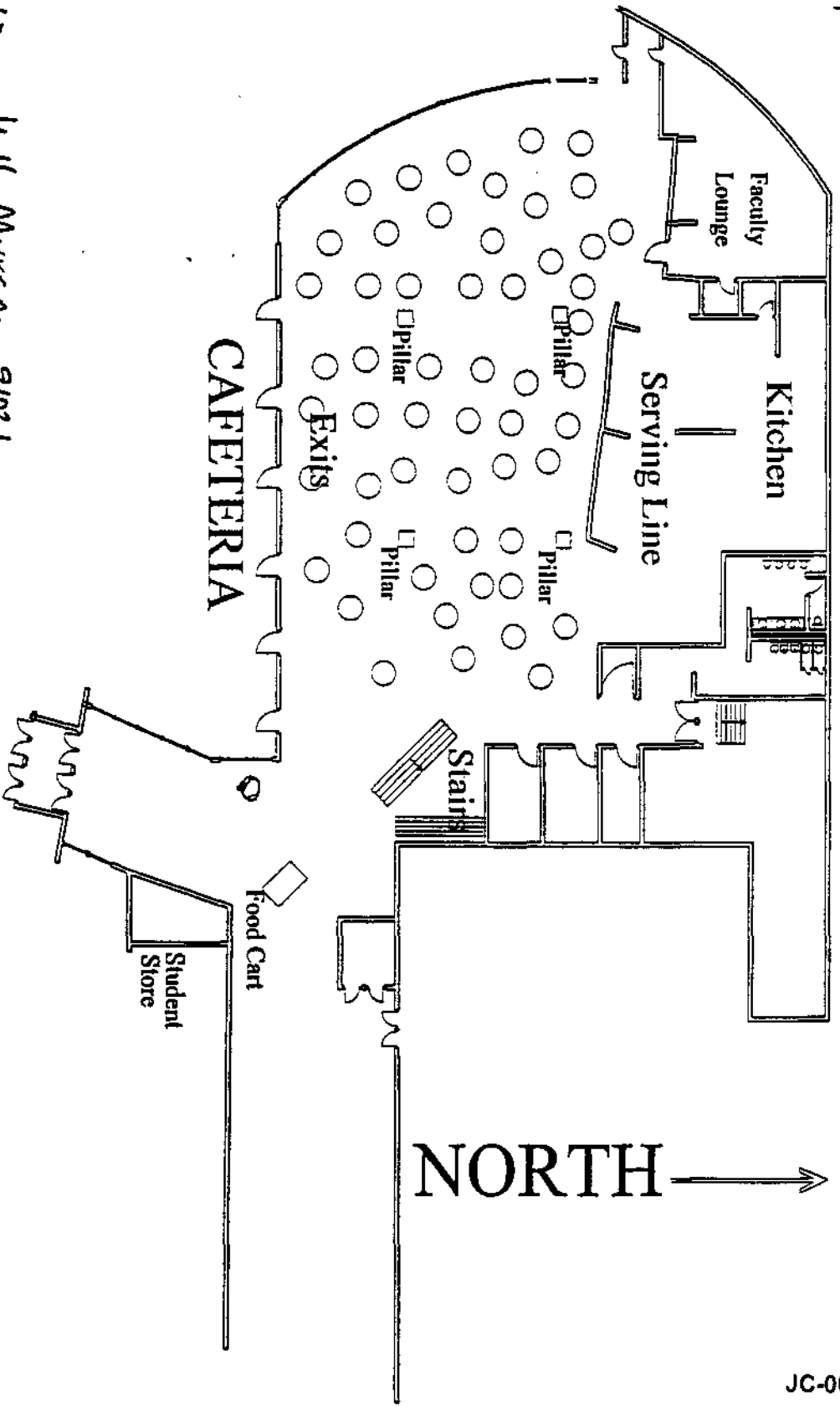

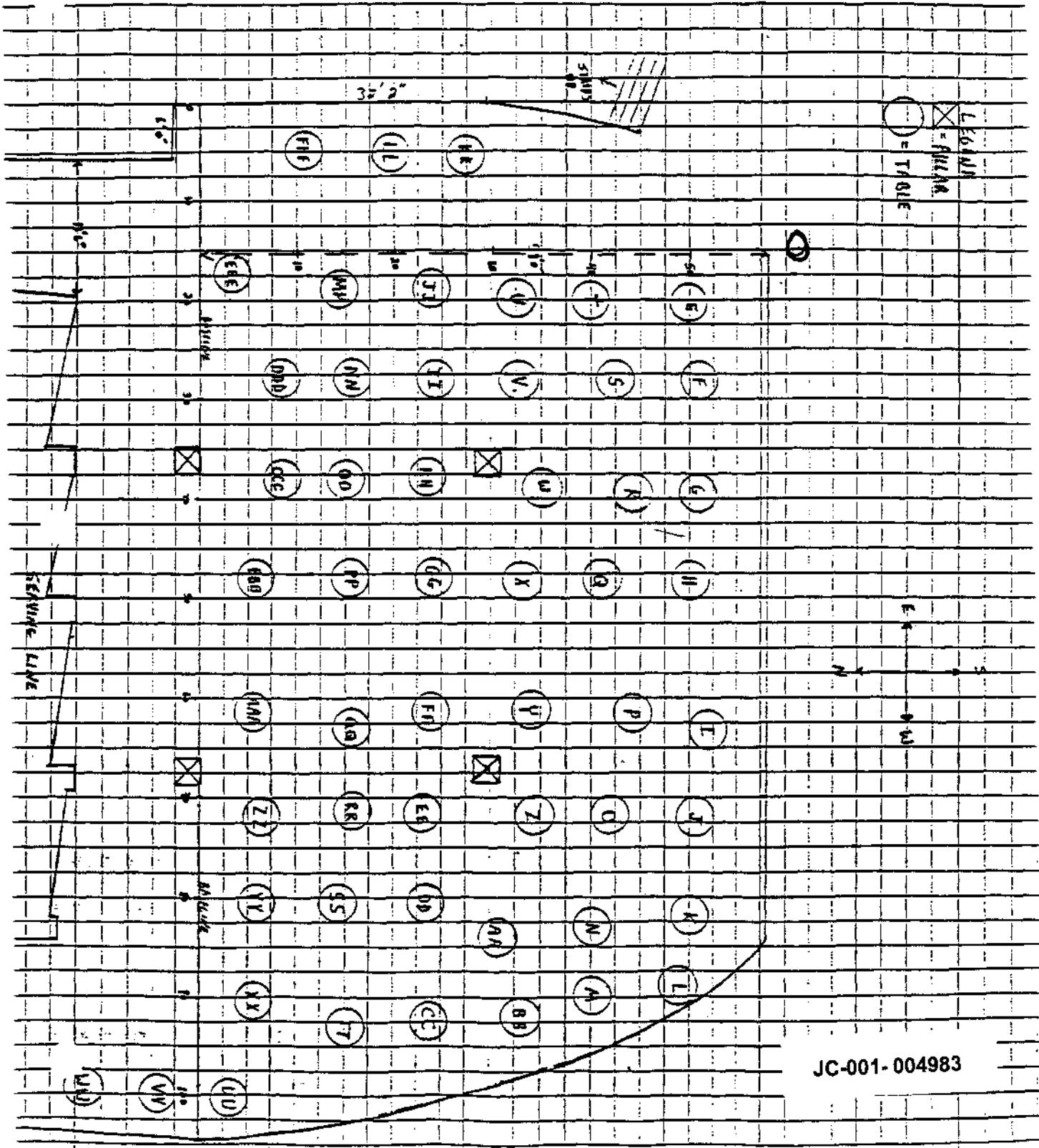

## The Mind and Motives of Charles Manson

Dylan Klebold

In 1994, Oliver Stone directed a film, using a Quentin Tarantino-written script about a pair of lover serial killers, (partially using the "Bonnie and Clyde" theme) entitled "Natural Born Killers." This film portrayed the main two characters who, at the point between innocent teen-ager and experienced adult, defy society, and get lost in their own little world, killing, and robbing whoever they come across. Although still on Earth, they live by their own morals, beliefs, and at the end of the film, expose the media and the law for its flaws. The truth to this movie is that it was not made to reproduce the Bonnie and Clyde theme, but it was almost an exact parallel to one man, with similar experiences in the late nineteen-sixties; Charles Manson. Oliver Stone stated later, in an interview related to the movie "The idea was that he would become more like Charlie Manson " (describing an interview with Mickey Knox, the serial killer in Natural Born Killers ) The parallels from the film to the most stunning murders in the sixties can be seen from the similarities in the interviews between Manson and Knox, to the setting and time period. The point being that the movie was later considered one of the most daring movies of all time, thus just scraping the surface of the severity of the story behind Charles Manson and his so-called "family "

Charles Manson was born near 1935 to an unknown father, and a prostitute. Not much is known about his past, just abstract things. Manson went to a foster home at age three, and his mother later was arrested for robbery. From then to the age of eighteen and

past, he was moved around from foster home to foster home, juvenile prison to juvenile prison. His prison record included two counts of forgery, two counts of mail theft, check forgery, probation violation, pimping, and GTA. It was around this time in his life that he met the early members in his family

