**INVESTIGATION:**

On May 11, 1999, I spoke to Gabe Montoya and his mother Sandy Montoya, by telephone. I asked Gabe Montoya about a friend of his and neighbor, named [REDACTED]. Gabe Montoya said that he had a conversation with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] Gabe Montoya indicated that he and his friend Joel Koons had been at the Montoya home when they had the conversation with [REDACTED].

I asked Montoya to tell about the conversation and his movements on that day. Montoya said that he had gone to school that morning for first hour. He indicated that he has been sick and is on a modified school day. He said that he goes to school for four classes in the morning one day and four classes in the afternoon the following day. Gabe Montoya said that on April 20, 1999, he had class in the morning. He said that his friend Joel Koons had asked him if he could give him a ride to take his car to have a front-end alignment done on it during Joel Koons' lunch hour. Montoya said that Koons' had lunch "B". Montoya said that he picked up Joel Koons at about 11:15 a.m. on April 20, 1999, and drove him to his car at Clement Park. Montoya

said that he followed Koons to the Firestone Station located at Chatfield and Coalmine and from there the two of them went to the Montoya home. Montoya said that he had gotten out of school at about 10:15 a.m. and had gone home and returned to the school to pick up Koons at about 11:15 A.M.. Montoya said that he does not live far from the school and that he did not want to wait an hour for Koons so he had gone home first.

Montoya said that he and Koons had lunch at his house and were outside playing basketball when they saw a tan colored possibly and SUV pull into [REDACTED] driveway. Montoya said that he did not really look at the car but did state that the car drove down the street at a high rate of speed, but indicated that was not unusual for [REDACTED] to drive that way. Montoya said that he did not see who had gotten in or out of the car but said he heard car doors close. I asked Montoya how many car doors he heard and he said that he thought he heard two but was not sure. Montoya said that the car was there in the [REDACTED] driveway for about 5 to 10 minutes and that he did not see who got back into the car. Montoya said that he and Koons were playing basketball and did not pay much attention to the vehicle.

Montoya indicated that he remembers the tan vehicle having a very dark tinted rear window with numerous stickers stuck to the rear window. Montoya said that he and Koons heard numerous police sirens prior to the arrival of the tan vehicle and that he heard a few police sirens after the tan vehicle left the [REDACTED] residence. Montoya said he does not know the exact time that the tan car drove to the [REDACTED] but thought it was around 12:20 p.m.. I asked Montoya why he thought it had been around that time and he said that Koons did not have to be back to school until 12:40 p.m. and that Sandy Montoya had arrived home just after the tan vehicle left the [REDACTED] home.

I asked Sandy Montoya if she remembered what time it was that she got home and she said that she thought it was around 12.15 p.m. to 12.20 p.m..

Gabe Montoya said that his mother went into the house and came out a little later and told him and Koons that there had been a shooting at Columbine High and they all went inside to watch the news. Gabe Montoya said that Koons called his mother to tell her that he was alright and was not going back to school. Montoya said that they stayed home watching the news and that at about 2:00 p.m. Nate Dykeman came over to his house and was upset. Montoya said that Dykeman told him that he bowls

first thing in the morning and that Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris are in the same class but they were not there in class that morning. Montoya said that Dykeman told him that Cory DePooter was dead that he had seen a news telecast that had said that DePooter was one of the victims. Montoya said that Dykeman was visibly upset and stated several times that he did not believe that Klebold and Harris had done what they did. Montoya said that Dykeman said something to the effect of, "I can't believe they would do something like that, we had such a good time together on Saturday."

Gabe Montoya said that his friend Cory Koons may be able to provide additional information on the tan vehicle and it's occupants. I contacted the Koons residence and was advised that Cory Koons could be reached at that number on May 12, 1999 around 10:00 a.m.


Sandy Montoya said that she had attended the after prom celebration and had seen Nate Dykeman there. She said that she asked him how dinner was and that he appeared somewhat angry or agitated with her for asking him that question. Sandy Montoya said that Nate Dykeman was truly upset, crying and visibly saddened by what had happened.

I asked Gabe Montoya to tell me what he knew about Klebold and Harris. He said that he knew they were members of "TCM" and did not know them very well, but could recognize them in pass each other in the hallways at school. Montoya said that he did not know the members of the "TCM" except for Nate Dykeman. He said that Dykeman lived just down the street and would come over frequently when he and Koons were outside playing basketball. I asked Montoya about the "TCM" and how they acted. Montoya said that the members of the group "would leave you alone if you left them alone" and "would be nice to you if you were nice to them." The interview with Gabe Montoya and his mother was then terminated.


