On 042999 Tiffany Burk was contacted in connection with lead 2014. Tiffany provided the following information:

Tiffany was not at school at the time of the shooting. She had gone to King Soopers to pickup some pictures.

Tiffany had no relationship with Dylon Klebold. She had a Philosophy class with Eric Harris. She described both individuals as very nice and polite. She could not believe that either one committed the crimes as indicated by the media. She had no other personal information to add to the case relating to Harris or Klebold.

Tiffany stated that it was rumored through the school that a video showing the destruction of the school was to be shown over the RNN Network. The network is the closed circuit system in the school. She thought that video showing was halted by the administration.

Tiffany stated that she has been friends with Robyn Anderson for the last four years. She has given an interview to the Rocky Mountain News which was part of an article in the 042999 edition. Tiffany stated that Robyn never commented about Eric, Dylon, weapons, or any plans to do any of the things related to the shootings. Tiffany was aware that Robyn had an attorney and was possibly looking at charges. Tiffany had no other information.

That Tiffany knew Dylan through her friend, Robin Anderson, and hung out with them a couple of Times (between January 1999 and April 1999).

That during the time Tiffany was with Dylan he never mentioned anything that could be related to This incident.

That Robin is still trying to "figure this out", and has not said anything to Tiffany about guns, Plans regarding this incident, or comments made by Dylan relating to this incident.

That Tiffany denied having any knowledge related to Robin providing Eric or Dylan with guns.

That Tiffany knew Eric because they were in the same philosophy class this semester, and Described Eric as somewhat "anti-social", and stated that she only had casual conversations With Eric in class and stated that he didn't say anything to her that is related to this incident.

That during the incident, Tiffany was at the King Soopers located at Coalmine and Pierce, picking Up some prom pictures.

In regards to 5th hour, Burns indicated she has both lunches off. She left after the class at 1110 hrs. She was waiting for a friend for about five minutes. Burns identified the friend as:

LAGOS, ATHENA

Lagos never showed up as she was in the Library. Lagos later told Burns she was sitting in the library when the gunmen came in. Nielsen came in before them. Lagos related the gunmen said at one point, the bomb was not working that he had in his hand. They also indicated they had to go get some more.

Burns was waiting for Lagos at the top of the stairs, just down from the library. Burns indicated she did not hear anything suspicious. Burns went downstairs to her car, which was parked in space #21. This is the parking space closest to the school.

When Burns left, she did not know that anything was wrong. After arriving home, she was subsequently contacted by her dad. He called at about 1215 hrs. Her dad told her to turn on the news. Burns indicated her parking space is located outside to the right of the doors.

This Investigator asked if she knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold? Burns indicated she knew Klebold slightly. Her mom use to baby sit for Klebold when they were in the 4th and 5th grades.

Burns indicated the trench coat group is not a big thing at school. She did not even know that Harris and Klebold were part of the group. This Investigator asked Burns if she went to After Prom? She indicated she did, however, she does not remember if Harris or Klebold were there. Burns was at the After Prom from about 0030 hrs. to about 0400 hrs.

Of the two suspects, Burns indicated she knows Klebold better. Burns related she is surprised that Klebold did something like this. Per Burns, Klebold was a follower. Burns also related she had no idea they were involved with explosives.

They arrived after her. Burns said they seemed really nice then. This occurred at the end of their junior year.

It is unknown to Burns why Harris and Klebold picked the parking spaces they did. No further information was obtained.

Jacqueline was not at school on April 20, 1999. She attends dental hygiene classes outside of Columbine in the mornings and attends classes at Columbine in the afternoon. She was on her way to school when she learned about the incident.

Jacqueline had one class last year with Eric HARRIS. She knows no other members of the Trench Coat Mafia. She told her mother that Eric had changed since she had class with him in that he used to dress "preppie" and dresses differently now.

She had no information on the incident. She uses the E-mail in the Internet, but has no screen name. She left nothing behind in the school.

On 05-19-99, I spoke to Rebekah Campbell. This lead was to determine Rebekah's whereabouts during fifth period, as records reflect she has this period free. During my telephone interview with her, she told me that she was just leaving the school when students started running out of the building. She said at that time she did not know why, but continued to leave the school and went to New York Bagels to have lunch. She said after lunch she had attempted to return to the school, but had been turned around by road blocks surrounding the school, and was told that there was a gunmen inside. She said she then went to the mall, where she went to a furniture store and watched the news. Rebekah told me she did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold and has not personally heard anything that would be of benefit to this investigation. She did tell me that a friend of hers, Jennifer Christianson, had said that she had saw a third gunmen and that this person was seen taking a trench coat off. A lead will be developed to be sure that Jennifer, aka Jenny, has been or will be interviewed.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY DETECTIVE JACKSON:

On April 20, 1999 at approximately 11:49 hours to respond to Pierce Street and Leewood Street on an assist to Jefferson County S.O. on a critical incident at Columbine High School.

On arrival I assisted with postings and other functions at the command post. As students and teachers were able to exit the building, I assisted with interviewing these subjects and collected written statements from these subjects. These statements were subsequently turned over to Jeffco.

I spoke to several school personnel who gave possible associate names of David Caravan, who was expelled from the school around October or November of 1998, and Eric Dutro, who is not currently a student at Columbine High School.

