INVESTIGATION:

On August 24, 1999, at approximately 1600 hours, I responded to 4103 West Eldorado Place to contact and interview witness Patrick Sean Kelly, who is a student at Columbine High School. This interview was in reference to the shooting on 4-20-99 at Columbine High School.

Patrick Kelly said on 4-20-99, at approximately 0645 hours to 0650 hours, he arrived at Columbine High School for his scheduled classes. Patrick said he drove his red Chevrolet Monte Carlo to school, and parked it in Clement Park. Patrick said he entered Columbine High School through the main doors located on the east side of the school by the administrative offices. Patrick said when he entered the school on 4-20-99, he did not observe anything unusual or out of the ordinary. He said he went to his "men's comedy group" at about 0650 hours on 4-20-99, and prior to his scheduled first hour class, which he said he is a tech lab assistant. Patrick said he next went to his second hour world history class, then went to his third hour calculus class. After calculus, Patrick said he went to his fourth hour German class. To get to his German class, Patrick said he had to go down the stairway from the upper level of Columbine High School and down to the lower level. This stairway at the bottom leads into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. I showed Patrick the photographs of the duffle bag and the

propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Patrick told me he did not see either of these items or any similar items on 4-20-99. I also asked Patrick if he saw any of the trench coat mafia students or associates in the cafeteria/commons area of the school while he was going to, or leaving his lower level German class on 4-20-99. Patrick said he did not remember seeing any of the trench coat mafia students or their associates on that date. Patrick said he usually sees the trench coat mafia students and/or their associates hanging around the area at the bottom of this stairway, but said he did not remember seeing them there on 4-20-99. Patrick said after his fourth hour class, he next went to his fifth hour concert choir class with the teacher of this class being Mr. Andres. Patrick said he arrived at this class at approximately 1112 hours on 4-20-99 and said everything seemed to be normal. Patrick said the class was talking about a performance they were going to do at Normandy Elementary School later that day. Patrick said as the class was getting ready for this performance, a student by the name of Brandon Reisbeck suddenly ran into the choir classroom and was shaken up. Patrick said that Brandon Reisbeck told Mr. Andres and the students that there was somebody in the downstairs portion of Columbine High School with a gun. Patrick said Mr. Andres told Brandon Reisbeck and the students in the class to calm down. Patrick said the doors from the interior of the classroom that lead into the hallway was open, and he said he then heard an "explosion" that he said was either an explosive device that had detonated or a shotgun that had been discharged. Patrick said this explosion sounded to him like it came from the downstairs area of Columbine High School. Patrick said at this time the students from the choir classroom got up and began running. He said approximately half of the class ran one direction and hid in an office located next to the choir room. He said the other half of the class, including himself, ran from the interior of the classroom, out the east doors, and into the hallway, and towards the auditorium. Patrick said he ran into the auditorium, and said as he ran along the back part of the auditorium he heard between 7 and 9 shots that he described as being less intense than the explosion he heard earlier. Patrick said these shots were fired very rapidly and said he first believed they were shot by an automatic weapon. Patrick said he then ran out of the auditorium and into the hallway by the gym. He said he then began running toward the east side main doors of the school, and said as he was approaching this exit point, a window was either shot out, or fell out of the frame as it shattered in front of him. Patrick said when this occurred he did not hear a gunshot that may have shattered this window. He said at about this same time the fire alarm went off inside of Columbine High School, and said he ran out of the school through the main doors and into the faculty parking lot, north and east of the school. Patrick said he then kept running into Clement Park, and at about 1200 hours he called his grandparents on his cellular telephone.

I asked Patrick what information he could provide to me about the trench coat mafia, the trench coat mafia students, and in particular what information he could provide about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Patrick said Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris had a first hour video productions class at the same time that he had his tech lab assistant class hour, during the first and second school semester. Patrick said Dylan Klebold worked the sound for the school talent show while Patrick worked the lights for this talent show. Patrick said he talked to Dylan Klebold, but did not recall Dylan Klebold talking about anything out of the ordinary. He said he was not sure if Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris were trench coat mafia students or not. He told me that Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris made a video that was violent in nature during the video productions class. Patrick said he also had an accelerated chemistry class during his sophomore year that Dylan Klebold was also in. Patrick said Dylan Klebold wore a black trench coat that he described as not being a true trench coat, but rather said it was a "duster," possibly being made out of leather, however, he was not sure. He said this trench coat hung down to approximately calve length. Patrick said that Dylan Klebold would hang around with Eric Harris and Nate Dykeman, and said he had seen Dylan Klebold in the hallways of Columbine High School with Robyn Anderson.

Patrick Kelly said he knew Eric Harris because they had a German class together during his sophomore year in the first semester of his junior year. Patrick said Eric Harris was "quiet and moody" and said he sat at the back of the classroom. Patrick said he had seen Eric Harris wearing a trench coat. He also said that Eric Harris had a backpack and on this backpack Eric Harris had a "marksmanship medal" that may have been a United States Marine Corp shooting medal. Patrick said this medal was the type that would be pinned onto something, such as a uniform. He said this medal may have been gold in color at one time, however, he said he believed Eric Harris may have painted it black.

Patrick Kelly said he knew who [REDACTED] was, and said he had heard that [REDACTED] was "mentally unstable." Patrick said in the past he had talked to [REDACTED] in the cafeteria when Patrick didn't have anybody else to talk to. He said these conversations were last year. Patrick said [REDACTED] "seemed okay" and said he did not recall what they had talked about, but said he did not recall their conversation being about anything unusual or out of the ordinary. Patrick said that [REDACTED] wore a trench coat all the time and said he also wore green military fatigue type of clothing.

Patrick Kelly said he knew who [REDACTED] was, but said that [REDACTED] graduated from Columbine High School in 1998. Patrick

said [redacted] wore a trench coat and said when he was a sophomore he remembered that [redacted] came to school with his face painted with black and white face make-up. Patrick said he considered [redacted] to be "gothic." He said [redacted] did not get along with other people and "had run-ins with people." He described [redacted] as being "antisocial." He also said [redacted] associated with [redacted]

Patrick Kelly said [redacted] did not wear a trench coat as far as he could remember, but said that [redacted] wore green military fatigue type of clothing. Patrick said [redacted] was quiet, and said he did not talk to [redacted]

Patrick Kelly said [redacted] assisted Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris in their video productions class. He said [redacted] wore a trench coat most of the time.

Patrick Kelly said he knew who [redacted] was, but believed [redacted] dropped out of Columbine High School. He said [redacted] was in his debate class in the fall semester of 1999 and spring of 1999.

Patrick Kelly said on 4-20-99, he believed he saw [redacted] and possibly saw Dylan Klebold in the first hour class, however, said he did not see Eric Harris in the class on that date. Patrick said he remembered this because he thought at the time it seemed out of the ordinary for Eric Harris not to be with Dylan Klebold in this first hour class.

Patrick Kelly said thinking back to 4-20-99, he believed he remembered his choir teacher, Mr. Andres, possibly yelled at Brooks Brown in the Choir class for talking to Charlie Simmons while Mr. Andres was trying to talk to the class. Patrick said on 4-21-99, the day after the shooting at Columbine High School, he saw Brooks Brown in Clement Park. He said while talking to Brooks Brown, it appeared that Brooks Brown was upset about the shooting, and said that Brooks Brown said something to the effect of, "I can't believe they are gone," referring to Rachel Scott and Dan Mauser, two victims of the shooting. Patrick Kelly said Brooks Brown considered himself to be a "master philosopher" and said Brooks Brown "tended to lie a lot." [redacted]

[redacted] Patrick said he had no evidence to indicate this belief of his as being true.

Patrick Kelly said he did not know Isaiah Shoels, but had seen Isaiah Shoels in the hallways of Columbine High School. Patrick said he never saw anybody racially harass or racially intimidate Isaiah Shoels. He said that from his perspective, it appeared that Isaiah Shoels was well liked by other students at Columbine High School. Patrick said he also never saw any of the trench coat mafia students being directly harassed by anybody. He said he did not see the trench coat mafia students or their associates harass other people either.

Patrick Kelly said he does not know of anybody, nor has he heard rumors of anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or buying, selling, or possessing firearms.

Patrick Kelly said on 4-20-99, when he ran out of Columbine High School, he left his backpack (described as a blue Cypress backpack) and its contents in the choir classroom. Patrick said he has since picked up these items from Columbine High School.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Patrick Kelly told me on 4-20-99, he did not see any of the suspects, nor did he see anybody with firearms and/or explosive devices at any time.

Patrick Kelly said that during the 1998/1999 school year at Columbine High School, Brooks Brown was engaged to an Arapahoe High School student by the name of Sabrina (unknown last name). He said it is his understanding that Brooks Brown and Sabrina have since broken up their engagement.

I asked Patrick Kelly how he and his family have been doing since the shooting on 4-20-99 at Columbine High School. Patrick advised me that he had some rough times and said that one the victims by the name of Dan Mauser was his best friend and said that he believes the reason he had trouble was due to this friendship. He said he is doing fine now and said he would contact me in the future if he or anyone in his family wanted to speak with a JCSO Victim Advocate. I told him I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

DISPOSITION: Case is open, pending further investigation.