Patricia Krenwinkle was an average girl growing up in the suburbs. She got average grades, and sang in her school's glee club. She had one sister, a mother, and their father was an insurance agent. At age eighteen, she was a secretary, and had just joined the hippie movement. She met Charles Manson at a party at the house of her sister's friend. He was playing an original, yet sad song on his guitar. She was drawn to him by his karma, mood, and attitude, which led to their sleeping together that same night. He inticed her, by words of love and happiness, to an extent that she was happy whenever he was around, and never wanted to leave him. Two days after meeting him, they, with others, left for San Francisco

Leslie Van Houten had a similar upbringing. She was a suburbanite, who sang in a church choir, and was later the homecoming princess at her high school. Other than the fact that her father left the family when she was young, she had an uneventful early life. At her late teenage years, she wanted more than normal girls had at that time. She heard about Manson, how he had the answers, and how closely he portrayed christ. She too met him, and fell into what might not be called "love", but possibly an obsession, with him and with the happiness that he appeared to bring with him. With Manson she later explained her actions "I followed him because I anticipated a positive change "

Others like Krenwinkle and Van Houten had gotten word of Manson's unearthly

beliefs and prophecies. Charles "Tex" Watson, once an All-American high school athlete, later became Manson's biggest believer. Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme, whose father was an Aeronautical Engineer, was also a follower, and later was the acting head of the family when Manson was not around. These people, and dozens others followed Manson out West, first to San Francisco, and then further South, winding up at a place called Spahn Ranch.