One of the involved students, Adam Hancey, did also advise me that a John Savage had been involved with the Trenchcoat Mafia Gang in the past, and would know a lot about them, but didn't seem to be closely associated with them this year, and hadn't been seen by him wearing a trenchcoat this school year.

I was also advised that the following people were reportedly in the office area of the school at the time of the incident, I did not personally contact any of these victims: Kiki Leyba, Sidney Keating, Jan Fielder, Chris Wikesell, Peter Horvath, Frank D'Angelo, Mona Madden, Darlene Mesch, and Judy Grecko.

I was advised that I would be assigned to a lab team for the school, and remained on standby until approximately 2230 hours, when I was released for the night.

ON 5-3-99 A PHONE MESSAGE WAS LEFT AT THE CARPENTER RESIDENCE TO SET UP AN INTERVIEW WITH KELLI CARPENTER. AT 1200 HOURS HER MOTHER, PATRICIA CARPENTER LEFT A VOICE MAIL MESSAGE FOR DET. POLAK, STATING THAT NEITHER KELLI NOR SCOTT WERE AT SCHOOL AT THE TIME OF THE SHOOTING AND NEITHER LEFT ANYTHING BEHIND.

DET. POLAK DID CONTACT KELLI CARPENTER BY PHONE AT HER HOME. KELLI VERIFIED THAT SHE HAD AN ORTHODONTIST APPOINTMENT ON 4-20-99 AND WAS NOT AT SCHOOL. HER ORTHODONTIST IS DR. URBANIAK. SHE ALSO EXPLAINED THAT SHE USUALLY SITS WITH HER FRIENDS, INCLUDING NICOLE (JANDA), HOWEVER SHE WAS NOT WITH THEM ON TUESDAY.

KELLI ALSO EXPLAINED THAT HER BROTHER, SCOTT, WAS AWAY FROM THE CAMPUS, GETTING LUNCH. SHE STATED THAT SHE HAS NO ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE SHOOTING, THE SUSPECTS, OR THE MAKING OF EXPLOSIVES.

I have read the foregoing statement and the facts contained therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I do not maintain that it contains all of the facts or details of the incident, but only those facts about which I have been asked.

Once he reached the school, he told me he parked his vehicle in the Senior parking lot space #153, and he entered the school through the south entrance, which is also known as Rebel Corner, and proceeded to class. Jeremy was asked if he observed anything out of the ordinary while he was in the Senior parking lot, and he was asked if he saw either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. He stated he didn't see anything out of the ordinary, and did not see Klebold or Harris.

At about 0930 hours, Jeremy was released from his second hour video class, at which time he told me he left campus with Chris Jones, and they went to Nick Zupancic's home. I asked Jeremy if he drove his car to Nick's house. He said he did not, that his younger brother took his car, and he caught a ride with Chris Jones to Nick's house.

On 5/12/99, Kimberley Chlumsky, DOB 6/18/82, 6516 South Saulsbury Court, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. She was interviewed in the presence of her Mother, Laura Chlumsky, DOB 12/6/54. She provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Kimberley arrived at the Columbine High School, at approximately 7:15 a.m., and reported to her normal classes. Her last class prior to first period lunch was studio art. She went directly to the cafeteria with her friend Marcie Visnic. They initially sat at table R or possibly W. Instead of eating lunch in the cafeteria, they decided to drive to Marcie's house. When they exited the school, they exited on the south side of the cafeteria and walked to the junior parking lot. They didn't take note of anyone in the parking lot at the time. They left the school and went to Marcie's before the shooting incident commenced. After they ate lunch at Marcie's, they attempted to drive back to school, but the roads were all blocked off by law enforcement. As they drove back in the vicinity of Kimberley's house, they observed Brooks Brown enter a sport utility vehicle, possibly blue in color, in the vicinity of Hoover and Teller Avenues in Littleton, only about 4-5 blocks from Columbine High School. Kimberley knew this to be Brooks Brown, because he is in a world history class with her. They then went back to Kimberley's house, and watched the news coverage on television.

At no time did Kimberley see anyone carrying duffel bags or packages that stood out in her mind, or that seemed out of the ordinary. She had seen Klebold and Harris as well as other Trench Coat Mafia (TCM) members/associates around school, but didn't know or socialize with any of them. She doesn't recall seeing either Klebold or Harris around school on either Monday or Tuesday. She also doesn't recall seeing any other TCM members around school on Monday or Tuesday, however she also added that she doesn't pay much attention to TCM members to begin with.

Kimberley has never heard of other suspects, gun buying or bomb making either before or after the shooting. She does use the Internet, but does not have a screen name or ICQ account number.





Jason is on the "A" lunch schedule. He confirmed that he is an A lunch student, but usually leaves the school for lunch. He stated on 4/20/99 he left the school with his girlfriend Emily Haggner. They left together through the front doors by the administration around 11:15am, and went to SW Plaza for lunch. Jason did not see anyone carrying a large duffle bag, or anything suspicious or odd outside the school at this time. He and Emily left the school in Emily's car. They did not hear anything about the shooting until they were returning around 11:50am. They saw some students at Bowles and Wadsworth who told them what was going on. Jason or Emily did not return to CHS.

Jason had no further information on the shootings.

On May 24, 1999, this investigator met with Eric Christner at his residence. Present during the interview was his mother, Jan Christner.