ASSIGNMENT SYNOPSIS An interview conducted with Christopher WALKER by Investigator OBBEMA on April 28, 1999 indicated Clinton MOORE as a possible witness to events that occurred during the April 20, 1999 Columbine Shooting

A phone interview was conducted with MOORE on June 10, 1999 MOORE stated he went home to eat lunch on the day of the shooting and did not know it had happened until he tried to return to school. MOORE stated he saw his friend Chris WALKER, and WALKER told him that someone was shooting up the school MOORE stated there were police cars all around the school. MOORE stated he got in WALKERS car and they drove to a cul-de-sac south of the school. He stated they parked the car and saw several students running away from the school. He did not remember seeing any students wearing black clothing and saw no trench coats. MOORE stated he heard shooting coming from the area of the school and everyone around him got down on the ground. MOORE stated he and WALKER climbed a fence near the football field and headed towards Clement Park. MOORE stated he and WALKER attempted to get WALKER's sister's car out of the parking lot in CLEMENT Park, but the police would not let them move the vehicle. MOORE stated he went with WALKERS to WALKERS house and watched everything on TV.

MOORE stated he knows Nate DYKEMAN real well and DYKEMAN is a great guy. He stated he heard a few students saying all the TCM type people were involved in the shooting and he does not believe DYKEMAN had anything to do with it. He

stated he could not remember whom he heard it from, the students were doing a lot of talking. He stated DYKEMAN would never do anything like this. He stated he called DYKEMAN after the shooting had occurred and he was devastated. He stated DYKEMAN couldn't believe it. He stated DYKEMAN was good friends with KLEYBOLD

On 081799, I telephonically interviewed Tona Moore, the mother of the above listed student. She told me that her son was not available because he was away school. He attends college at Colorado State University in Boulder, Colorado.

She provided the following information. She reported that her son was at school on the 20<sup>th</sup> of April, but away at lunch at the time of the shooting. He went to Taco Bell.

When Clinton came back to the school after lunch he saw police and barricades to the school. He looked for friends and then went to Chris Walker's house.

Clinton had been in classes with Harris and Klebold, but did not know them on a personal level.

Tona said that Clinton was shocked about the incident and reported that he had no prior knowledge of this incident. Tona could not recall anything that she had heard from Clinton that would be considered unusual.

Tona asked her son at the time of the incident if he had any information that he could provide the police, he said no.

I asked if he saw Robyn or Dylan the week the incident occurred. He stated on Monday, 4-19-99, he doesn't recall seeing Robyn or Dylan and he doesn't recall seeing them on 4-20-99.

I asked Derek if he went to Columbine's Prom and the after Prom party and asked if he saw Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris. Again he told me he doesn't recall seeing either one of them there. Derek also provided information that he had gone to middle school with Dylan Klebold and he couldn't provide any additional information reference the incident.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On may 20, 1999 I was assigned an interview with Columbine High School student, Catherine Nelson. It was reported that Catherine had a discussion in band with Dustin Gorton about propane. On May 25th I spoke to Betty Nelson, Catherine's mother, and made an appointment to interview Catherine on May 27th at 1100. Ms. Nelson advised that it would be all right to conduct the interview without one of Catherine's parents being present.

On May 27th at 1050 I arrived at 8807 West Caley Place and contacted Catherine Nelson. Catherine related that she was a student at Columbine High School and had been in the twelfth grade, and had just graduated. Catherine continued to say that she had been in school on the morning of April 20, 1999. She said that she arrived at school about 7:20AM. She advised that she parked in the west lot. Catherine advised that she did not see either Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold upon entering the lot or school. Catherine stated that she was not in the cafeteria at any time during the morning. She reported that she did walk by the cafeteria, on the outside, on her way to leave for lunch. Catherine said that she left the school building by way of the west, north, main hall exit. She walked down the stairs on the west end of the building to the parking lot. Catherine advised that it was about 11:20AM when she left for lunch. She said that she knows the time because as she passed the cafeteria window she looked in and saw a clock on the east wall near the kitchen. She continued to her car and left the lot. She stated that she did not observe either Harris or Klebold entering the lot as she was leaving. Additionally Catherine said that she did not see either Harris or Klebold in the vicinity of the west exit or stairs when she left.

Catherine said that she did not observe anyone carrying a large duffel type bag as she was leaving the building.

Catherine reported that she did have a conversation with Dustin Gorton about propane. She advised that during a band class last semester (fall 1998) she and Dustin were in the band room when Dustin picked up a propane cylinder. Catherine said she told Dustin "oh thats gas, put it down". Dustin replied that it wasn't flammable. Catherine stated that the propane had been left in the room by the teacher. She knows nothing more about the gas.