INVESTIGATION:

On 03-28-00 Investigator Kate Battan asked me to re-interview Columbine High School student Patrick Sean Kelly. This office had received information that on 04-20-99, witness Kelly spoke to a news reporter and identified [REDACTED] as a shooter at Columbine High School, along with Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. The purpose of the re-interview is to clarify Kelly's information and observations on 04-20-99.

On 04-03-00 at about 1525 hours, I met with witness Kelly and his grandfather, witness Lynn, at their residence. As documented in Investigator Peterson's report, Kelly was in the choir room when the shooting started. Witness Kelly subsequently ran out of the school through the east doors and then to Clement Park. Witness Kelly told me that he was at Clement Park when he spoke to a reporter. At that time, the reporter asked Kelly "Who could possibly be involved?" Kelly recalled naming [REDACTED] along with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris as possibly being involved because of Morris' association with the Trenchcoat Mafia. Kelly told me that he didn't then, and doesn't now, have any first hand knowledge that [REDACTED] was in fact involved. Kelly also told me that he now doesn't believe that anyone other than Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold were involved in the shootings at Columbine High School. Additionally Kelly told me

INVESTIGATION:

On 06-21-99, I was assigned lead #3904, to interview Angela King. A Tami Biehl reported that King had been shot at by a suspect wearing a mask, while in the auditorium of Columbine High School on 04-20-99. This lead was originally assigned to Larry Erzen on 06-15-99.

On 06-28-99, at about 1542 hours, I received a phone call from a female identifying herself as Angela King. This was subsequent to my having attempted to contact her and leaving messages at the listed home phone number of (303) 971-0406. I told King that I was calling reference the Columbine High School incident on 04-20-99. I told King that I had received information that she had been shot at and had actually seen the gunmen in the auditorium on 04-20-99. King stated that she had been through the auditorium, but had not been shot at and had not seen a gunman.

King stated that her fourth hour class was German which was on the lower level of Columbine High School. She stated that following that class she went up the stairs, going past the cafeteria area and directly into the choir room. King then stated that she may have gone to her friend's locker which is directly across from the choir room. She stated that was typical for her, but she does not remember if she did that on 04-20-99. I asked King if she saw anything unusual in the cafeteria and she stated she did not. I asked her if she saw anything unusual in the way of bags or backpacks and she stated she did not. I told King that my understanding was that fifth period class started at 1115. I asked her what happened at that time. She stated that the choir class warmed up and a boy named Brandon Reisbeck went to the hall to get a drink of water. She stated that Reisbeck came back in

saying, "Mr. Andres, there's a guy downstairs with a gun." King explained that Mr. Andres was the choir teacher. She stated that no one in the class believed Reisbeck, as he is the type that would tend to play a joke like that. She stated that a girl came in right behind him, saying that it was true and telling them to get out now. King stated that she left the choir room turning left and going directly into the auditorium. She stated she went across the top of the auditorium and into the main hall, where she turned right and went out through the front entrance/main office doors. She stated the glass had already been shot out at that point. She stated there were other kids going the same direction she did. I asked her if she heard or saw anything. She said that when she was in the auditorium she thought she did hear gunshots, which sounded as if they were coming from the lower commons area. I asked her if she saw or heard anything when she was in the main hall. She stated that she might have heard one or two gunshots at that point, however, she did not know for sure. She stated that once she got into the main hall, she saw one of her friend's younger sisters, Becca Goodwin. She stated that Goodwin was crying and scared and that she grabbed her and took her out of the school. King stated that she and Goodwin went out the main entrance, across the teacher's parking lot and into Clement Park. She stated initially they were in the parking lot where the kids park, but the teachers continued to push them further and further back until they were eventually in the public library. I asked King if she had either heard or seen anything outside and she stated she had not.

I asked King if she had been in the cafeteria at any point earlier that day. She stated that she had gone down to German class, thus passing the cafeteria, and had also possibly been there during first or second period. I asked her if she noticed anything unusual in the cafeteria at any of those times and she stated she did not.

I asked King if she knew either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She stated she had Harris in German class for the first three and a half years. I asked her if she had seen him on 04-20-99, and she stated she had not. I asked if she had any classes with him during the last semester and she stated she did not think she had. I asked her again about Klebold. She stated she knew who he was, but did not know him. I asked her if she had seen him on 04-20-99, and she said that she didn't remember seeing him. I asked King if there was anything she had either heard or seen, either prior to or since the incident, which she thought might be of assistance to us. She stated there was not.

INVESTIGATION:

I telephonically interviewed the above listed witness on 081199. Kirk reported that he has not been interviewed by police regarding the Columbine High School shooting prior to this date.

Kirk was at school on 042099 and in Mr. Andres Choir class. A student, Brandon Reisbeck ran into the choir room and told Mr. Andres that somebody was shooting in the school. Kirk looked out in the halls and heard what he thought was shooting and saw students running crazily in the halls. After he heard the shots, he ran out of the auditorium and ran out of the school near to where the post graduate area is. Kirk ran to Clement Park. He remembers running out of the school between 1115 and 1120 hours. He reported hearing the fire alarm going off as he left the school.

Prior to exiting the school he recalled looking out into the hall from the auditorium and seeing a student with a gun. He said the person with the gun was at the top of the stairs near the SE hall. He saw a flash from what he thought was a shotgun. He told me he could not identify the person with the gun. He said that he was running away and did not have a good line of sight at the suspected shooter.

Kirk reported to having no prior knowledge of the shooting incident. He had seen guys in trench coats on campus before throughout the school year and knew that there were tensions between the jocks and the TCM.

One July 4, 1998 Kirk had a run in with who he thought, was Harris. Harris was waiving a shotgun at him because he threw a donut at Harris as he drove by him in a car. This occurred at a 7-11 store located at Platte Canyon and Coal Mine. Kirk told me that this incident was reported to the police. He further alleged that he only thought it was Harris because he was a member of the TCM.

Contacted LARSON, who was interviewed in the presence of his mother, Valerie LARSON at their residence. He is a senior at Columbine High School.

LARSON was acquainted with HARRIS. He had previously had a Philosophy class, and three years of German classes with HARRIS. He did not particularly care for HARRIS, whom he described as sitting in the back of the class and not participating much. However, LARSON said that he was sometimes randomly paired with HARRIS in the German class, and they had no problem working together.

LARSON is not an athlete, although he reports that in his sophomore year he did go out for cross country track.

[REDACTED] LARSON recalled that occasionally, in his freshman year, he used to eat lunch with KLEBOLD.

LARSON was a singer in a band which Brooks BROWN also was a member of. The band fell apart in about January 1999, because none of the members had time to practice. LARSON recalled that in addition to BROWN, the band also included Aaron BROWN, Brooks' brother, and at various times one of about 4 guitarists, including Doug PRADER, Carl IVES, and Joel (LNU). Joel was described as being 22 years old, and working at "Wells Backstage".

LARSON recalled that about a year ago, he was staying over night at BROWN's residence, and someone drove by and shot paintballs through a garage window. Aaron BROWN. Brooks'

brother, got outside in time to see the car and said it was HARRIS. This is not confirmed, and it is not known that there is any specific significance to this incident.

At the time of the shooting, LARSON was in the Choir class. This is the same class which BROWN was supposed to be in. LARSON does not recall seeing BROWN, and does not know if he was in class or not. Larson said some of the students went into the Choir office, where he went, and others left the class room another way. LARSON left a shirt, a brown hooded sweatshirt with "Independent" written on the front, and his school notes in the Choir room. He also left his trumpet in his band locker.

Kristen stated that they didn't hesitate to talk freely with her around. She stated they talked a lot about guns and bombs and killing people. She stated they weren't specific about what their targets would be, but that they were, "obsessed" with it. She stated that they would talk about, "hunting each other" and about, "playing the game". Kristen didn't know for sure but she thought this could be possibly a computer game.

Kristen stated that [REDACTED] was also obsessed with guns and death. She stated she wouldn't be surprised if he was involved in the shooting at the school. According to Kristen, [REDACTED] used to be the leader of the group before ERIC HARRIS joined. She stated ERIC HARRIS took over the leadership and DYLAN KLEBOLD was more of a follower along with [REDACTED]. She added that she didn't think [REDACTED] had the

guts to go crazy with a gun and kill people. She stated she had lost touch with [REDACTED] during her junior year.

Kristen stated she usually saw KLEBOLD and HARRIS in the Commons (cafeteria) but she did not see them there the morning of 04-20-99. She added she did not see them at all that day in between her classes.

Kristen stated there were definite signs that something could happen. She described the group as, "staring you down if they passed you in the hall and if you weren't their friend". She also stated even she would not believe them if they told her of this plan because it sounded so unbelievable. She stated the group really tried to alienate themselves from others.

Kristin also added that she worked at the Cooper 7 Theater which is next door to the Black Jack Pizza place where Morris, KLEBOLD and HARRIS worked.