Eric advised that on the day of the incident, he and another student, Josh Swanson had left the school and were at Josh's residence from about 11:15 a.m. until some thirty minutes later when they returned to the area and observed Nate Dykeman at Woodmar Park. He said they did not know what had occurred at the school until they heard about it on the radio.

Eric stated that he knew both Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. He said that he first met Harris while they had been in the same German class. He advised that he, Harris, and Klebold all attended the early hour bowling class. Asked if he knew whether or not Klebold and Harris had been in that bowling class on April 20th, he replied that he thought they had been there but now was not so sure. He

stated that a person by the name of Carrie Savey might have a better memory of that. Eric stated that Harris was a very intelligent person who liked working with computers. He said Harris liked German "industrial " music and American "techno-music." He described Harris as a person who was nice, polite, and quiet, and who did not talk very much. He was aware that Harris had worked at the Blackjack Pizza and commented that he and Nate Dykeman would often go there and have lunch with Harris. He explained that he was more of a friend to Dykeman than to Harris but because Dykeman was friends with Harris and Klebold, he would often be in all of their company. He knew that Harris' group of friends included Dykeman as well as Chris Morris, Robert Perry, Brian Sargent, Zach Heckler, and Dustin Gorton.

Regarding Dylan Klebold, Eric Christner advised that he met him when they were both in the tenth grade and since then, had several classes together. He stated that they would often play the card game of Spades while in the cafeteria. He said Klebold was a good student but not as good a student as Harris. He stated that Klebold liked to talk about baseball and music and they shared those common interests. He said that Klebold was sometimes rebellious in that he did not agree with some rules, such as the school smoking policy. He advised that Klebold would sit in his own car in the parking lot and smoke rather than smoke in the school's designated area. He recalled that Klebold had once been suspended over something to do with the school's computers - he could not remember what that was about. He believed that both Harris and Klebold were trying to "get along," but they did not seem to fit in and would ignore students they did not like.

Eric Christner advised that he had heard of no rumors relating to the incident and that this had been a total surprise.

Mrs. Christner advised that Eric's younger brother, Mark had been at school that day. This investigator spoke to him briefly and was advised that he had been outside of the west door of the cafeteria when the shooting began. He stated he heard what sounded

like firecrackers and saw three students fall to the ground. He said he was with his friends, Will Beck, James Stewart, and Kyle Bramlett and thought Will Beck told him that he had seen the person shooting a gun.

On 05/04/99 at approximately 10:45 AM we contacted Pauline Colby at her residence.

Colby stated on 04/20/99 she was sick but went to school in the morning anyway as there was a DECCA banquet that morning which she had already paid for. She return to Columbine High from the banquet at approximately 11:00 AM. Colby call her father to come and pick her up. Colby's father arrived and signed her out at approximately 11:11 AM.

Colby stated she had her father call the doctor for an appointment while she was at the DECCA banquet on the morning of 04/20/99

Colby's father stated he had called Doctor Scott Green, 8340 S. Sangre de Cristo Rd., Littleton, Colorado, Telephone: (303) 979-9566 and set an appointment for 3 00 PM as he felt Pauline would be home from school by then. He stated Pauline's regular doctor was not available so the appointment was set with Doctor George Quick, Green's partner in the business.

Colby advised she did not go back to school or anywhere except the doctors office that day Colby advised her father took her to the doctors office for the appointment.

On 05/04/99 at approximately 11:15 AM, we contacted the front desk at Doctor Scott Green's Office. We were advised the Mr. Colby had called on the morning of 04/20/99 and set an appointment for Pauline at 3 00 PM. A little before 3 00 PM Mr. Colby brought Pauline into the office for the appointment. They were not allowed to divulge any information about the visit.

At approximately 1.20 PM we contacted officials from Columbine High School who confirmed that on the morning of 04/20/99 there had been a DECCA banquet. The teacher advised it was over at approximately 10:45 AM and they all arrived back at Columbine High at approximately 11.00 AM.

With the permission of COLBY's father, RAYMOND COLBY, a witness interview was conducted concerning COLBY's knowledge of the shooting and bombing incident at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999 at approximately 11:15 a.m. COLBY advised on April 20, 1999, she was not feeling well and had an earache. She telephoned her father and he came to the school and drove her to their residence. According to COLBY, her father signed her out of the school at 11:11 a.m.. She did not hear of the incident until later in the day.

COLBY's association with the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM) was only as an associate in that she knew most of the females that associated with the group. She first met NICOLE MARKHAM in Junior High School while they were attending Ken Caryl Middle School. She advised MARKHAM was CRIS MORRIS's girlfriend. COLBY advised she first met KRISTEN THEIBAULT approximately two years ago when they were freshman at Columbine High School. She advised she met other members of the TCM through MARKHAM and THEIBAULT and stated the group was already formed and had been for approximately two years before she met them. She advised MORRIS was the leader of the TCM. She also had met ERIC HARRIS and DYLAN KLEBOLD in the past, but rarely talked with them. She said she had not talked with either of them for the past one and a half years. However, COLBY stated she talked with the girls who associated with the TCM everyday at school and rarely talked with the males in the group. No one had ever mentioned an event like this occurring or had COLBY ever heard a member or associate of the TCM planning this type of action.

In the past, COLBY had seen MORRIS at school with a hunting knife in his possession. She had never seen firearms in the possession of any TCM member to include HARRIS or KLEBOLD. However, she stated the male members of the group would spare with each other using bamboo martial arts sticks. COLBY never heard HARRIS; KLEBOLD or any other members of the TCM discussing the manufacturing of pipe bombs.