Charles Manson would later have a "family" of these followers, who literally did whatever he asked. They found happiness in his and each other's presence. It was mainly a piece of the hippie movement, a way to stray from the norm and live opposite of what one was raised to learn. The structure was simple; he was the leader, the christ, the martyr of the group, and they listened to and did what he said. This type of control, however innocent the motives, could be considered a cult, and was later labeled as such. Yet, the main principals behind their family was, and only was, Manson's will. [The Mind and Motives of Charles Manson, and society's counteractions are best described when his beliefs, his actions to support and uphold these beliefs, and society's laws to stop him are taken into account.] -T

Manson has been proclaimed by many to be insane. The question of whether or not he is insane is a question of opinion, which cannot have a "true" right answer. However, his beliefs, which fueled his and his family's actions between 1968 and 1975, conflicted with society's morals, around which this country revolves. The severity of Manson and his family's doings are reasoned behind his beliefs toward himself, his family, nature, other people, and the law.

Charles Manson, on many occasions, has compared himself to Jesus Christ. He

believed that he was Christ, and the world had made him suffer, just as Christ did two thousand years ago. He also had his family believing that he was Christ. He said in an interview, when asked how he got his followers to believe that he was Jesus, "I was just being <sup>MYSELF</sup> myself..... all men <sup>is</sup> Jesus Christ." He also believed that he was Satan, to come to Earth and start Helter Skelter, what he called a prophetic armageddon.