Kristin stated that when she ran out the front door when the shooting was going on, a bullet traveled past her head and broke the glass in the door in front of her.


INVESTIGATION:

On 05-25-99, at about 1330 hours, I interviewed Kristen Long at her residence. Long is a senior at the Columbine High School. I asked her to describe to me the events which occurred on 04-20-99.

Long stated that she walked to school, arriving at about 0730 for her first period class. First period is Government Economics with Miss Karamigios. Second period is a free period for Long. She stated that she did not make any observations of announcements since she is free that period. She walked home, got her car, then went to the Conoco station on South Pierce St. and West Canyon Avenue to visit her boyfriend. She returned to school for third period, arriving at about 0930 hours. She stated she was slightly late for that third period class. Third period is Music Theory with Mr. Andres, Sr. Fourth period is Psychology with Mr. Johnson. Fifth period is Choir with Mr. Andres, Sr.

I asked Long about any prior contact she had with the suspects or the Trench Coat Mafia. She stated she had been friends during her sophomore year with members of the Trench Coat Mafia. She stated she did not socialize with them outside of school. This year during the first semester, she and Tadd Bowles would get together during first period and have breakfast. Sometimes Harris and Klebold would join them in the cafeteria. She stated that Harris would openly talk about death, but never specified any particular target for death. Long works at the Cooper 7 theaters and often had something to eat at Black Jack Pizza where Harris and Klebold both worked.

During fifth period, Long was in the choir room when two students she identified as Brandon Reisbeck and Beth Bradshaw came into the room saying, "Somebody is shooting in the Commons." It was about two minutes before Long heard some shooting. She stated it was more than one gunshot and it appeared to be getting closer. Mr. Andres, Sr., then said for everyone to get into the auditorium and to get on the floor. Long ran out of the east door of the choir room, then turned north. She stated that hallway was very crowded with people trying to get into the auditorium. The auditorium door is the first door on the left, as you go north in the hallway.

Long stated that she was one of the last students to enter into the auditorium from the small hallway outside the choir room. She stated while she was waiting to get into the auditorium, she looked to her left and saw a really tall male wearing a black trench coat, jogging east through the south main hallway. The individual jogged past the hall that Long was in. Long believed that the male was white, because she believes she saw part of his arm. She stated the suspect was dressed in all black and possibly was wearing black gloves. She saw a gun on the right side of the suspect. She stated she did not believe it was a sawed off shotgun. She stated it was long and swinging by the suspect's right leg.

The suspect was not shooting when he jogged past the hall that Long was in. Long stated she could still hear shots coming from the west when she saw this suspect. Long stated the suspect she saw running past the hall looked as though he was wearing panty hose or some kind of netting over his face. She stated she could tell that he had a large nose because his nose was sticking out from his face. She stated that his hair was matted down and she was certain that his hair color was dark and definitely not blond. His hair was an unknown length. Long stated she did not know if anyone else saw the suspect running past the hall while they were waiting to get into the auditorium. I asked for the name of the students who were around her at the time. She stated she could not recall.

When Long entered the auditorium, she stated she was standing by the sound booth which is near the top of the auditorium. She stated she could hear three to four gunshots very clearly. She then heard a male voice yelling. She could not distinguish the words. Long thought that the male voice was coming from the stairwell, which leads from the Commons into the auditorium. She also thought the person who was yelling in the stairwell was shooting.

Long stated that when she heard the three or four shots, they were very close and seemed to be coming from inside the auditorium. She and several other students ran out the north east doors of the auditorium. These doors led into the north main hallway. When Long entered the north main hallway, she looked to her left and saw that the fire doors, which were only a few feet away from her, were shut. Long stated the fire alarm was going and she ran east toward the main exit.

There are double glass doors at the main entrance of the school. As Long was running toward the interior set of glass doors, she was aware that both sides of the door were intact. She decided to take the glass door on the left side. As she began to go through that doorway, the glass shattered. She continued to proceed east and exited the second set of glass doors. Once outside the school, she ran along S. Pierce St., towards Clement Park. There she found a cell phone and called her mother. I asked Long if she sustained any injury from the shattering glass door. She said "no".

Long then told me that just before exiting the first set of glasses doors at the main exit, she turned and looked back westward. She stated she briefly saw a person or a shadow of a person against the west door which is in the doorway leading from the Tech center hall into the north main hallway. She thought the person was tall with long legs. She thought perhaps she was seeing his silhouette. She did not see any weapons. She believed it to be the same person she had seen jogging past the hallway going east in the south main hallway.

Long stated that some of the students who had come out of the auditorium into the north main hallway went back to the auditorium because shots were being fired. I asked Long if anyone came to mind when she saw the individual with the gun running east in the south main hallway. She stated the person that came to mind was [REDACTED]. She did not clearly see that individual's face and could not positively identify the person as [REDACTED].

Long stated that numerous students from Columbine ended up being on the front yard of her house after vacating the school. Long lives in the subdivision just east of Columbine High School. Long stated she remembers Zack Heckler's girlfriend, whose first name is Devon, saying she had heard the Trench Coat Mafia saying they were going to get even with the school. Devon did not say who specifically made that comment.

Long told me that she remembers more details about the shooting as time goes on. She stated that she has had dreams which have helped her remember things more clearly.

On August 23, 1999, at approximately 0830 hours, I responded to 6342 South Newland Court to contact and interview witness Sara Jean Martin. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 4-20-99. Sara's mother, Teri Martin, was present during this interview.

Sara Martin said on April 20, 1999, at approximately 0725 hours, she arrived at Columbine High School in her beige Toyota Corolla, for her scheduled classes. Sara said she parked her vehicle in the senior parking lot in parking space #203. Sara said she did not see anything out of the ordinary or unusual outside of Columbine High School as she parked her vehicle and walked towards the school. She also said that she did not see anybody or anything unusual after she entered Columbine High School. Sara said she entered on 4-20-99 through the door that is located on the west side of the cafeteria/commons area, and is near the faculty lounge. Sara said she then proceeded to walk along the west side of the cafeteria, along the windows, and then

eastbound in the cafeteria towards the commons area. Sara said she walked in this direction because she was going to her French class that was located on the lower level of Columbine High School. I showed Sara the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria/commons area. Sara said she did not see either of these items, or any other items of a similar description. Sara said after her first hour class she went to the following classes: Second hour AP English, third hour Music Theory, and fourth hour Philosophy class. Sara said after her fourth hour Philosophy class, she went to her fifth hour Choir class. Sara said she arrived at her Choir class at approximately 1113 hours on 4-20-99. Sara said she talked to some of her friends for a few minutes in the classroom, and then the teacher, Mr. Andres, told the students to sit down. Sara said approximately five minutes into this class, she heard what she believed to be people laughing in the downstairs part of the school. Sara said a student by the name of Brandon Reisbeck and another student, unknown name, suddenly came running into the Choir classroom and told the teacher, Mr. Andres there were people in the downstairs of Columbine High School with guns. Sara said about this same time she heard people outside of her classroom in the hallways running, and said she also heard approximately three gunshots that sounded like to her were coming from the area of the top of the stairway. I asked Sara if she ever shot a firearm, or if she had ever been present when a firearm was discharged, and she said no. Sara said, however, that she believed the three shots heard were from a shotgun being discharged. She said she believed it is because she later heard shots that were not as loud as the first three heard. Sara said she got down on the floor for a short time and then got up to run out of the classroom with the other students who had begin running. She said some of those students ran into an office area that is next to the Choir room, and said the other students in the class ran out of the classroom and into the hallways. Sara said while running out of the Choir room and into the hallway, she heard several "smaller shots." She said she heard about four of these shots and said they sounded like to her they were coming from the top of the interior stairway that leads from the cafeteria/commons area on the lower level of Columbine High School, to the upper level. Sara said she ran into the auditorium where there were several other students. She said she heard what she believed were two bombs being detonated, possibly in a hallway. She said she ran across the auditorium and into the gym hallway, where she said she turned to her right. Sara said she was running towards a back door of the band room on the northwest side of Columbine High School to exit the school. Sara said as she got approximately 15 feet from the door, the glass window in the door shattered. Sara said that although she did not hear a shot at that time, she believed the window was shot out. Sara said when this occurred she believed there was a shooter outside of Columbine High School and the door, shooting towards the interior of the school. Sara said she stopped to look around to see if she could see somebody with a gun, however,

she did not see anyone. Sara said she then exited Columbine High School by running out of the back door on the northwest side of the school near the band room. She said she ran away from the school and to the "smokers pit," and then ran into Clement Park. Sara said she got in a car with a friend of hers by the name of Kevin Koegnigan (303-978-7254), as did other students. She said they then drove to drop off these students at their residences and they then went to Kevin's house in Governor's Ranch where she called her mother, Teri Martin, at approximately 1150 hours on 4-20-99.