COLBY advised the group was allegedly formed by a group of friends because the athletes in the school and others would harass members of the group and this way they could stick together. The group did not like the athletes because in their opinion the "jocks ruled the school." The athletes and other would tease the group because of their dress and customs. COLBY never heard HARRIS or KLEBOLD using racial slurs nor were they into the neo-Nazi movement to the best of her knowledge. She did stated that sometimes HARRIS and KLEBOLD would speak German to each other, which was their way of making the other students pay attention to them.


COLBY advised she does have access to a computer at her residence, but she never communicated with the group over the computer (not on-line), she only used the computer for schoolwork or to play games.

Earlier today COLBY had spoken with MARKHAM and she advised that MORRIS was in hiding from the police and new media. MARKHAM stated he was hiding due to the harassment from the police and media.

COLBY stated she never imagined anything like this happening and did not think any student was capable of doing this. She believes that occurred due to the constant harassment and teasing the group was receiving from other students in the school. COLBY could provide no further information relevant to this investigation.

COLBY's father was provided with a means of re-contacting the interviewers if his daughter remembers any additional information at a later date. The interview was terminated at 2:30 p.m., April 21, 1999.

James Concilio was interviewed on 05-26-99 by Inv. Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, at approx. 4:30 pm by telephone at his residence

Mr. Concilio said that 04-20-99 he had bowling first thing in the morning. He said that he knew both Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and that they had bowling in the morning also. Concilio said that his team consisted of himself, James Bisgard, Jeff Marquardt, and Ryan Pool. He said that Harris and Klebold's team had Nate Dykeman and Chris Morris. Concilio said that Harris' team bowled a few lanes down from his team on 04-20-99. Concilio said that he recalls seeing Eric Harris in bowling class and he was wearing a flannel shirt and jeans. Concilio said that Klebold was not there, and he can't remember whether Dykeman or Morris were there.

Concilio said that he arrived at school between 8:15 - 8:30am, and he drove his car, a red Honda Prelude, Colorado license plate GBV8997 and parked it in the senior parking lot in space 9. Concilio said that it was pretty much a normal day. He said that he had Weights class during Fourth Hour and at the end of class, he left the school. He said that he left between 11:10 and 11:15am and went to his house to get ready for work.

Concilio said that he left for work around 11:45am and was trying to go north on Pierce and at Coal Mine he was stopped by the roadblock. He said that as he tried to go around, a girl named Jennifer Laplante told him not to go back to school because there were guys with guns there.


Concilio said that he kept seeing all the police cars while on his way to work. He said that he worked Express, a clothes store at Southwest Plaza, as a stock boy, however he currently is not employed.

Concilio said he arrived to work around 12:15pm. He said that he called his girlfriend in Fort Collins from the parking lot and then talked to his dad, who had heard about the shooting on the radio. Concilio said he went to work, and was having a hard time concentrating and when the manager asked him a second time if he wanted to leave, he went home.

After Concilio arrived home, he said he went across the street to Mike (Michael) Paavilainen's house. He said that Mike wasn't home, but his sisters were and they were upset because they didn't know where Mike was, however around 2:00pm, Mike called to say he was okay and that he had left school to take his tux back. Concilio said he went home. Concilio said that Renee Paavilainen was in the cafeteria when the shooting started.

Concilio said that he had known Harris and Klebold throughout high school. I asked him if they were friends, and he said no, just had them in classes. I asked him who else Harris and Klebold hung around with and he said Brooks Brown and Robyn Anderson.

Concilio said that the graduating class picture was taken around February or March, and the picture was taken twice, the first time was the formal pose, like the picture that was printed in the Rocky Mountain News, the second time was the informal pose, where the kids could clown around and hug each other, or put the bunny ears behind someone's head. Concilio said that the informal picture was available for purchase by the students and his friend who had purchased one had pointed out that Harris, Klebold, Brooks Brown and Robyn Anderson had made hand signs like they were guns pointing at the camera.

Concilio said that Robyn Anderson had been in an accounting class that he had. He said she was just kind of different, not that she had to dress different or act different, more like she wasn't quite all there. He said that he knew Brooks Brown, but he and Brooks really didn't get along ok so he just kept away from him.

Concilio said that he had different friends say that Harris and Klebold were in their respective Third Hour classes, but he couldn't remember who those friends were. He said that in the classes they had with him, they didn't always wear their trench coats all the time. I asked Concilio who else did Harris and Klebold hang around with and he said Morris and Dykeman, Joe Stair, and Robert Perry. Concilio said that he used to work with Joe Stair at Pizza Hut.

He said that he probably left Pizza Hut in February 1998 and worked there for around eight months. Concilio said that Joe Stair worked there. I asked him to describe Joe and he said that he was an interesting person, very outspoken and not shy about saying what he felt. Concilio said that Joe liked mortal combat video games, Concilio described the games as gruesome and violent. Concilio said that Joe seemed friendly and would laugh and make jokes, but there was something about him that would 'make you cringe'

James Concilio could not think of anything thing else that he thought might be important, so the interview was concluded

party was at Robyn Anderson's house, however, Deborah Conn could not remember where Robyn Anderson lives. Deborah Conn said she met Eric Harris at this party. Deborah Conn said that Eric Harris "seemed like a really nice guy." Deborah Conn said prior to talking to each other, they had smiled at each other and then began talking. Deborah Conn could not recall what their conversation was about and said she did not remember Eric Harris talking about anything unusual or out of the ordinary. She could not remember what type of clothing Harris wore to the party. Deborah Conn said at this party, the party attendees were drinking alcoholic beverages, however, she said there were no drugs involved that she was aware of.