His family, he believed, had two main spiritual duties: to learn to be him and to act like him, and to also learn and believe in what he did. He and the family lived with each other, living off, what he would consider love, for each other, and the earth. He told them that the happiness is in love. He believed that they should, when necessary, die for him, and not feel remorse. He preached to them that death was not bad, just another high. The family eventually adopted these beliefs, thus putting them at his complete control.

Nature, according to Manson, was one of the most precious things in life. He subscribed to the belief that ATWA (Air, Trees, Water, Animals) kept humans alive, and we should treat ATWA with equal respect. He once metaphored that ATWA was a ship, and the human wastes to the earth, pollution, and forest destruction was like a hole in the bottom of the boat. He, when living at Spahn Ranch, would tell his family to let the scorpions crawl over them, as they were animals, not meant to endanger the family.

Helter Skelter, revenge <sup>2</sup> were part of his beliefs. Humans had corrupted the Earth and ATWA, and were ignorant about it. Manson had felt that society dumped him, and he felt great rage for society, and people, and later found an anthem for his rage. When asked about his actions, many years after the murders, he had said that he is a part of everyone, that he mirrors people, because they shaped him. The Beatles' "White Album" included

songs (Helter Skelter, Revolution #9, Piggies, and others) that Manson felt documented his

rage toward society. When at the ranch, he and the family listened to these songs many times over. Manson thought he had heard his name being said in one of the songs. Their thoughts about Helter Skelter, or the armageddon, were brought out by these songs. In Revolution #9, he heard machine gun fire, the oinking of pigs, and a man saying "rise."

His beliefs would later incite Helter Skelter, using his family as a type of "army."

Some people believe that he just brutalized people, that the murders were for no cause, and

he was just insane. Yet, more than twenty-five years after he and his family were convicted, he still has the same beliefs, and still can logically explain his actions.

August 9, 1969 and August 10, 1969. These two days carry a dark shadow over them. Two of the first ritual cult-style mass murders in U.S. history. The first of the two changed the mood of the entire population of L.A. for almost a year. These murders were the coming of Manson's Helter Skelter, the armageddon of the Earth.

Spahn Ranch is a small, run-down ranch near L.A. It was owned by George Spahn, who was then a decrepid, eighty-year-old wrangler, whose kids had gone away, and

whose wife had died. He was depressed near death, when a group of hippies came to his door. They agreed to take care of him, and the ranch in exchange for living space. He agreed. The group, otherwise known as Manson's family, had Squeaky take the most care of George, which included cleaning, cooking, making love to him, and other various tasks. The family, which consisted of twenty-six people, began its cultish life in the desert.

"We played a lot of music, we did a lot of drugs, we loved, we were happy" replies Manson when later asked about life at the ranch. The family, did these things, and more.



They lost their humanity at the ranch. Life was lived "now", for "today " Manson told them to always "live today " The family members never talked about the past, never thought about the past or the future. The initiation of female family members was just that they joined. Male members would pick any woman they wanted and made love to them. Manson's thoughts on this was that that's what women are for, to bait the men. The women were not allowed to deny who picked them. They had no watches, to forget time, and society Manson would walk up to members daily, and have them mirror his actions, to try to be exactly like him. They took hundreds of acid trips, they did marijuana, and during the acid trips, he would have them reenact the crucifixion. During these times he would ask them if they would die for him, if they would "be him " The members had started to live Manson's reality. Manson would hear about the discrimination against the blacks in the South, and this was partially where he based his proof that Helter Skelter was near. the members started getting more guns, knives, and other weapons They had lookouts at the ranch. They also robbed places to get money Leslie Van Houten even robbed her father to get money for the cause

By August 8, 1969, Manson had already killed a few people for various reasons These drug dealers, and bums that he did kill are civil compared to the two ritualistic murders, done for Helter Skelter Manson once tried to get a record contract from a producer, living at 10050 Cielo Dr. in Bel-Air, which later failed Manson, who had been telling the family for months that they needed to start Helter Skelter themselves, needed money to bail out a member from jail. near midnight, on August 8, he called a meeting about this He sent Pat Krenwinkle, Susan Atkins, Linda Kasabian, and Tex Watson to

10050 Cielo Dr to get money. He had told the women to do whatever Tex told them, and

was remembered saying "I don't care how you do it, but do it, and get it done now!"