Catherine said that she did know Eric Harris because they were in video class, second hour, together but they did not talk much except to say hello. Catherine advised that Eric was not in class on the morning of April 20th. She said that she does not know Dylan Klebold. She further advised that she does not associate with anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia. She did advised that her friend Dustin Gorton might be friendly with members of the group but she did not know for sure. She advised that he made a habit of wearing camouflage pants. She advised that she thought it was strange that Dustin quit saying hello to her some time ago. She did not know why this happened.

Catherine stated that she did not know there was a problem until she got to work at the Dairy Queen and one of the employees said that there had been a shooting at the school. Catherine said that she was returning to school from lunch, and when she reached the intersection of West Polk Avenue and South Pierce Street the road was blocked by police who told her not to go back to school. She stated that, at this time, she thought there might have been a traffic accident on Pierce Street.

Catherine reported that she had not heard any rumors about impending trouble at school anytime before April 20th. Neither had she heard any rumors about anyone building bombs or buying guns.

Catherine could provide no further information and the interview ended at 1110.

Ian Nelson was interviewed on 05-24-99 by Inv Jill Reuteier (7394), Colorado State Patrol, by telephone at approx. 11 15am at his residence

Ian Nelson said that he arrived at Columbine High School about five minutes into the first hour classes on 04-20-99. He said that he drove his 1992 Mazda pickup truck, white in color, with Colorado license plate 55142RS and parked in the Senior parking lot in his space, #0192, on the north side about halfway through the parking lot. He said that he did not notice anything unusual in the parking lot. Ian said that his friend, Jerad Tomicich was five minutes late as well as the met in the parking lot on their way to their first hour classes. Ian said that his first class was Gov/Econ and that Jerad had Humanities first hour.

Ian said that he only has three classes Columbine and that he is done after third hour. He advised that his third hour class is Critical Reading and that he left school around 10 20am and went home. Ian said that his friend, Jerad also left school, but he went to Pep Boys and then to Ian's house. Ian said that Jerad drives a 1989 Toyota 4 wheel drive pickup, light blue in color. He thought that Jerad got to his house around 11 10am. Ian said that he also met Josh Killup, a senior from Dakota Ridge (he drives a 1986 Pontiac Grand Prix, dark gray in color) at his house, and he thought that Josh got there around 11 00am. He said that the three of them take turns car pooling to Warren Tech and on 04-20-99, Ian drove in his truck and the other two left their vehicles at Ian's house. Ian said that they left his house about 11 10 to 11 20am, they went west on Quarto to Allison, Allison to Coal Mine and north on Kipling, with a stop at the drive through window of Taco Bell, on Kipling, north of Bellview. He said that while they were waiting at the drive through they saw two police units headed south down Kipling with their lights and sirens operating.

Ian said that they arrived at Warren Tech around 12 00 to 12 05pm. He said that they heard about the shooting after arriving at Warren. Ian said when class finished around 5pm they were told to go straight home, which he said they did.

I asked Ian if he knew Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and he said that he did. Ian stated that during his freshman year, he had built a computer and his friend Nathan Dykeman had come over to his house that summer and helped Ian set it up. He said that they played games like Doom and Duke Nukem and Nate would come over and use Ian's computer because it was faster than his own. Ian said that he met Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold over the computer games they played on the internet. Ian said that his screen name was curbi 99 but it used to be smiling321 and nate used the name rebelman. He said that they used aol for a while, and he thought that Nate Dykeman had a 90 free trial on aol and when it ran out, his step-dad wouldn't pay for it anymore. Ian said that after a while, Nate and the others moved on to a game called Quake, that was a CD ROM game. Ian said that his computer was too slow and that he sort of lost interest with it all. He said that he actually met Harris once and that he had met Klebold around three times. Ian said that one time, Dylan and Nate and Jerad all came over and played basketball.

Ian stated that in his Junior year, during first semester that Nate Dykeman went to Warren Tech too. After the first semester he dropped out and Ian and Nate drifted apart. Ian said he hung around his friends from Warren Tech.