Deborah Conn said she believed Eric Harris went to the party at Robyn Anderson's house by himself. She said she saw him playing a video game at this party and said the video game was an Army type game, where a helicopter would rescue people, and she said the player was supposed to shoot people that would come up on the screen.

Deborah Conn said in August of 1998, she had a class at Columbine High School, Government Economics, and said Dylan Klebold was in this class as well. She said Robyn Anderson was also in the class and sat with Dylan Klebold. Deborah Conn said Dylan Klebold would wear a trench coat to class, but said he would not wear it every day. She described the trench coat that Dylan would wear to class as not being leather and possibly being made out of canvas. She said he also would wear black combat boots or black Doc Martin' boots. Deborah Conn said she did not think Dylan Klebold and Robyn Anderson were boyfriend/girlfriend during this time frame, but said she was aware that they went to prom with each other in April of 1999.

Deborah Conn said she did not recall ever having a conversation with Dylan Klebold and said he was "usually pretty quiet." Deborah Conn said there were a lot of "jocks" in this class, but she did not remember seeing any problems between Dylan Klebold and/or the "jocks." Deborah Conn said the "jocks" would stick together and said, "They could get on your nerves sometimes by doing so."

Deborah Conn said Brooks Brown was in this class as well and she said he was very smart. She said Brooks Brown was good friends with Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris and described the relationship between Brooks Brown, Dylan Klebold, and Eric Harris, as "very close friends." She said Brooks Brown would get along with the "jocks" in the class, however, but did not like the "jocks." Deborah Conn said Brooks Brown may have had a verbal confrontation with the "jocks" in the classroom, however,

she could not recall being able to hear what the confrontation was in reference to. Deborah Conn said she did not sit close enough to Dylan Klebold and/or Robyn Anderson or Brooks Brown to hear what their conversations were about, and said she could only remember hearing them talk about school. Deborah Conn said she did not recall seeing Brooks Brown wear a trench coat, however, she was not sure, and said she did not know if he was a member of the Trench Coat Mafia or not. Deborah Conn said she believed there were about eight to ten Trench Coat Mafia students at Columbine High School, and said she had seen them in the hallway of the school. She said she did not know any other names of the Trench Coat Mafia students. Deborah Conn said she knew nothing further about the Trench Coat Mafia or its members.

Deborah Conn said she did not recall hearing Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, or Brooks Brown and/or Robyn Anderson talk about Germany or Hitler. Deborah Conn said either Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris had a sticker or insignia on their vehicle of a German cross. She said this was definitely a German cross and not a Christian cross. Deborah Conn said she knew Dylan Klebold drove a black BMW and said she believed Eric Harris drove a black Honda Prelude.

Deborah Conn said since the shooting on 04-20-99, she has had nightmares with the last incident occurring about two weeks ago. Deborah Conn said she is currently being treated by a therapist that she has used in the past for other reasons unrelated to Columbine High School.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Deborah Conn said she did not recall seeing Dylan Klebold, Eric Harris, Robyn Anderson or Brooks Brown carrying a duffle bag. She said she had not seen Eric Harris since the party at Robyn Anderson's house. She also said she has not seen Dylan Klebold, Robyn Anderson or Brooks Brown for sometime either. Deborah Conn said she did not know of anyone at Columbine High School with a double pierced eyebrow.

I gave both Deborah Conn and Bonnie Conn my business card and asked them to contact me if they wanted to talk to a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate in the future. I told them I would make the necessary for them at that time.

On 04-28-1999, contact was made with Breanne Cook at her residence at 11944 W. Stanford Dr., #303-948-2129. She noted being a Junior at CHS.

On 04-17-1999, she had left school after 2nd period, approximately 0920, and left the school grounds to pick up a friend, Cayley Boile (9555 W. Lake Pl., #303-933-6175) and bring her to CHS for lunch. Boile is a former student who only recently left CHS to attend Warren Tech.

As Cook returned to the area of CHS, she had been turned away by JCSO deputies, and told that a bomb had been found at the school. She had driven around the neighborhood attempting to get to the school another way. She arrived in the area of the school, and parked when she heard what she described as gunshots coming from the area of the school. She and Boile exited her vehicle and walked to the area of Clements Park, where they observed students running into the park. She eventually ended up at the Jefferson County library where she met with other students. While at the library, she had occasion to see Pauline and Jennifer Colby, together with 2 other females (NFI) walking with a known associate of the suspects. She had shared this information with an aide working at the school, Patty Stevens, and this associate was eventually identified as Robert Perry. Cook relates having seen Perry, within the last 1-2 months, at CHS with both Harris and Klebold. Cook also relates seeing Alejandra Marsh at the library defending the suspects, telling students they shouldn't be making fun of people. She reports later confronting Marsh at a memorial near the school where she was defending the suspect's actions.