I asked Sara Martin what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students, and in particular what she knew about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Sara said she had Eric Harris in a class of hers during her sophomore year at Columbine High School. She described Eric Harris' style of dress during that time as "preppy" and said he did not wear a trench coat during that time frame. Sara said the first time she remembered seeing Eric Harris wear a trench coat was approximately one to two weeks prior to the shooting on 4-20-99. She said Eric Harris did not talk much and described him as being "quiet, closed up, and bitter." Sara said she did not see anyone harass or pick on Eric Harris, nor did she see Eric Harris pick on or harass anyone else. Sara said she had Dylan Klebold in her French class during her junior year at Columbine High School. She said Dylan would get very angry in class with the teacher (Kathy Lutz) and the other students, and would start throwing things around. Sara said she got frustrated by these distracting actions of Dylan Klebold, and his inability to get along with others. She said another student by the name of Zach Heckler was in this class and caused similar problems as Dylan Klebold. She said Dylan Klebold and Zach Heckler were suspended, and since being suspended from the class, Zach Heckler changed the way he acted according to Sara. She described Zach as being "very nice" and said she did not see him wear a trench coat.

Sara Martin said she attended the 1999 Columbine High School prom, and said she saw Dylan Klebold and his date, Robyn Anderson, at the prom together. She said she did not see Eric Harris, however, at the prom. Sara said she did not see Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold at the after prom party held at Columbine High School.

Sara Martin said she has not heard about any people who may have been involved in the shooting at Columbine High School on 4-20-99, with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. She said she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors of anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, selling, or buying firearms.

I asked Sara Martin and her mother, Teri Martin, how they and the rest of their family have been doing since the shooting at Columbine High School on 4-20-99. They said that everyone is doing well and said that if they need to talk with anybody they have somebody within their family that they talk with about this situation. I did give them one of my business cards and asked them to contact me in the future if any of them would like to speak with a JCSO Victim Advocate. I told them I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

INVESTIGATION:

On 04-28-99, at about 0945 hours, I met with Salli Melfi at JCSO for the purpose of an interview. Melfi stated that on 4-20-99, at about 0830 hours, she was in her homeroom class, which is the second hour. She stated that daily, between 0825 and 0830 hours, school announcements are made over the public address system. Announcements are made on the T.V. in each classroom via graphics. The T.V. does not show a individual speaking into the camera. Each day the RNN, which stands for "Rebel News Network", the official station of Columbine High School, displays a phrase of the day. On 4-20-99 the phrase of the day started with, "Today is Hitler's birthday." Melfi thought the following graphic stated something about that day going to be a bad day or about the students not wanting to be in school that day. She couldn't remember the specific phrasing.

I asked Melfi if she knew who the announcer was over the public address system that morning. She stated she did not recall. she thinks it may have been a female. She mentioned four students who she knows work with Teacher Mr. Tolacco, who teaches video productions. The name of the students who assist him in announcements are: Amber Burgess, Alise Williamson, Chris Beets, and Andrew Anderson. Melfi stated she also knew that suspects Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, along with their friend, Nathan Dykeman, worked in the tech lab this semester. Melfi stated that the phrase of the day does not normally include featuring famous person's birthdays. She only remembers Martin Luther King's birthday being highlighted. Student's birthdays are not displayed on the television graphic, but are usually announced over the public address system.

I asked Melfi if she knew the names of the students who had been in the library. She stated she knew that Seth Houy, Sarah

Houy, and Crystal Woodman had been in the library. Sam Granillo had been downstairs in the cafeteria. She knew of injured students named Dan Steepleton, Makai Hall, and Jennifer Doyle.

Melfi stated that on the day of the shooting she was on the choir room. It was about 1125 hours or shortly before. She stated the choir room is sound proof and that they did not hear much until a student named Brandon Reisback came running into the choir room saying, "There's a shooting downstairs in the cafeteria." Melfi stated she then heard a loud "pop, pop, bang" and saw kids running down the hallway screaming. She saw a teacher named Mr. Andres yell to the students to go into the auditorium. Some of the students began to exit the west door of the choir room, which leads to a hallway on the south. This hallway is near the stairs which lead down to the cafeteria. They were met by a teacher named Mrs. Miller, who told the students they could not go that way but to go out the opposite door. Melfi said the students, including herself, exited the east door of the choir room and went north down a hallway which leads to the auditorium.

Melfi went into the auditorium and walked along a set of seats, then exited the far doors which led to the main hallway. The fire alarm was now ringing. The fire doors in the main hallway, which are just to the left of the doors she exited from, were shut. She turned to her right and began running east down the hallway which goes into the upper commons area near the front entrance of the school. Melfi did stated that there was approximately 60 students that went from the choir room into an adjacent office and did not leave the same way she did. She believes the office belongs to Mr. Andres.

When Melfi was in the upper commons area, she headed towards the interior double glass doors which lead out of the school. She heard a shot and saw the double glass doors on the left shatter. She stated she thought that the trophy case to her left was also hit. Melfi hid behind a column which is in the center of the upper commons lobby. A counselor named Mr. Butts told her to go down the hallway near the counseling office. The students who were with her were fellow choir members. Matt Carmichael, John Kohn, and Shawn Kelly. Alex Goldberg was also with them. He had come from the lower commons area. Melfi stated it is unknown if any of those individuals saw the shooter.

see who was shooting. She also did not see anyone shot. I asked her if she was aware of any bible study going on in the upstairs library during this time. She stated she was not. Melfi stated that we should contact Dean Mrs. Mikeseil because she believes Mikeseil saw the shooter.

Melfi and her fellow students ran north down the hallway that passes the counseling offices. They then found a way to exit the school. Once they were out of the school they ran towards the Clement Park parking lot along Pierce Street, where several Columbine Students park their vehicles.

Melfi stated that she knows the girlfriend of Nathan Dykeman, whose name is Christy Epling. Epling told Melfi that Dykeman had moved to Florida to live with his dad on 4-26-99 or 4-27-99. I asked her about Christy's reaction to the news that her boyfriend had left the state. Melfi stated that Epling was surprised because it had happened so suddenly. Epling told Melfi that Dykeman had not said anything to her about any plans to attack the school. Melfi stated that her friend, Scott Rathbun, (303) 972-4867, also talked to Epling regarding Dykeman.

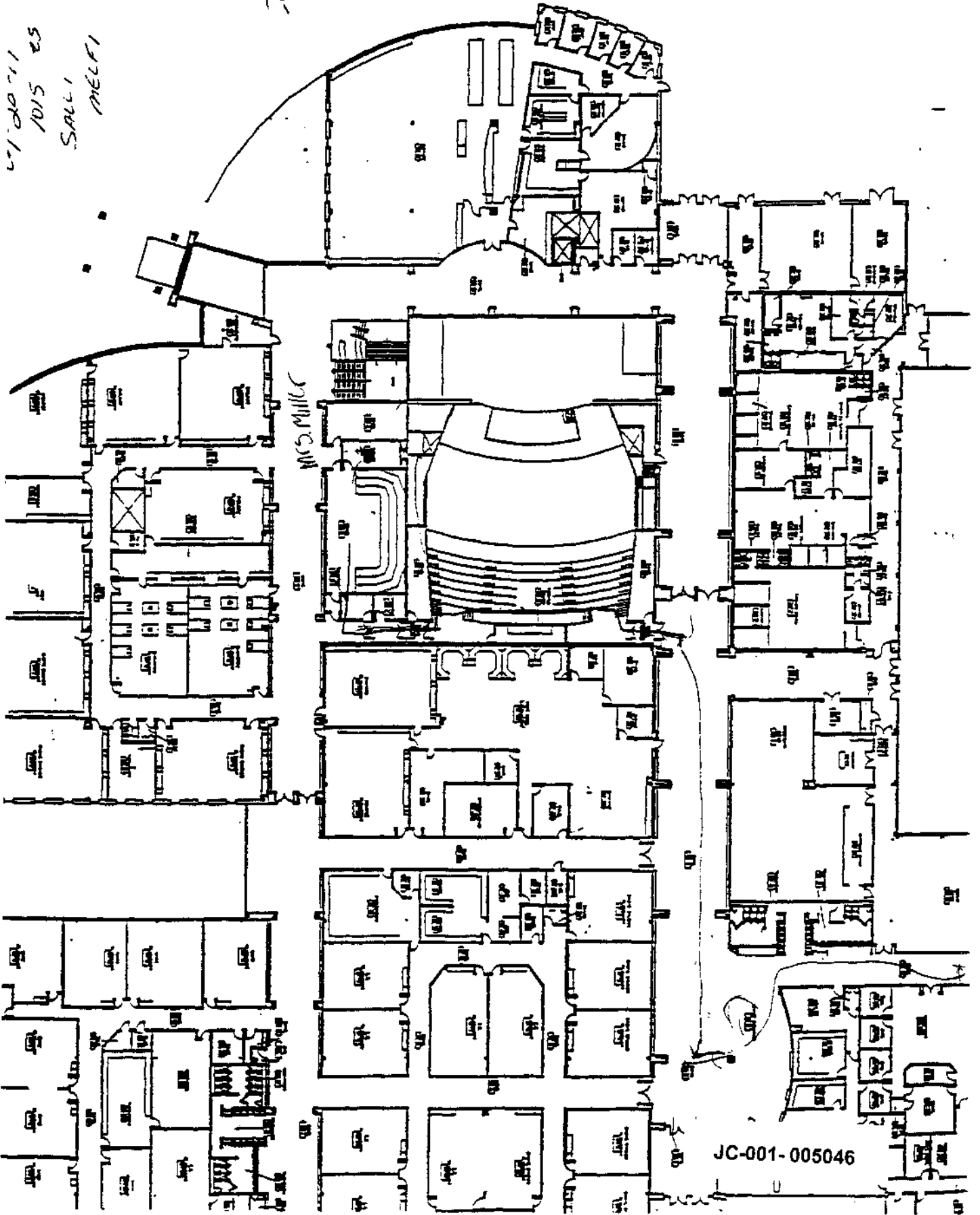
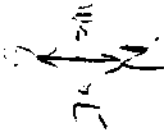
Melfi drew on a school map that I provided her the escape route she took when she found out about the shooting. A copy of that map is attached to this report.