I asked Ian if he had seen either Harris or Klebold on 04-19-99 or 04-20-99 and he said no that he had not. Ian said that after the shooting Nate Dykeman moved to Florida, before the rest of his class started back to school at Chatfield. I asked Ian if Nate Dykeman graduated with the class, and he said that he had seen him at graduation, but didn't think he actually graduated. Ian said that they really 'didn't get to talk much'

library inside of Columbine High School, he did not see any suspicious looking subjects or any suspicious items near the library. Erlend said that he continued walking past the library to the main hallway, where he turned to the east and walked down the hallway toward the administrative office doors. Erlend said after reaching these doors he exited the school through the main entrance. Erlend Nilsen said this would have been approximately 1110 hours on 4-20-99 and said he then went to the Columbine Library at West Bowles and Long Drive, arriving there at approximately 11:15 a.m. Erlend said he remained at the Columbine Library until approximately 1150 hours, and said when he left the library he tried to get back to Columbine High School, however, he was unable to do so due to the police presence around the school.

I asked Erlend Nilsen about the "Trench Coat Mafia." Erlend said that prior to the incident on 4-20-99 he had never heard of the "Trench Coat Mafia."

I next asked Erlend Nilsen if he knew Eric Harris, and he said yes he did due to the fact that Eric Harris was in his German class. Erlend said that during his German class he would have a conversation with Eric Harris once in a while and said that these conversations were normal in content. Erlend said that Eric Harris would "mostly dress normal" and said that Eric may have possibly been a "Trench Coat Mafia" student, however, he was not sure. Erlend said although he was not sure about how Eric Harris dressed, he believes that Eric used to wear a green baseball type cap and said that he does not remember if Eric Harris wore a trench coat or not. Erlend said during his conversations with Eric Harris, or during conversations others had with Eric Harris, he may overheard a portion of, but he did not hear any talk of guns and/or bombs. Erlend did say that Eric Harris would talk quite a bit about a movie called "Blade." Erlend said he believes this movie may have been about firearms.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

It should be noted that Erlend Nilsen is residing in Colorado only temporarily and attended Columbine High School while he and his family reside in the United States. Erlend is from Norway and advised me that his family is leaving on approximately June 26, 1999 and moving back to Norway. It was difficult to interview Erlend Nilsen due to the language barrier.

**DISPOSITION:** Case remains open, pending further investigation.

Kyle Nitta advised me on 4-20-99, at approximately 0820 hours, he arrived at Columbine High School, 6201 South Pierce Street. Kyle said that he had a science/biology class that begins at 0825 and gets out at 0915. Kyle said after this class he went to his computer creativity class, which begins at 0920 hours, and Kyle said that he had to walk through the cafeteria to get to this class due to the fact it is on lower level of the school. I showed Kyle the photographs of the duffle bag and the propane tank that were later recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria. Kyle said that he did not see these items in the cafeteria, nor did he see anyone carrying them at Columbine High School. I also asked Kyle if he saw any "Trench Coat Mafia" students in the cafeteria when he was going through it on 4-20-99, and he said no he did not see any. Kyle stated he got out of this computer creativity class approximately 1005 hours, and then went to his American Literature class that began at approximately 1015, and got out at approximately 1110 hours. Kyle said he then went to his locker (#1558) which is on the upper level, and then walked towards the main office doors on the east side of Columbine High School. Kyle said that he met with a friend by the name of Mike Kenny near the main office doors, and after talking to him for a few seconds, went out of the school, got on his bicycle, and began riding home for his lunch hour. Kyle said that while he was riding towards home he heard one explosion, however, he said he could not tell where the explosion came from and said he did not think much about it and kept on riding towards his home.

Kyle Nitta said that on 4-20-99, after eating lunch, and at approximately 1130 hours, he tried to return to Columbine High School for his afternoon classes, however, he was unable to do so due to the police presence in the area of the school. Kyle said that he went into Leawood Park, which is just east of Columbine High School across South Pierce Street, and talked to friends for approximately 20 minutes. Kyle said that from Leawood Park he could hear gunshots and could tell they were somewhere in the area of Columbine High School, however, he was unable to say exactly where. Kyle said while he was in Leawood Park, however, he did not hear any gunshots that he believed were directed towards the students in the park. I asked Kyle if while he was in Leawood Park if he looked toward Columbine High School to determine if he may have possibly seen any of the suspects, however, he said he could not see the school from where he was at due to the trees in front of it and therefore did not see anyone he would consider a suspect at the school.

Kyle Nitta told me that he knew three of the victims from the shooting on 4-20-99. Kyle said he knew Isaiah Shoels, Dan Mauser, and John Tomlin. I asked Kyle if he ever saw anyone racially intimidate or harass Isaiah Shoels, and he said no he had never seen anyone intimidate him or harass him about his race. Kyle said that Isaiah was very well liked by all the students and he

didn't believe any of the students would have done that to Isaiah Shoals, as is being currently reported through the media.