Contact was also made with Boile, who reports that a friend of hers, Russell Agnew (7629 So. Fenton St., #303-973-5057) was heard to say to other students that he had identified one of the gunmen observed near the library in the school as being [REDACTED]

Boile also related that another friend, Leanna Belk, a student at BCHS, had information relative to an individual how had been at CHS and had seen in gunmen enter the school.

Breeanne Cook was interviewed by Inv Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, on 04-28-99 at approx. 2:15 pm at her residence Ms Cook state that Inv. Mike Russell of the West Metro Drug Task Force had also interviewed her earlier in the day

Ms Cook said that she did not see anyone in the teacher's car lot on the day of the shooting. She stated that she had left the school around 10 00am with LeeAnn , last name unknown, (LNU) and drove to Cook's friend, Caley Boyle's residence, (933-6175) on Lake Place off of Wadsworth Blvd. Cook advised that Boyle was not home, so she took LeeAnn LNU back to Columbine H.S and dropped her off in the back by the commons. Ms Cook stated that she left the school a second time between 10:30 and 10:45am and went back to Boyle's house to pick her up for lunch. Ms Cook said they left the house and had tried to go to Burger King for lunch by Pierce and Bowles. Ms. Cook said that near Pierce and Bowles they saw Luke Milen, an acquaintance, who told them that there had been a shooting at the H.S. and to get away Ms Cook said that there was a police officer stationed near the intersection and that they could not get back to the school. She said that they parked the car and got out and started to walk toward the school

Ms Cook said that she and Caley had met up with two students, Garrett Norman and Ben Gramms and they walked back to her car and gave the boys a ride to a residence in Woodmar Park She said that she met up with another student, Evan Todd, who appeared to be injured and was covered with a lot of blood. Evan Todd was with another girl and 2 other boys, and Cook gave them a ride to a white and pink house in Woodmar Park

Ms Cook said that she and Caley saw two more friends, Ben LNU and another male student and they were looking for Veronica Nuncio and Nick, and they all went to the public library to see if they can find them. While at the library they saw a guy named Perry, who was wearing a tie dyed shirt. Perry met up with another girl, Pauline Colby Perry and Colby were with a group of students, 4 or 5 all together Ms. Cook said she knew that the guy in the tie dyed shirt hung around with the Trench Coat Mafia and was probably friends with Eric and Dylan. Ms. Colby said that he was kind of quiet and had come into the library by himself. Ms Cook then added that a girl named, Alex was a good friend of Dylan's.

I read the photo lineup admonition to Ms. Cook and showed her a photo array and asked her if she recognized the guy in the tie dyed shirt in the photo array Ms Cook immediately identified [REDACTED] in number 5 position as the person she saw in the tie dyed shirt in the library on 04-20-99 at approx. 2 00pm.



On May 6, 1999, COOK was interviewed concerning her knowledge of the events surrounding the shooting and bombing of Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. According to previous information from Deputy K. DELURENZO, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, COOK allegedly talked to an unidentified Columbine High School teacher and told the teacher she observed a former student, ROBERT PERRY talking to one of the suspects in the teachers parking lot prior to the shooting. COOK advised she does not know anything about this information concerning her talking to a teacher about seeing PERRY in the teacher's parking lot. She did not see PERRY in the parking lot talking to a suspect on that day nor did she see any of the suspects involved in the shooting. She did state however, that late in the afternoon on April 20, 1999, she was evacuated from the school to the public library (Columbine Branch) northwest of the high school on Bowles Avenue. She observed PERRY at the library with another Columbine High School student whom she identified as PAULINE COLBY. COOK also stated there were some other individuals with PERRY but she could only identify COLBY. She stated PERRY was wearing a tie dye tee shirt, blue jeans, black boots and a turned around baseball style cap. COOK advised she knows PERRY by sight from previous occasions. COOK stated she does not know what PERRY was doing in the library nor did she speak with him or COLBY. COOK could provide no other information relevant to this investigation at this time.

COOK was provided with contact instructions in case she recalls any additional information concerning this matter under investigation.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On June 1, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Jason Cornelies. On June 1st I contacted Tammy Ibsen, Jason's mother, and made an appointment for an interview for 1500 on June 2, 1999.

On June 2nd I arrived at 6342 West Maplewood Drive and contacted Jason Cornelies. Jason confirmed that he had attended Columbine High School and had been in the twelfth grade, he had graduated last month.

Jason continued to say that he had been in school on April 20, 1999. Jason said that he had not been in the cafeteria at all during the morning of April 20th. He advised that he had lunch from approximately 11:00AM to 12:00PM. Jason continued to say that he had left the building and went to lunch at the McDonalds restaurant at South Pierce Street and Coal Mine Road. Jason said that he had been accompanied to lunch by the following people:

Natalie Green
Matt Mayhew
Robin Piro

Jason advised that he left the school building by way of the main entrance near the office. He advised that he had parked his car across South Pierce Street on West Fair Avenue. They then drove to the McDonalds.

Jason advised that while they were leaving the school they did not encounter either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold nor did he notice anything unusual going on. Jason thought it was about 10:50AM when they left the

building. Jason stated that they returned to school about 11:15AM and found a large group of students gathered in Leawood Park across the street from the school, and police cars were arriving at the school. Jason said that he parked his car on West Fair Avenue, and they began talking to the students in the park and learned that there had been a shooting in the school. Jason stated that while he was standing in the park he heard shots and thought someone was shooting at the people in the park. Jason said it sounded like the shots were coming from the area of math rooms on the main level. Jason continued to say that he thought he observed a person on the school roof but he did not know if this was a shooter. Jason did not see who was doing the shooting. Jason stated that after they heard the shots he and his friends got into his car and left the area, going to his house.