MELFI was interviewed on June 15, 1999 by telephone from her residence, with the permission of her mother, Karen MELFI.

MELFI acknowledged that she has already been interviewed, but I explained that I needed to get some additional information in regard to her conversation with Stephanie BRESSE at the Columbine Library on April 20, 1999 following the shootings.

MELFI remembered the conversation, and I asked her about her comment that someone she knew had said the incident had been planned for a year. She said the person who told her that was Alex MARSH.

According to MELFI, MARSH was in the same world literature class as MELFI during the first semester of the 1998 – 1999 school year. In that class, MARSH was the “boisterous” person in the class. MELFI remembers that MARSH was made fun of a lot, because she would stand up in class and speak her mind about topics that were being discussed, but that her statements would evolve into “nonsense”.

On the particular day that MELFI was referring to, which she recalled was during the last part of November or the first part of December, the people who were teasing or making fun of MARSH were jocks but MELFI said they weren't the only ones who made fun of MARSH.

MELFI described MARSH as being “pretty tough”, and thought MARSH didn't have many friends, because she would see MARSH alone in the halls between classes. However, MELFI said the people with whom MARSH did associate were members of the Trench Coat Mafia. I asked who those people were, and she gave me the names of Christa HANLEY, Kristen THIEBAULT, John SAVAGE and Pauline COLBY. I asked if [REDACTED] was part of that

group, and she said he was not. She described MARSH as associating more with the "acting class" students, and [REDACTED] was associated more with the "forensics" or "debate" students. I asked if [REDACTED] was part of MARSH's group, and MELFI said he was.

MELFI told me that she spoke to MARSH, and told her that she admired her for being willing to stand up and speak out. MELFI recalls that MARSH told her, "don't worry, they're going to pay". MARSH went on, "I have a couple friends that are planning something". MARSH did not tell MELFI who the friends were, or what was being planned, except that MARSH made a comment to her that whatever it was had been planned for a year.

MELFI didn't say anything to anyone at the time because she didn't take MARSH seriously, but when the shootings happened, MELFI remembered MARSH's statements. MELFI said there was no one else present when her conversation with MARSH occurred.

On 07-28-99 at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to 5403 S. Holland Street to contact and interview Megan Morrison, who was a student at Columbine High School and has since graduated in 1999. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99.

Upon arrival at 5403 S. Holland Street, I contacted witness Megan Morrison and her mother, Janet Morrison, who was present during the interview. Megan advised me that on 04-20-99, she arrived at Columbine High School for her scheduled classes at approximately 0710 hours. Megan said she sat in the foyer area just inside of the main doors/administrative offices, while she talked to her friends prior to her first hour class. Megan had told me that she parked her vehicle (a red Ford F-150 pickup truck) in the Clement Park parking lot and then walked into Columbine High School through the east side main doors of the

school. Megan advised me that for her first hour class, she is a student assistant in the administrative offices of Columbine High School. She said during this first hour class hour, she walked from the upper level of Columbine High School, down the stairway to the lower level that leads into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Megan advised me that she went to the vending machines that are located at the "Rebel Corner" to get something out of the machines. I showed Megan the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Megan advised that she did not remember seeing either one of these items on 04-20-99 in the cafeteria/commons area or at any other location at the school. Megan said that her first hour student assistant's class was over with at 0820 hours, and she said she then went to her second hour Humanities class, which is also on the upper level of Columbine High School, and lasted from approximately 0820 to 0915 hours. Megan said she then went to her third hour Physics class on the upper level of the high school, and said this class is from approximately 0920 hours to 1015 hours. Megan advised me that she then went to her fourth hour Government Economics class on the upper level of the high school. It lasted from approximately 1020 to 1115 hours. Megan said for fifth hour, she went to Choir class, also on the upper level of the high school that began at approximately 1120 or 1130 hours. Megan advised that at the beginning of her Choir class she was inside of the classroom at a desk, when two students by the name of Katy Rutledge and Branden Reisback exited the classroom into the hallways for an unknown reason. Megan said that a minute or two later, Rutledge and Reisback came running back into the Choir room and advised their teacher, Mr. Andres, that there was someone in the cafeteria of Columbine High School with guns. Megan said she did not know if Reisback or Rutledge went to the cafeteria and actually saw the gunmen or if someone in the hallway had informed them that there were people in the cafeteria with guns. Megan said that when the student told Mr. Andres about the people with guns, Mr. Andres went out into the hallway from the classroom to try and determine what was taking place. Megan advised that while Mr. Andres was gone, she heard an unknown number of gunshots that were coming from an unknown location inside of Columbine High School. Megan said that the gunshots ceased for a few minutes and then she heard further gunshots that sounded to her as those as they were coming from the area of the cafeteria/commons area which was located directly below the Choir room that she was in. Megan advised that Mr. Andres had the students go into an office located inside of the Choir room where she hid with approximately 60 other people from this classroom. Megan said that while in this classroom, they barricaded the door that enters the office from the classroom, by putting desks up against this door. Megan advised that during this time, she heard additional gunshots that sounded like they were coming from close by. Megan said that while in hiding in this office, there was a telephone inside and the students inside stayed in contact with J.C.S.O. dispatchers so that they could

be informed of what was taking place. Megan said that also during this time she heard one bomb that was detonated that also sounded to her like it had exploded in the cafeteria/commons area directly under the office they were hiding in. Megan said that while hiding in this office, everybody tried to be quiet so that none of the suspects would be able to hear them and know what their location was. She said after approximately three and a half to four hours of hiding in this office, the 60 or so people in the room were rescued by a SWAT team. Megan said after they were checked for any possible weapons or involvement in the shooting, then they were escorted out of the school and into Clement Park where they were questioned by law enforcement officers. Megan said after being questioned, she then went to the public library located on West Bowles and Long Drive and eventually went to Leawood Elementary where she met up with her mother, Janet Morrison.

I asked Megan Morrison what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students and in particular, Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Megan said that the Trench Coat Mafia students are "just different" according to the other students at Columbine High School. Megan said that she has known Dylan Klebold since the 8th grade when they attended Ken Caryl Middle School together. Megan said that at that time, Dylan was "preppie and a jock." Megan said that's why she has a hard time believing that he was capable of committing the shootings at Columbine High School. Megan said that she did not know who Eric Harris was prior to the shooting on 04-20-99. I asked her if she knew any of the Trench Coat Mafia students or their associates, and Megan said that she knew Chris Morris from the school and said that Chris Morris had always scared her. Megan said that Chris Morris was known to pick on other people, and therefore she said everyone else also picked on Chris Morris. She said that Chris Morris wore a trench coat, combat boots, and sunglasses all of the time. Megan said that she did not have any conversations with Chris Morris other than on one occasion approximately two years ago when she asked him why he dressed in the fashion that he dressed. Megan said that he told her that "Maybe I'm normal and everybody else is not." Megan said she had not had any further conversations with him. Megan said that she knew who Brooks Brown was and that he seemed nice to her. Megan said that Brooks Brown began wearing a trench coat she believed during his junior year at Columbine High School. Megan said that she knew Tad Boles who she believed was a Trench Coat Mafia student, and said he had dropped out of the Columbine High School approximately March of 1999. She said that he was friends with the other Trench Coat Mafia students, and said he always wore his trench coat. Megan said that at times Tad Boles had a bad attitude toward other people and life in general. Megan said that she knew who Robert Perry was from Columbine High School, and he said that he was always ridiculed by other students due to the fact that he had no friends, painted his fingernails black, said

he never showered, and said he was teased due to his style of dress. Megan said that Robert Perry was friends with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris.

Megan Morrison said that during the fall of 1998 while she was employed at Miller Stockman at the Southwest Plaza, Tad Boles came into the store a lot and also said that she had seen Brooks Brown in there. Megan said that several of the Trench Coat Mafia students bought their trench coats in this Miller Stockman store at the Southwest Plaza. Megan said that these trench coats were usually made with an oiled type of material to make them water repellent, and said that they were heavy to wear. Megan said that these trench coats would cost approximately \$100 and if they were lined would cost more than \$200. She did say that Miller Stockman carried leather trench coats or dusters, however, they were very expensive to buy.