I asked Kyle Nitta what he knew about the "Trench Coat Mafia" students, and he advised me the only thing he knew about them was that they were very good using computers, and said that they were quiet. Kyle said that he had seen some of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students in the hallways at Columbine High School, however, he did not know any of their names and only knew that they dressed in dark clothing, saying that their choice of color was either black or gray. Kyle said at times the "Trench Coat Mafia" students would wear trench coats, however, he said they did not wear them all the time. Kyle told me that he did not recall seeing any female students wearing trench coats, nor did he see any female students associate with the "Trench Coat Mafia" students. Kyle told me that he did not see any of the "jocks" harass the "Trench Coat Mafia" students, nor did he see any of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students harass other students, other than one "Trench Coat Mafia" student by the name of Chris Kennedy, who Kyle says has harassed him personally in the past.

Kyle Nitta told me that he does not know of any other students, nor has he heard any rumors of anyone who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms. Kyle also advised me that he does not know what the "thought of the day" was over the Rebel News Network (RNN) for Columbine High School on 4-20-99

I asked Kyle Nitta how he has been doing since the incident on 4-20-99, and he told me that he has been doing fine and has not had any problems. His mother, Kathy Nitta, however, said that she has had problems off and on since the day of the shooting, however, up to this point has not seen any counselors and/or therapists. I gave both Kathy and Kyle Nitta my business card and asked them to contact me in the future if they want to speak with a JCSO Victim Advocate. I advised that I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

that he recalled seeing Brooks Brown due to the fact that he said Brooks Brown had recently been in a "Frankenstein" play and therefore when they saw Brooks walking southbound on Pierce they said to each other, "There goes Frankenstein." Justin advised that at approximately 11 45 to 11 50 a.m., upon attempting to return to Columbine High School for classes, he was stopped at Walker and Pierce due to the police presence in the area of Columbine High School.

Justin advised that he did not see anything out of the ordinary and did not see any suspicious subjects or items at Columbine High School on 4-20-99 I asked Justin if he knew of any other suspects who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms, and he said no. Justin said he has not heard any rumors of that taking place either

I asked Justin Obermeyer what he knew about the "Trench Coat Mafia" and specifically Dylan Klebold and/or Eric Harris. Justin said that in 1997 he believes, although he is not positive, that he had a drivers education class with Dylan Klebold Justin said he did not recall anything about Dylan Klebold, nor could he recall if Dylan wore a trench coat in 1997 during this class. I asked Justin if he ever witnessed the "Trench Coat Mafia" students being harassed by other students, and he said no he had not. He also said that he had not seen the "Trench Coat Mafia" students harass other students.

Justin advised me that on the Friday prior to the shooting, which would have been April 16, 1999, he was in a bathroom when he saw a mentally handicap student that he only knows as "Nathan" in the bathroom. Justin said he asked "Nathan" how he was doing, and "Nathan" replied that there was a bomb in the stall that he was in and it was going to blow up. Justin said that "Nathan" sounded excited about this Justin also said that "Nathan" will say things that are obviously not true and said he believes that "Nathan" says these things due to the fact that he is handicapped. Justin says he does not believe that these statements made by "Nathan" are related or relative to the incident on 4-20-99, however, he wanted to bring it to my attention so it could be documented Justin said that he does not know what "Nathan's" last name is.

Adam Oliver advised after getting out of class at 1110 hours, he walked out of the school through the main entrance near the administration office on the east side of the school. Adam Oliver said Lutes picked him up in her vehicle and they left to go to Dairy Queen for lunch. Adam Oliver said when they tried to return to school, they were unable to get in due to the police presence in the area of the school.

I asked Adam Oliver if he was familiar with the Trench Coat Mafia, and he advised he has seen them in the school hallways at Columbine High School; however, he did not have much information about the Trench Coat Mafia students. Adam Oliver said prior to the incident on 04-20-99, he did not know Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris, nor did he know their names.

Adam Oliver told me in the Spring of 1998, he had a history class with Mr. Dijozio, and in this class were two males dressed in trench coats and black clothing; however, he did not know their names. Adam Oliver said there was a female that he would consider an associate of the Trench Coat Mafia in this class whose name is Nicole Markham. I asked Adam Oliver what made him feel that Markham was an associate of the Trench Coat Mafia, and he said because it was his understanding that Markham was Chris Morris' girlfriend at the time. I asked Adam Oliver about Markham's type of clothing worn, and he said, "She dressed normal." I asked Adam Oliver if he recalled anything unusual about Markham in this history class, and he said no, he could not think of anything.