Jason said that prior to going to lunch he had been in a marketing class which was located in the lower level class rooms, in the second room south of the hall between the auditorium and cafeteria. Jason also said that while walking between classes and on his way to lunch he did not observe anyone with a gun nor did he see anyone carrying a large duffel type bag.

Jason said that he has known Dylan Klebold since seventh or eighth grade, though he hasn't had any contact with Dylan recently. Jason continued to say that he had a video class with Eric Harris during the first semester (fall 1998) of this school year. He advised that Eric had sat directly behind him. Jason said that outside of class he did not associate with Harris and did not talk to Harris outside of the class. Jason said that he has known about the Trench Coat Mafia since junior high school. He also advised that Harris had talked about the Trench Coat Mafia during a presentation for a class. Jason said that he presentation did not deal with the shooting but was just a general view about the group. Jason advised tha the Trench Coat Mafia was started by a group of kids that did not seem to fit in any place in school, the misfits. Jason advised that he had no confrontations with anyone involved with the group recently. He did say that when he was in the seventh grade he was involved in a fight with a possible memeber of the group, Todd Bowels, but nothing has happened since then.

Jason related that he could not believe that Dylan had been involved in such a thing and from what he knew about Dylan, Dylan did not have that sort of thing inside of him. Jason thought that Dylan had come under the influence of some outside person. Jason continued to say that he noticed that Eric Harris seemed to be very troubled inside. This was especially apparent if he was talking about the Trench Coat Mafia or his beliefs and someone would question them. He would become very angry. Jason advised that he has had no contact with Dylan since Dylan started becoming weirder. By that he meant Dylan began to wear the black trench coat, fatigue pants, boots and beret on a regular basis. Jason stated that he had not spoken with either Harris or Klebold before the shootings.

Jason advised that he had heard no rumors about the shootings occurring before April 20th, and neither had he heard any rumors about them building bombs or buying guns.

Jason advised that his sister, Tara, had been in a science class at the time of the shootings and she had not been interviewed.

As Jason could provide no further information the interview concluded at 1530.

Kristin Couris was interviewed on 05-27-99 by Inv Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, at approx. 4:00pm at her residence

Kristin said that she arrived at Columbine around 8:15am on 04-20-99. She said that she drove her white 2 door Toyota Tercel with Colorado license plate ACY4341, and parked it at Clement Park. She said that sometimes she parks in her sister's parking spot, number 169 in the Senior lot.

Kristin said that she had Math for Fourth Hour and class ended around 11:10am. She went to her friend's locker, Kelly McIntosh, then Kristin and her sister, Melissa went to Melissa's car in the Senior lot. Kristin said that Melissa was getting ready to leave school and Kristin needed to get her books out of her sister's car before she left. Kristin told me she got her books and her sister left. Kristin said that she met her friends, Kelly McIntosh and Kellye Cruz, outside at the bottom of the stairs by the library. Kristin said that they walked to Kellye Cruz's vehicle, a red 1993 Nissan 4 x 4, parked in the Junior lot around the north center area of the lot, possibly space 343. She said they drove to Einstein Brothers, at Wadsworth and Bowles for lunch. Kristin said that it took probably 7 or 8 minutes from the time Math class let out, until the time she left with Kelly and Kellye. I asked her if she noticed anything unusual in school or in the parking lot and she said that she did not.

Kristin said that the first indication that something had happened was on their way back to school after lunch, they noticed that traffic was all backed up around the school. Another student who she didn't know, told them to 'get away from the school, there's a kid with a gun.'

She told me that Kellye took her to Clement Park, so she could get her car. She said that she realized that her car keys were in Melissa's car. Kristin said that she and Molly Vaughn caught a ride with Brandy Tinkleberg and went to Brandy's house near Jewell and Wadsworth. Kristin said that Kellye's truck was impounded at Clement Park, and Kellye Cruz called Kelly McIntosh's step mom to come and pick up Kellye and Kelly. Kristin said she called and left a message for Melissa to call her when she got home. Kristin said she called around 12:30 - 1:00pm, and then Brandy took her home.

I asked Kristin if she knew Eric Harris, and she said that she knew of him, but didn't know his face. She said that Brandy Tinkleberg and Molly Weksler both told her that Eric had wanted to go to prom with Brandy and had asked Molly to ask Brandy for him. I asked Kristin if she knew Dylan Klebold and she said that she knew who he was and had seen him before after school in the parking lot.

Kristin told me that Kellye Cruz said she saw the Rebel News Network on 04-20-99 and it said something like, 'It's going to be a bad day.' Kristin said that she heard that Dylan and Eric had something to do with that message.

I asked Kristin if she could think of anything else that was unusual or perhaps important, and she couldn't think of anything. The interview was concluded.

Melissa Couris was interviewed on 05-28-99 by Inv Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, at approx. 10:30am by telephone at her residence.

Melissa said that she arrived at Columbine around 7:25am on 04-20-99. She said that she drove her light plum colored 1995 Saturn four door and parked it in the Senior lot space 169.