that night, just after midnight, August 9, they pulled up to the driveway. Tex cut the telephone wires, and, bypassing the electric gate, the women scaled a fence and climbed

up

a hill to the yard. This house was no longer occupied by the record producer of Manson's acquaintance, but instead a beautiful new actress named Sharon Tate. Her lover and soon-to-be husband Roman Polanski, who was a movie director, was in London at the time. She was pregnant with their eight-month-old baby. She, Jay Sebring, Voytek Frykowski, and Abigail Folger were at the house for the night. Sebring was a world-wide known

hair dresser, owning Sebring International. Folger was the heiress to the Folger coffee fortune. Frykowski was an actor, her lover. Back behind the house in a small shack was William Garretson, who was a caretaker of the house, who would later be an important witness. At the time when the women jumped the fence and were waiting for Tex, they heard four gunshots. He has seen Steven Parent driving up to the residence. He was an acquaintance of Garretson, coming by to visit. He was killed instantly, four shot at point-blank range. Tex then caught up with the women, and walked to the front door. It was locked, so he went through an open window next to the door, letting the women in first. They got the four people into the living room, together. Sebring, who tried to protect Sharon, was bludgeoned in the head once, then shot and stabbed by Tex. The other three people were panicked at this time. Frykowski tried to run out the back door, but was caught up to by Tex. He was clubbed in the head several times, shot, and stabbed. It was

later counted that he was stabbed fifty-one times. Before his death, Abigail Folger had been tied up, and now was starting to get free. She ran out the back, pursued by Krenwinkle. She was ran down, and stabbed to death. Krenwinkle later recalled her saying "I'm already dead..." (later found to have been stabbed twenty-eight times.) Finally, Sharon Tate, the only one left, was begging for the life of her baby to Tex, who replied "Look bitch, I have no mercy for you." He then stabbed her ~~stabbed~~ to death. After these five brutal murders, the killers wound up taking only seventy dollars before leaving. When returning to the ranch, Manson was remembered saying only two things. "Do you have any remorse?", and "Don't tell anyone."

"Sharon Tate, four others slain in ritualistic murders." These were the headlines the following day in the Los Angeles Times. Even the New York Times, which never printed murder cases on the cover page, printed the Tate murders on the cover for almost a week. The night of August 9, 1969, Leno Labianca and his wife, Rosemary, were driving back from a vacation at Lake Isabella. It was about 3:00 AM, August 10 when they finally arrived back at their house. Manson had picked Krenwinkle, Van Houten, and Tex to go to their house. Manson still needed money, and he said that he went to a party at the neighboring house once before. He had asked Van Houten, "Can you be me, do you believe enough in me to do this?" This time, Manson came with them in a separate car. They arrived, and walked through the front door. Tex tied up Leno, who was reading the paper in the living room. At this time, Manson had left, leaving no evidence of his presence. The two girls took Rosemary into the bedroom. Manson had told Tex "Don't

scare them like last time, just kill them." Leno was stabbed to death while Rosemary was forced to listen. Tex then came in, <sup>and also</sup> stabbed her to death ~~also~~. He then handed a knife to Van Houten, who then stabbed Rosemary in the back fifteen times. Pat then went out to the dead body of Leno. She took a fork, and stabbed him on the stomach multiple times, and finally left the fork in him. No money was taken.

During the first set of murders, They had written "Piggies" and "Helter Skelter" in Tate's blood on the door. In the second set, they wrote with Leno's blood "Rise", "Death <sup>to</sup> Pigs", and "Helter Skelter" on the walls before they left. These cultish writings were the only things that the police could find in common to the two murders.

By 1970, Manson and his followers had killed more people than the victims in the Tate-Labianca murders, but the severity of the two back-to-back slaughters shocked the nation. Nobody had seen killings like these. Unprovoked, unnecessary, and inhuman.

Four months after the two murderings, police finally caught up with and arrested Manson and his followers for the murders. The cultish actions and Manson's control over the family, however, didn't stop when they were all in custody of the law. It had taken years after the trials for the family to break Manson's will over them.