I asked Adam Oliver if he knew of anyone who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms, and he said no. Adam Oliver said he had not heard rumors of anybody doing these things either. Adam Oliver said he does not know of anybody who has a double pierced eyebrow. I asked Adam Oliver if he knew what the "thought of the day" was over the Rebel News Network (RNN) on 04-20-99, and he said no, he did not know what the "thought of the day" was.

I asked Adam Oliver how he has been doing coping with the incident since 04-20-99, and he said he has been doing well with no problems. I gave him my name and phone number and advised him to contact me if he should think of further information or if he wishes to talk with a JCSO Victim Advocate in the future. I told him I would make the necessary arrangements for him at that time.

is #847, and is located directly across from the Columbine High School library. I asked Kerry if she saw any suspicious persons or items at or around the Columbine High School library and she said no, she had not. Kerry said she proceeded to walk down the stairway to the lower level of Columbine High School and walked along the east side of the cafeteria and then went down the hall to her Spanish class. She said the Spanish class begins at about 0730. I asked Kerry if while she was walking along the side of the cafeteria if she had seen any duffle bags and/or propane tanks and she said no. She also advised she did not see any suspicious looking people or activity as she walked by. Kerry said that she was in her Spanish class until approximately 0825 hours and said when she exited her Spanish class she walked past the cafeteria along the east side again and went upstairs to the second level of the high school and into the math hallway where she had her math class from approximately 0830 until 0925. She said that when her math class was complete, she then went to her science class which lasted from approximately 0930 to 1025 hours. Kerry said that she had the fourth hour off so she went to Taco Bell with Mike Biggs and Monica Donovan. She said that Mike drove them to Taco Bell for their lunch hour and said they left for Taco Bell on 04-20-99 at about 1030 hours. Kerry said that although she was not sure of the times, she believed that they returned to Columbine High School at approximately 1145 hours and as they were pulling into the faculty parking lot, they saw numerous students running out of the school and away from Columbine High School. Kerry said they asked one unknown student what was going on and this student advised that there had been a shooting inside of Columbine High School, so Mike Biggs, Kerry O'Meara and Monica Donovan drove away from Columbine High School and went to Monica's house, which she said is in the area of Ken Caryl and Pierce. Kerry said she contacted her parents from Monica's house by telephone.

I asked Kerry O'Meara what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia and she said she knew very little about them, however, she said everybody knows who they are. Kerry said she has seen whom she believes to be Trench Coat Mafia students around the hallways of Columbine High School and by the stairway in the cafeteria. Kerry said that she estimates when she sees them in the cafeteria area that there are usually approximately five Trench Coat Mafia students in a group standing alone and to themselves. Kerry said that prior to the incident on 04-20-99, she did not know who Eric Harris was. Kerry also said she did not know the name of Dylan Klebold, however, when she saw his picture through the media, she recognized his face. She could provide no further information about the Trench Coat Mafia or the Trench Coat Mafia students.

Kerry O'Meara advised me that she has been having some problems dealing with the incident at Columbine High School since 04-20-99, however, up to this point in time, she has not seen any counselors or therapists. Kerry said that she has been thinking about seeing a counselor or a therapist, so I gave her my name and phone number and advised her if she wanted to talk with a J.C.S.O. Victim Advocate in the future to contact me and I would make the necessary arrangements for her or her family.

Jennifer Ellen Paavilainen, DOB 08/23/1983, 5445 West Caryl Place, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)932-0045, a sophomore at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her mother, Kathy Paavilainen, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Paavilainen provided the following information:

Paavilainen was not in the cafeteria during lunch. She and some friends went to a nearby McDonalds for lunch. Paavilainen left the school from an exit in the math department at approximately 11:15 am. Paavilainen did not see anything unusual as she left.

Paavilainen was in the cafeteria third period from approximately 9:15 am to 10:10 am. She was sitting at table T on the diagram sketch. Her brother Mike Paavilainen was also in the cafeteria third period and was sitting at table E. Paavilainen's sister, Renee Paavilainen, was there for a few minutes during third period as well. Paavilainen does not remember seeing any large duffle bags in the cafeteria during third period.

Paavilainen did know Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold a little. Paavilainen does not recall seeing either Harris or Klebold on the day of the shooting or the day before.

In January 1999, Paavilainen and her friend, Amanda Semm, were involved in a minor car accident with Klebold and Harris. Semm clipped Klebold's BMW on the left rear fender while in the school parking lot. Klebold got out and said not to worry because the car had been hit before. There was no damage to her friend's car. Harris then got out of the passenger side of Klebold's car and was angry. Klebold ordered Harris to get back in the car, which he did. Klebold then got back in the car and drove off.