Melissa told me that she had Third Hour free. She said that during Third Hour she went to the Main office area and in one of the offices near Christine Mikesell's office she watched a video from the lunch room from a few days ago. Some one named Andy helped set up the video for her to watch. She said that she had gotten into trouble over leaving trash on the table in the cafeteria and it was something that she didn't do.

Melissa said that after she viewed the video, she went to the office of Peter Horvath, Assistant Principal, to talk to him about clearing her name over leaving the trash on the table. She said she spoke to him about 8:45am. Melissa said that she went to the cafeteria and then spoke to one of the custodians, she is not sure which one she spoke to, but he was skinny, had a mustache, and sort of bald on top. She said she spoke to the custodian about the trash incident as well.

Melissa told me that she then had a bagel and sat down with her friends in the cafeteria around 8:50am. She said she sat at the first table at the bottom of the stairs by the video camera. She said there is a group of four tables between the school store and the stairs and she was at the table closest to the stairs. She said that the group at her table was Kristi Held, Jamie Norwood, Mike Paavilainen, nicknamed Pav, and Jeremy Harris. She said that Mike Paavilainen's sister's were sitting a table near her table. I asked Melissa if she noticed anything unusual in the cafeteria, like a duffel bag and she said no.

Melissa said that she attended her Fourth Hour Psychology class, she couldn't remember what time it started, however she said that the class got out on time at 11:30am. Melissa said right after Fourth Hour she met her sister, Kristin Couris, by Kelly McIntosh's locker, which was to the left as you leave the library. Then she and Kristin walked to Melissa's car in the Senior lot. She said that Kristin got her books out of her car and then Kristin walked back and met her friends Kellye Cruz and Kelly McIntosh outside the school to go to lunch. Melissa said that she left the school right after Kristin picked up her books and she said that she checked the clock in her car and it was 11:20am.

Melissa said that she went directly to Stoney Creek Elementary where she is a Teacher's Assistant to Ms. Rhan. She told me that she started to work and someone came into the room and got Ms. Rhan and when she came back into the classroom, she was crying and told Melissa to get her keys and go outside. Ms. Rhan told her that there had been a shooting at Columbine and she told her not to go to the school. Melissa said that she had only been at Stoney Creek for about 15 minutes.

Melissa said that she left Stoney Creek and drove to the Subway shop near the school, and then she tried to get into Clement Park, but was unable so she went home. She said that she was worried about her sister, Kristin, and didn't know if she was in school or not. Melissa said that when she got home, she had a message from Kristin saying she was all right.

I asked Melissa if she knew Eric Harris and she said that she did not. I asked her if she knew Dylan Klebold and she said that he had been in at least one of her classes last year and she knew who he was. She thought he had been in a Language Arts class with Miss Jankowski last year. She said that he was always quiet, didn't talk to anybody and sat in the corner with his arms crossed. She said that he wore a trench coat and sometimes he wore his sunglasses in the classroom. She said she thought Robyn Anderson was in that class too.

Melissa said that she had a class, Anthropology with Mr. Hayes, with Chris Morris and he hung around with Eric and Dylan. She said that he wore a trench coat and sat in the corner as well. She said that he wore a beret and his sunglasses in the classroom. Melissa said that another student, a tall guy, who was slumped over in the back, used to come into her Anthropology class and make his girlfriend mad. She said that she went to get her yearbook and she thought this guy was Robert Perry. Melissa said she did not know the name of his girlfriend.

I asked Melissa if she had heard anything that she thought might be important since she went back to school at Charfield and Melissa said that her friend, Amy Evans, told her that there were more than two people involved in the shooting. Melissa thought that Amy had also told her that [REDACTED] was involved in the shooting as well. I asked Melissa why Amy thought this and Melissa was not clear on her answer, only that she didn't think that two people could shoot up the cafeteria and the library at the same time. Melissa said that other friends had said the same things as Amy Evans, regarding a third shooter and [REDACTED].

I asked Melissa if she had anything else to add and she said no. The interview was concluded.

On 5/26/99 I contacted 17 year old CHS student Michael Croll at his home number of 303-978-9248. Mike agreed to speak with me about the shootings at CHS.

Mike acknowledged he is an "A" lunch student. On 4/20/99 he left the school with Denise Berrit through the student entrance by Rebel Corner downstairs in the cafeteria. They walked out together around 11:15am to the senior parking lot and drove away from the school in Mike's green Saturn. They did not see anything inside or outside of the school, specifically a large duffle bag or any students acting suspicious.


They attempted to return after eating at McDonalds around 11:40am. They saw several police and students around Pierce and Fair street. Mike pulled over on Fair street, across from the school to find out what was going on. There were several students in Leawood park, and some were talking about a student having a gun. Shortly after getting out of his vehicle, he heard "pop, pop", which he thought to be gunshots coming from the school. Someone in the crowd yelled "they are shooting at us" and everyone, including Mike ran further away from the school. Mike did not see anyone shooting a gun, nor does he know who yelled they were being shot at. He left the area on foot.


Mike stated that his friend, Janelle Thibault told him she saw Robert Perry walking near the public library immediately after the shootings. She told Mike she found this odd, as Robert was no longer

a student at CHS. Mike advised me he heard this directly from Janelle and does not know if she has been interviewed by an Investigator. According to Mike, Janelle was in physics class at CHS during 5th hour on 4/20/99, and was out of the school very quickly.