As previously stated, Megan Morrison advised that she did not know Eric Harris prior to the shooting on 04-20-99. Megan did say however that she had seen Eric Harris in the hallways of Columbine High School. She said he would wear black jeans, and a white T-shirt. She said that at times Eric would wear his trench coat, however, this was not all the time. Megan said when she saw Eric Harris in the hallways, he "always looked in a hurry and angry."

I asked Megan if she knew who Isaiah Shoels was, and she said yes, she knew who he was, however, she did not know him well. I asked Megan if she had ever witnessed any type of racial harassment or racial intimidation by anyone toward Isaiah Shoels. Megan said that she had never seen him racially harassed or intimidated and said that he was a very nice person and everybody liked him. Megan also said that she had never seen any of the other minority students at Columbine High School racially harassed or picked on.

Megan Morrison advised me that on 04-20-99 she did not at any time see any of the gunmen/shooters or any suspects with firearms and/or an explosive device. Megan said in fact that on 04-20-99, she did not see anyone who she would consider to be a Trench Coat Mafia student or associate in the cafeteria or any other location at Columbine High School.

I advised Janet and Megan Morrison that should anyone one in their family want to speak with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate in the future, to contact me and I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time. Megan Morrison said that she would contact me in the future if she thought of any other information that she felt may be pertinent to this investigation.

Layne Newton told me on 04-20-99 she arrived at Columbine High School at approximately 0729 hours, which was just in time to get to her first hour class that began at 0730. Layne said when she arrived at the school, she walked from the parking lot area of the school and then walked up the outside stairway on the west side of the school and entered the doorway at the top of these stairs. She said she then went to her first hour Physics class on the upper level of the school. Layne said after her Physics class, she went to the following classes which are all located on the upper level of Columbine High School, second hour, Math, third hour, English, fourth hour, Government Economics and then to her fifth hour Choir class. Layne said the Choir class begins at 1115 hours, and said on 04-20-99 she got to this class a couple of minutes early and sat down at her desk in the classroom. Layne said her teacher by the name of Mr. Andres was in the class talking when she arrived and sat down. Layne said during the first few minutes of this Choir class, the students are allowed to go to the restroom or get a drink, etc while the teacher is taking roll call. Layne said a student by the name of Branden Reisback went out of the Choir classroom during this time on 04-20-99, and Layne said he came running back into the classroom and told everybody in this classroom to "Get out of here. Someone's shooting downstairs." Layne said about this same time period, two students (names are unknown but Layne said she believes they were freshman students) ran into this Choir classroom and were hysterical. Layne said she and other Choir students ran out of the Choir room into a hallway, then ran into the auditorium at Columbine High School. Layne said when she got into the auditorium she tried to hide behind some chairs. Layne said she was behind the chairs for approximately thirty seconds and said she then saw what she believed was smoke coming underneath the auditorium door from the area of the cafeteria. She said the cafeteria was located on the opposite of this door than the side that she was on. Layne said she therefore got up and exited the auditorium through another door, and said she heard what she believed were three to four gunshots in the area of the hallway. Layne said she was running with a friend of hers by the name of Charlie Simmons. She said Charlie Simmons told her later that while he was running with her, one of the gunmen's bullets shattered a window next to him. Layne said she did not personally see this occur but said she did hear the shots. Layne said at no time on 04-20-99 did she see the gunmen and/or suspects with firearms or explosive devices. Layne said after hearing the gunshots she then exited Columbine High School by running out of the doors located by the teachers' parking lot and said she then ran northbound into Clement Park where Coach Peter Horvatch told her to keep running away from the area of the school. Layne said she ran to a friend of hers by the name of Erica Jennings' house, which backs up to South Pierce Street in the area of West Fair Drive.

Layne Newton told me on 04-20-99 she did not go into the cafeteria at Columbine High School at any time.

I asked Layne Newton what information she could provide to me in reference to the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students, and specifically what she could tell me about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Layne said she went to Ken Caryl Middle School with Dylan Klebold. She said she did not remember anything unusual about Dylan Klebold during this time. Layne said two to three weeks prior to the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, she had Dylan Klebold in a History class of hers. She said for a project in this History class, the students were told to pick a partner to work with on this project. Layne said she noticed that Dylan Klebold did not have a partner, so she asked him if he wanted to be her partner. Layne said Dylan Klebold got upset and turned her offer down, refusing to be her partner. Layne said prior to the shooting on 04-20-99, she knew who Eric Harris was, but did not know anything about him. Layne said she knows who Robert Perry is and said he was in an Advanced English class with her during the first semester of 1999. She said she remembered Robert Perry gave the teacher in this class trouble. She said Robert Perry would not talk to anybody in the class. Layne said she believed Robert Perry dropped out of Columbine High School during the Spring of 1999. Layne said she had Tad Boles in her Concert Choir class during the Fall of 1998, and said she did not know if Boles was a Trench Coat Mafia student or a Trench Coat Mafia associate, but said he did wear a trench coat. Layne said she knows who Brooks Brown is, and said she "would not trust him at all." Layne also described Brooks Brown as being "a good talker." Layne said that since the shooting she has heard rumors that [REDACTED] was involved with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris and was going to help them during the shooting at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, however, [REDACTED] "chickened out." She said it is unknown where this information came from. Layne said a friend of hers by the name of Erica Jennings told her that she saw Brooks Brown walking on South Pierce Street just prior to the shooting on 04-20-99.

Initially the class was joking around and they started warming up to sing. It became quiet in the room. Brandon Reisbebeck, ran in and said there were people shooting downstairs. They thought it was a senior prank. Then they heard some bombs.

Half the kids went out the doors, the other half stayed in the class. Alicia was later told that the half which left, went into the auditorium. As they were attempting to leave, a gunman came. The group went downstairs, then went out through the commons doors.

Since the incident, about 120 students have gotten together and talked about it. When asked what happened in the room without a teacher, Alicia stated that a kid took charge. She identified the person as:

Alicia relates she did not see the gunman. When this occurred, she was shoved into the choir office. Alicia indicates they heard shots, bombs and screaming. At one point, a custodian came in and told everyone to get down. She identified the custodian as Jay.

Alicia related that Foss pushed filing cabinets up against the door. There was a phone in the office and someone had a cell phone with them. Kids in the office called their parents and told them to call 911. The person with the cell phone was a senior, who was identified as:

CURRY, KENDRA

This Investigator asked Alicia if she ever looked at a clock. She related there is not a clock in the office. During some of the calls to the parents, they were telling the students to turn off the lights in the room and to push stuff in front of the door. So they used desks and filing cabinets.

While in the room Alicia said it became hot and she wanted to know about her sister. Alicia tried calling her parents. Foss tried to calm her down. At one point, Foss backhanded Alicia because she was getting out of control. Alicia sat down and cried.

Finally the SWAT team came. The students opened the door from the inside. They took the students out ten by ten. When she looked at the clock it was 1525 hrs. Alicia's parents said she is on the video of the students leaving the school. Alicia is wearing a yellow jacket. It took the SWAT team about 10 to 15 minutes to get them all out.

When they left, they went downstairs to the cafeteria. They went in front of the kitchen, then out the side door. They went up the stairs, past the two guys that were dead. They ended up in a little corner at the north west part of the building.

This Investigator asked Alicia when they first knew something was wrong. She indicated Choir class is 5th hour. The class starts at 1115 hrs. At about 1130 hrs. is when they knew something was wrong.

Alicia described her back pack as Navy Blue, "Collection" Series. The back pack is fabric with an emblem on the flap. The emblem is the letter "C". It is also not really a back pack, it is described more as a purse. It is located in the chemistry room. Contained in the purse is a five star day timer. There are also lots of papers which have her name on them. Her glasses are also in her purse.

In regards to the shooters, Alicia related the following information. She knew Eric Harris. She had a class with him, Creative Writing. The teacher was Ms. Kelly. She said Harris was really intelligent and always nice to her. They use to make fun of the teacher.

Alicia talked about a incident that happened several months ago, possibly after their spring break, which was from 03-16- to 03-20. In Creative Writing, one of their papers, they were to identify a character or object as a person.

In the paper written by Harris, his object was a bullet and his best friend was a shotgun. They got into their discussion groups and they were to pick the best one. Alicia believes that Harris read his paper to the class. She believes that possibly the paper was turned in. These papers were written shortly after spring break. Alicia related everything Harris wrote was really dark.

In regards to the school announcements for the day, Alicia relates her second period is Economics. She does not listen to the announcements. Her sister, Sarah, stated there is always a quote of the day. She possibly remembers something in the quote as this might be a bad day.

Alicia asked this Investigator about Brooks Brown. She indicated she has known Brooks for about two years. She indicated Brooks hung out with Dylan. Brooks did a lot of plays and Dylan ran the sound board. Alicia related she hung out with Brooks last year all of the time.