On 05-17-99, at 1100, contact was made with Emily Paletta, a Junior at CHS, who confirms being present at CHS on 04-20-99 and being assigned to "A" lunch. She noted not present during lunch, as she had left the school grounds. She explained she has a free 4<sup>th</sup> hour, and because of this, often times leaves campus for lunch. She identified other students being with her as Ryan Vandamme, Chad Lening and Zachary Ingels.

Prior to her leaving school grounds, she had arrived in the cafeteria at 1100, and had remained in the hallway, near the commons area visiting with friends. She identified other students present at this time, as Pat Ireland, who following her leaving had gone upstairs to the library; Elizabeth Klepper, who had left for a 5<sup>th</sup> hour class, Lindsay Ludwig and Christine Mohrbacher, both of whom remained in the cafeteria for their assigned "A" lunch, and Tim Madison and Kyle Mickelson, both of whom remained in the commons area, but Paletta was unsure of their final destination.

Paletta reports observing no suspicious activity in the cafeteria or hallway prior to her walking to the south parking lot and leaving the school grounds at 1115.

She and her 3 companions had returned to the school within 20 minutes, and found Pierce Street closed, and smelled smoke. They were denied access to the school, and were informed of what that happened. She and her friends picked up a number of freshmen students who were in the area of Leawod Park, and together drove to another students home, where they contacted parents.

She acknowledged knowing some of the "TCM" members by face, and identified Alex Marsh as being in one of her classes. She reports that 2-3 months ago, Marsh had related to her that she no longer was a TCM, because Harris and Klebold were doing some "weird things". She had not elaborated.

On another occasion she had been advised by one of her friends, Jennifer Davis, that while she and Marsh were in 7<sup>th</sup> hour together, Marsh had defended the actions of both Harris and Klebold and noted that she could have easily been involved, if she hadn't terminated her relationship with them.

Paletta talked of another occasion, when prior to the 04-17-99 Junior/Senior Prom, person(s) unknown had defaced a number of posters. The posters had noted the date of the prom and said, "It's Coming". The posters had been altered with the 17 crossed out and a 20 put in it's place. No one was seen making these changes.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 06-15-99, I contacted Justin Pastine by telephone in reference to interviewing him about the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Justin Pastine is a student at Columbine High School.

Justin Pastine told me that on 04-20-99, at approximately 1110, he got out of his math class at Columbine High School. Justin Pastine said his teacher for this class was Ms. Layman. Justin Pastine said after leaving the classroom, he walked to his school locker which is #861. Justin Pastine said this locker is on the second level at Columbine High School and right across from the high school library. Justin Pastine said after he was done in his locker, he exited the school on the second level on the west side of the building by the gymnasium. I asked Justin Pastine if he saw any suspicious people or suspicious objects while he was at his locker across from the library and he said no. Justin Pastine advised me that once he exited the school, he rode his bicycle home to 6351 South Yarrow Street and said he followed the bicycle path through Clement Park to his residence. I asked Justin Pastine what he knew about the Trench Coat Mafia and in particular, Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Justin Pastine said that prior to the incident, he had never heard of Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris, and also said that he had never heard of the Trench Coat Mafia prior to this incident. Justin Pastine advised he was not able to provide any further information about any of the suspects in this case or the Trench Coat Mafia students.

I gave Justin Pastine my phone number and asked him to call me if he should think of any information that may be pertinent to this case.

The reason for contacting Leigh Patterson was to interview her in reference to the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Leigh Patterson told me on 04-20-99 at about 0730 hours, she arrived at Columbine High School for her scheduled classes. Leigh said her school classes began at 0740 hours