Manson and four of his followers were arrested four months after the murders. He, along with Tex Watson, Susan Atkins, Leslie Van Houten, and Pat Krenwinkel were charged with first degree murder counts on Steven Parent, Sharon Tate, Abigail Folger, Voytek Frykowski, Jay Sebring, Rosemary Labianca, and Leno Labianca. The main pieces of evidence were the revolver that Tex used in the Tate murders, and fingerprints around the residences. The revolver, which was later found in a field near the site, had no

gun grip, which was found in three pieces at the Tate crime scene.

Along with the seven known murders, Manson and his followers had collected a "tab" of bodies around the L.A. area, for various reasons. These others include Nancy Warren, Clida Delaney, Marina Habe, Mark Walts, Gary Hinman, Donald Shea, John Haught, James Sharp, Doreen Gual, and Ronald Hughes, the last one, in late 1970. Also, Squeaky, Manson's acting head of the family, had attempted to assassinate president Gerald Ford in 1975.

During the trial, Manson had his three female followers do many strange things to confuse the court, including carving X's in their heads, always making stupid symbols in the courtroom, and even taking full blame for all the murders. However, the prosecution, led by Vincent Bugliosi, had verbal evidence from a testimony given to them by Linda Kasabian. She, once a family member, had traded information to the prosecution for a full pardon. It was recalled that a family member screamed at her from outside the courthouse "You're going to kill us all!" After the end of the trials, Manson and his family were all found guilty, partly due to the testimony of Kasabian, and also to the evidence found. They all got the death penalty, which was abolished about a year after the trials. Their sentences were reduced to life in prison. Since then, up until the present, Manson has been living in solitary confinement, without parole. Pat Krenwinkle, Leslie Van Houten, and Susan Atkins are still in prison, are allowed parole attempts, and never receive them. Tex Watson is in jail, but was allowed to marry, and has three kids.

The law of America and the state of California stopped Manson from committing

more murders, and mostly put an end to his family. However, the country has been shocked for twenty-five years hearing about Manson's family. The severity of the Tate-Labianca murders has never diminished, and even though the murders are credited to Manson's ideas, the innocent times of a hippie cult, the family's life at Spahn Ranch can also be credited to him, and his ideas.

To this day, Manson's influence over his followers, and the entire U.S. is still lingering. He always told people he was a crazy old man, but many people followed him. However, his beliefs, and the beliefs of his followers have changed in twenty years.

Cult behavior, for the most part, sprang up after Manson's family affairs in the late 1960's. One good example of the related lifestyle is David Karesh and his followers in the early 1990's. According to Krenwinkle, the scariest thing is when Manson gets a follower from the younger generation. For example, Axel Rose recorded one of Manson's songs, and wears a Manson T-shirt at concerts. "The biggest misconception is people thinking that what we did was OK," says Krenwinkle in a recent interview.

To this day, Manson still believes the same things he has <sup>whole</sup> <sup>space</sup> all his life. He also says that he had no part of the Tate-Labianca murders, and that the government treated him unfairly. Manson will be in solitary confinement for the rest of his life, saying these things to countless reporters who choose to hear his side of the story.

Pat Krenwinkle, Leslie Van Houten, and Susan Atkins, the three women followers tried with Manson are all in jail to this day. They all have dropped Manson's beliefs, and live commendable lives. Atkins has converted to Christianity. Van Houten and Krenwinkle, who hold jobs, and help kids with drug problems, say "The thing about Charlie is that he says he's crazy to hide under people's awareness. In this way, he can get

people to do things for him, without them questioning his motives." This is what they say happened to them, and countless others, who subscribed to Manson's beliefs, and suffered the consequences

Manson's murder case was the most extraordinary of the time period, especially taking into account the hippie era. However, the murders partially stemmed from the era. ~~As~~ he had so many people under his control, believing his every word, what he thought <sup>of</sup> turned into a reality. Oliver Stone compliments Manson, when describing his interview with Geraldo Rivera, saying that Manson had the upper hand of the discussion the entire time. Intelligence is not one and the same with sanity, however, which might have explained Manson's retaliation against society. It is of somebody's opinion, to decide whether or not they think Manson is insane. Yet, His mind and motives can explain why he acted how he did, and why society didn't approve.