Alicia indicated Brooks told her last year someone was threatening him. Brooks did not tell Alicia who it was. She said he was scared. Brooks did not know what he had done to make someone mad.

This Investigator asked Alicia if Brooks ever told her someone was setting off explosions and she said no. Brooks brother Aaron told Alicia that Brooks knew somebody who was making bombs. Richard then asked this Investigator what information had been obtained reference any other participants. Richard stated that while he was at Lea Wood Elementary School, waiting for information about his two daughters, he talked with two girls who came from the school.

The girls said they had seen two guys in the cafeteria, wearing all black. There were also two guys who entered the main door from the parking lot. One was in black, the other in white. The girls said they all had guns. The two girls were in a group of six to eight girls. Richard described the girls as one having short, darker hair. The other girl had medium blond hair.

One of the Sheriff's Deputies spoke to the girls at the door and sent them in to sign up. He described the deputy as being a big guy.

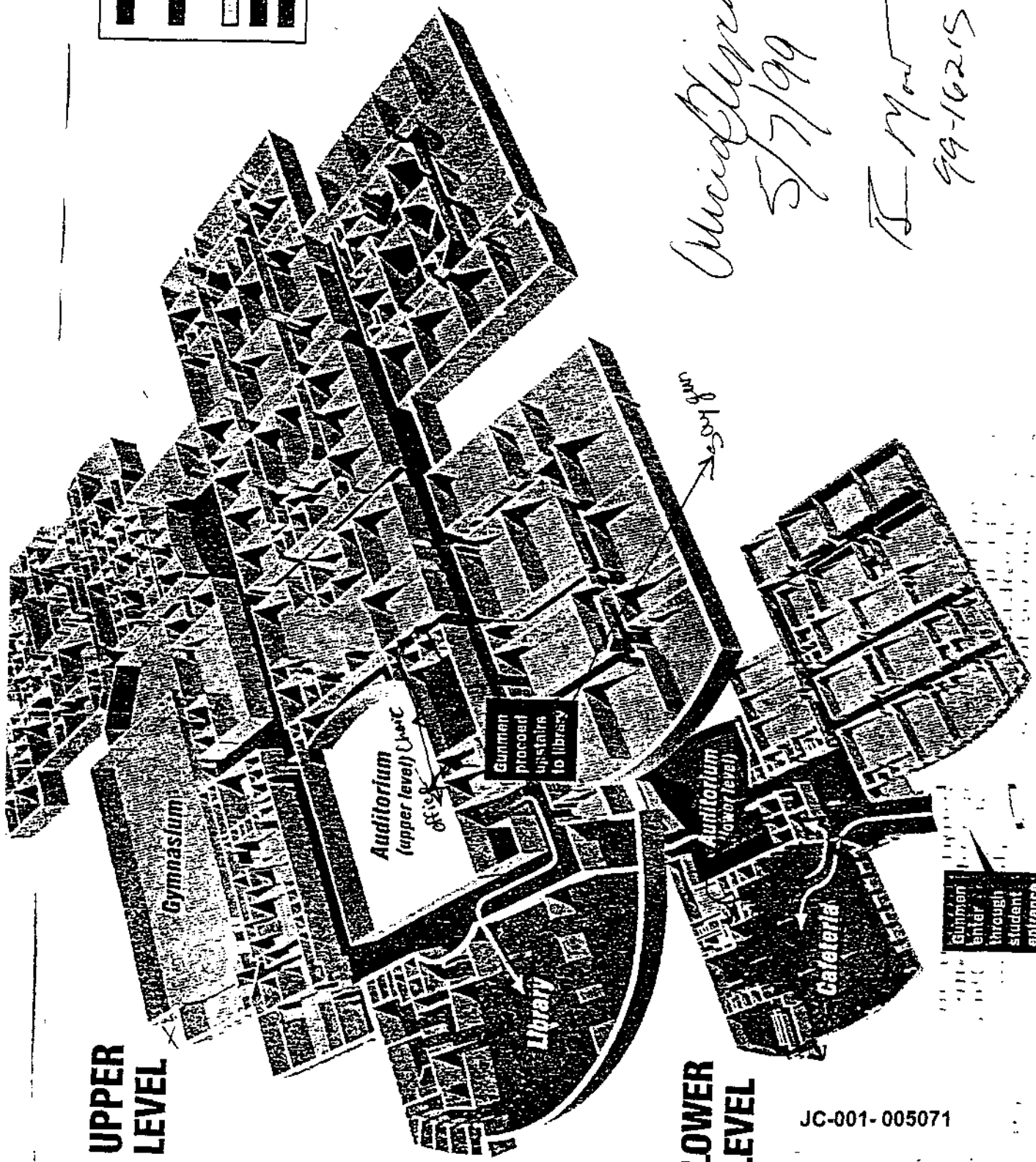

The Reporting Agent conducted an initial interview on April 20, 1999, with Amanda PETERSEN. A follow-up interview was conducted with PETERSEN on August 11, 1999. PETERSEN stated she was in the choir room when the incident began. She stated Brandon REISBECK came into the choir room from the hallway and told everyone there was someone shooting in the commons area. She stated he did not say who it was. PETERSEN stated the students in the choir room became confused and everybody started to get down on the floor. She stated just after REISBECK stated someone was shooting, she heard several firecracker type sounds coming from the commons area. PETERSEN stated students in the choir room divided into two groups. She stated a lot of students went from the choir room to the auditorium, and the group she was with went into a back office area. She stated Ms MILLER, CHS teacher, came into the room and told all the students to be quiet. PETERSEN stated she continued to hear shooting, and could also hear students running through the halls of the school. She stated MILLER left the room.

PETERSEN stated there was a phone in the office and several of the students she was with called their parents. She stated CHS student, Joshua ORTWINE called 911 from the phone and told the police what was going on. PETERSEN stated she and the other students waited approximately 3 hours, and then the SWAT team came in the room and evacuated them to the park. She stated she never saw any of the students with a gun, and saw nothing unusual during the school day before the incident began. She stated her only knowledge of the KLEYBOLD and HARRIS was from her

On August 11, 1999, at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to 7324 South Yukon Court to contact and interview witness Amanda Marie Peterson, who was a graduated student of Columbine High School as of 1999. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Amanda's mother, Cynthia Peterson, was present during the interview.

Amanda Peterson said on April 20, 1999, she drove her vehicle (a blue Subaru station wagon) to Columbine High School and had her sister, Valerie Peterson, with her. Amanda said she arrived at the high school between 0715 hours and 0730 hours on that date. She parked her vehicle in the Columbine High School seniors parking lot in parking space #27. Amanda said after parking her vehicle she entered Columbine High School through the doors that are located across from the "Rebel Corner." This door leads into the cafeteria/commons area of Columbine High School. Amanda said her first hour class is Spanish and said the class is on the lower level of the high school. She said when she entered the school and walked to this classroom she

does not remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the cafeteria/commons area. I showed Amanda the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. She said she did not see either item, however, she said she did not go into the cafeteria. She said when she entered the school door she turned to her right, away from the cafeteria, to go to her classroom. Amanda said her first hour class lasted from 0730 hours to 0820 hours, and said she then went to her second hour Government Economics class that was located on the upper level of the school. She said this class lasted form 0825 to 0920 hours. Amanda said she then went to her third hour Math class on the upper level of the school and said this class lasted from 0925 to 1015 hours. Amanda said next she went to her fourth hour Creative Writing class, located on the upper level of the school, and said this class lasted from 1020 hours to 1110 hours. After the Creative Writing class, Amanda said she went to her fifth hour Choir class, which is also on the upper level of Columbine High School, and said she arrived at the Choir room at approximately 1115 hours on 04-20-99. Amanda said the Choir class began singing and then Brandon Reisbeck came running into the choir classroom from the hallway and told the teacher, Mr Andres, to stop because somebody inside of Columbine High School was shooting. Amanda said at this point, she heard an unknown number of what she believed were gunshots. Amanda said the gunshots sounded to her like they were coming from the downstairs area of Columbine High School, but she said she could not determine if the gunshots were from inside or outside of the school. Amanda said some of the gunshots sounded like fireworks going off and said others sounded louder. I asked Amanda if she had ever shot a firearm or been present when a firearm was shot. She said when she was very young she was present, possibly with her grandparents, when a firearm was shot, however, did not recall exactly how it sounded. Amanda said after hearing the shots, she heard the fire alarm go off and then heard people in the hallways outside of the classroom running and screaming. She said Mr. Andres told everybody in her classroom to get down on the floor, so she did so. Amanda said she was down on the floor for approximately one minute and then another teacher by the name of Ms. Miller began waving the students into an office that is located next to the Choir room. Amanda said there were approximately 60 people in this office hiding. She said there was a telephone in the office that they were hiding in and said someone was on the phone with J.C.S.O during the time they were hiding. Amanda said the people hiding in this office barricaded the door by putting file cabinets and desks against the door to try and keep any of the suspects from gaining entry into this office. Amanda said the people in this office remained in there for approximately 3 to 3 1/2 hours until SWAT rescued them, and she said this was at approximately 1430 hours on 04-20-99. Amanda said SWAT took them out through the Columbine High School auditorium, down and across the stage, then out of the school through the cafeteria/commons door located by the faculty lounge on the west side of the

cafeteria. Amanda said they then all ran up a hill where police vehicles transported them to Clement Park.