and said this was a Math and Science class that lasts for two class hours from 0740 to about 0920 hours. She said this class was on the upper level of Columbine High School. Leigh said when the class was over, she went to her third hour class, which is a Government Economics class and is scheduled from 0920 to 1020. She said this is also on the upper level of Columbine High School. Leigh said when the Government Economics class ended, she went to her fourth hour class, which is Language Arts, and she said this is scheduled from 1020 to 1110 hours. Leigh said this class is on the upper level of Columbine High School and said it is on the east side of the school, in the vicinity of the Administrative Offices and the band room. Leigh said on 04-20-99 while she was walking from class to class, she did not see anybody or anything unusual. Leigh said on 04-20-99 at about 1110 hours, when she got out of her Language Arts class. She said she talked to some of her friends inside of the school, and then walked down the stairway from the upper level of Columbine High School to the lower level. These stairs lead into the cafeteria/commons area. Leigh said when she got to the bottom of the stairway, she proceeded to exit the school, by walking through the commons area, and out of the doors located to the south of the "Rebel Corner." I asked Leigh if she saw a duffle bag or propane tank, such as those recovered in the Columbine High School cafeteria, however she said no. I asked Leigh if she remembered seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the cafeteria and/or commons area as she walked past this area and she said she did not remember seeing any of them. Leigh said after she exited Columbine High School, she walked to her vehicle (a silver Ford Taurus) which was parked in the Senior Parking Lot south of the cafeteria. Leigh said while she was walking to her car, she did not see anything out of the ordinary nor did she remember seeing any of the Trench Coat Mafia students in the parking lot. Leigh said her friend by the name of Megan Sasano went with her to her residence at 6155 W. Fairview Avenue Leigh said while exiting the parking lot and driving toward her residence, she did not see anything or anybody out of the ordinary Leigh said when she arrived at her residence for lunch on 04-20-99, it was about 1130 hours. She said at her residence she met with her friends there. These friends were Noel Porter, and Alisa Jensen. Leigh said they all stayed at her residence until approximately 1150 hours on 04-20-99, and then Megan Sasano, Noel Porter and Alisa Jensen left her residence to go back to Columbine High School, however, Leigh said she did not want to go back, so she stayed home.

I asked Leigh Patterson what she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia and/or Trench Coat Mafia students Leigh said she knew who the Trench Coat Mafia students were by their style of dress. She said they would gather in the parking lots of Columbine High School and smoke. She also said she has seen them underneath the stairway in the cafeteria/commons area, and sometimes they would be at a cafeteria table on the west side near the cafeteria windows. Leigh said she had a male student in her

Government class that associated with the Trench Coat Mafia students, however, she did not know who he was. Leigh said this male student was absent from this class on 04-20-99. Leigh said she knew who Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris were, but she could not provide any further information about them. She said she knew who the following Trench Coat Mafia students were: Brian Sargent, Robert Perry, a female with the last name of Colby, and Brooks Brown. She said about one year prior to the shootings on 04-20-99, Brian Sargent got into a physical fight with Isaiah Shoels, however, she did not know what the fight was about. Leigh said Brian Sargent finished the 1999 school year out at Chatfield High School with the other students. Leigh said that Robert Perry was "a pretty weird guy" and said Perry painted his fingernails black and she believed he wore sunglasses most of the time. Leigh said that he would wear all black clothing as well. She said she had Robert Perry in her American History class during the spring of 1998. Leigh said that the "jocks" in this class would harass and pick on Robert Perry and call him "a fag" which would make Robert Perry angry toward them and she said Perry would retaliate by talking back to them. Leigh Patterson said Brooks Brown associated with the Trench Coat Mafia students, however, she said he did not wear a trench coat. Leigh Patterson said she believes, as does the vast majority of Columbine High School students that she has talked to, that [REDACTED] was probably involved in some way in the shooting on 04-20-99 at Columbine High School. Leigh said she had no evidence of this however, and said "It is my opinion that he was involved." Leigh said she believes that [REDACTED] was not telling the truth." referring to the shooting and his denial of being involved.

I asked Leigh Patterson about racial intimidation or harassment at Columbine High School and in particular toward Isaiah Shoels. Leigh said she did not see anyone racially intimidate or harass Isaiah Shoels and said, in fact, everybody seemed to like Isaiah Shoels.

Leigh Patterson said other than what she told me about [REDACTED] she has not heard about anybody nor she has heard rumors of anybody else being involved either prior to, during, or after the shooting on 04-20-99. She also told me she does not know anybody who may be manufacturing explosive devices and/or possessing or selling firearms. Leigh said she does not know of anybody with a double pierce eyebrow, nor did she know what the "Thought of the Day" was on 04-20-99 on the Rebel News Network (RNN).

Brad came through the room we were sitting in and I asked him if he had a few minutes. Brad stated that he was late for work to his new job. I asked him to call me after work. I also asked Brad if he was at school that day and he said that he had Math class and left the school and didn't see anything. I spoke to Brad for approx. 30 seconds.

After the interview with Heather Pearce, I asked her to remind her brother to call me. She said that she didn't think he saw anything, but he had Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold in some classes.

On 05-27-99, I called the Pearce residence and spoke to Bernadine Pearce, Brad's mother. She said that she would have Brad call me after he got home from work. I did not receive a phone call.

This student is uncooperative.