I asked Amanda Peterson what she know about the Trench Coat Mafia, the Trench Coat Mafia students, and particularly what she knew about Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Amanda said during the 1997/1998 school year at Columbine High School, she believed there were many more Trench Coat Mafia students than there were during the 1998/1999 school year. She said that although she knew very little about the Trench Coat Mafia and Trench Coat Mafia students, she could remember seeing students wearing trench coats more frequently during the 1997/1998 school year. Amanda said, however, that she did not believe that the only students wearing trench coats were Trench Coat Mafia students or Trench Coat Mafia associates. Amanda believed that the only students wearing trench coats were trench coat mafia students or Trench Coat Mafia associates. Amanda said she believed that other students other than them wore trench coats as well. Amanda said that during the first semester of 1999, she had a Creative Writing class at Columbine High School and the teacher was Mrs. Kelly. Amanda said also in this class were Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, and Brooks Brown. They were not in attendance in this class on 04-20-99. Amanda said she did not associate with any Trench Coat Mafia students or associates, nor did she pay much attention to them and therefore could not provide much information about them. She said that she thought of Dylan Klebold as "a kind of funny guy" and said he would "joke" with other people. She said both Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris would wear their trench coats. however, she said they would not wear them all the time, especially if it was hot. Amanda said Eric Harris seemed to her as "a serious person" and said he "was quiet and withdrawn." Amanda told me that Brooks Brown was in this class also, and said he may have worn a trench coat, however, she could not remember for sure. She described Brooks Brown as "really outgoing and loud." She said Brooks Brown was tall and skinny. Amanda said Nate Dykeman "was goofy looking." Amanda said she did not pay any attention to them to know if they were associated with just Trench Coat Mafia students and associates or if they would associate with other people in the class. She said that she did not remember observing anybody harass the people that she believed were Trench Coat Mafia students, nor did she remember the Trench Coat Mafia students or associates harass other people.

School during most of the time that it was taking place, and said she not remember seeing Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris present at this after prom party.

Amanda Peterson said she did not know Isaiah Shoels, however, she knew who he was, and has seen Isaiah in the hallways of Columbine High School. Amanda described Isaiah Shoels as seeming like a "pretty tough kid." Amanda said she did not remember seeing anyone racially harass or racially intimidate Isaiah Shoels.

Amanda Peterson said she does not know of anybody, nor has she heard rumors of anybody, manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing, buying or selling firearms.

Amanda Peterson said during the second hour government Economics class, the Rebel News Network (RNN) is usually on, however, she did not know what the "Thought of the Day" was on 04-20-99.

Amanda Peterson told me when she left Columbine High School on 04-20-99, she left her backpack, described as a blue Jansport with contents, in the Choir room of Columbine High School. Amanda said she has since picked up her backpack and contents from Columbine High School.

I asked Amanda Peterson and her mother, Cynthia Peterson, how they have been doing and how the rest of their family has been doing since the incident on 04-20-99. Amanda said that she has been doing well and her mother also said that Amanda has been doing well. Cynthia advised that she has seen a therapist on occasion since the incident and feels that she is doing fairly well at the present. I gave both Amanda Peterson and Cynthia Peterson one of my business cards and asked them to contact me in the future should them or any one of their family members want to speak with J.C.S.O. Victim advocate. I advised them I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

DISPOSITION: Case is open, pending further investigation.

Scott advised the following:

That Scott went to school with Eric (Harris) and they played on the same soccer team for the last Two to three years.

That Scott stated that he considered Eric a good friend on the soccer team, although they did not Socialize with each other outside of soccer other than saying Hi to each other in the halls at school.

That Scott remembered that Eric would cuss in German on the soccer field and stated that Eric did have a temper but it was no worse than anyone else on the team.

That Scott described Eric as a nice kid and stated that he watched Eric's behavior start to change The middle of his junior year (1998), stating that Eric became introverted and got to the point that he did not talk with people.

That Scott knew Dylan (Klebold) for the past four years and stated that he and Dylan used to sit Together at lunch, although did not socialize with each other outside of school or since that time.

That Scott was aware that Eric and Dylan had a web site, which he visited a couple of times about two years ago, and described it as "militaristic" stating that they posted things like, "Vodka and Reb egged a house tonight".

That Scott had heard rumor that Eric had architected a "doom level of his neighborhood and school", but stated that he never saw it.

That Scott did not believe that Eric was really a member of the TCM and stated that Eric was an outcast like the members of the TCM, so he hung out with them.

That Scott further advised that Eric was an outcast because he chose to be.

That the people that used to tease Eric and Dylan were Seniors and graduated last year, so Scott did not understand why Eric and Dylan would do this to the kid's that had never done anything to them.

That on the day before the incident (041999) at about 1:25 p.m., Scott saw Eric and Dylan leaning Against the wall by the gym (at CHS), and as Scott passed them, he and Eric said Hi to each other.

That Eric never said anything to Scott that would indicate that he planned to do this.

Brandon Reisbeck, date of birth December 13, 1979, 6391 West Brittany Place, Littleton, Colorado, was telephonically interviewed. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the interview, Reisbeck furnished the following information:

Reisbeck is a Senior at Columbine High School. His first period class and second period class are in the Ace classroom. This is a joint class with Mr. Tucker and Miss Gomez. First period runs from 7:30 a.m. to 8:20 a.m. Second period runs from 8:25 a.m. to 9:20 a.m. Second period is an additional five minutes to allow the school announcements to be made. The announcements are made on the Rebel News Network which is broadcast over televisions within the classrooms. On April 20, 1999, Reisbeck did not watch the announcements. His third period class is gym with Coach Place and Coach Lowry. This class runs from 9:25 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. His fourth period class runs from 10:20 a.m. to 11:10 a.m. and is economics with Miss Kay. Fifth period class runs from 11:15 a.m. to 12:05 p.m. This class is choir and is held in the choir room with Mr. Andreas, Sr.

During fifth period on April 20, 1999, Reisbeck was in choir and the choir had just begun warming up. Students are allowed to leave the choir room to get a drink of water at a fountain located across the hall against a science room. At approximately 11:20 to 11:25 a.m., Reisbeck went to get a drink of water. Another student from his class, Julie Cole, was also getting a drink of water from the fountain. Reisbeck, after getting a drink of water, heard two sounds he thought were gunshots. As he was walking back to the room students came running up the stairs from the cafeteria. The students were screaming "he has a gun." Reisbeck stepped into the choir room and yelled to the class "they're shooting and they have a gun." Mr. Andreas told everyone to "sit down, sit down." Reisbeck thought Mr. Andreas wanted to figure out what was happening before letting the students go. Reisbeck did not sit down but ran out of the classroom and headed into the auditorium. Numerous other kids from the choir room also ran into the auditorium.

Within the auditorium were students from the choir room, cafeteria and a class that was being held on the auditorium stage. After getting in the auditorium he heard an explosion that sounded like it came from behind the stage and appeared to be downstairs in the commons. He then heard several gunshots which sounded like they were also coming from behind the stage. He does not specifically remember how many gunshots he heard. He then ran to the north side of the auditorium exiting into the main hallway. He looked left, or west, down the hallway and could see that the fire doors were closed. He turned right and went down the hallway and was told by Mr. Ken Holden, a Counselor, to go down the hallway by the counselor's office. He ran down that hallway and exited out the doors located on the left side of that hallway and on the north side of the gymnasium. He then ran to the "smoker's pit" located near the tennis courts. He then started jumping fences until he ran into Clement Park.

Reisbeck only heard gunshots and explosions and never saw any gunmen.

Reisbeck has a black Jansport backpack that he left under his seat in the choir room. The backpack contained books and schoolwork. Also left under his seat was a North Carolina baseball hat. Reisbeck does not have a locker and only uses his backpack.

Reisbeck saw in the media a picture of the Trenchcoat Mafia which included Bryan Sargent. Sargent is in Reisbeck's first and fourth period classes. Reisbeck does not recall him being in those classes on April 20, 1999. Brooks Brown is a member of the fifth period choir class. Reisbeck does not remember if Brown was in the choir class on April 20, 1999.

Smaldone stated that she was in the Choir room (**Note:** The Choir room is across the room from the science rooms) and someone came running into the Choir room stating, "A kid's shooting." Smaldone said everyone decided to go into the Choir room office and upon asking her how many people went in there, she stated she believed there was approximately 60 kids in this office. Smaldone said they heard shooting and she stated that she felt this was about 1145 hours. She said that they then barricaded the door to the office and someone called 9-1-1 from the office phone, at which time they told the operator on the other end of the line what was going on. Smaldone said that they then heard yelling later on, but she was unsure if this was the police or the suspects yelling. Smaldone stated that she never did see the suspects or any injured people.
